EMOA Committee Meeting Report - June 20th 2005

English Orienteering Council - The chair of the EOC is standing down and a volunteer is required to take up this post.

Purchase of SI Equipment - The Treasurer proposed purchasing additional SI equipment for the region, in effect creating a second set for the region. This will make it easier to get hold of equipment for events. The committee agreed that the purchase of this equipment should go ahead making a number of minor amendments to the proposal. It is proposed to purchase 2 new master stations, 2x8 start /finish /check /clear stations, additional stations to allow 2 x 70 per club event (as DVO agreed to pool their existing stock this would be approximately 30 new stations). It was agreed that based on current performance these should be written off over 6 years (not 5 years as previously). Additional income to support this purchase will be raised through increasing event and SI levies, not by increasing membership fees.

Treasurer's Report and Budget Proposals - The treasurer stated that the proposed budget for last year was predominantly in line with performance. EMEWS costs had been reduced as it had been put out in line with EMOA committee meetings and resulted in 5 editions rather than 6. There had also been slightly more income from the major event surplus (JK) than anticipated. Membership was slightly down on the previous year. However, with the additional costs of the SI equipment it is proposed to increase the event levy for regional and district events by 10p for seniors and 5p for juniors, with no change to local events (no levy). Also the SI levy should be increased by 10p per competitor and the use of SI equipment at C5 events should incur a charge of 20 per competitor (senior or junior). This will be presented to the AGM.

Request for Support - Peter Hodkinson has requested a contribution to costs for attending Lagganlia. This was agreed on condition he writes a report for EMEWS on his return.

AGM - The date and time of the AGM was agreed (see separate items). It was agreed to again hold a free score event before the meeting at 7pm approx and have a free buffet available for attendees.

New Treasurer Required - A new treasurer is required at the AGM. Please consider volunteering as we need someone in this role. Contact a member of the EMOA Committee if interested.

Fixtures - The DVO National Event in December 2007 is now planned to be at Longshaw and not Eyam.

The Yvette Trophy regional round for 2005 is planned to be at Stanton Moor on Nov 6^{th} . LOG agreed to host the CompassSport Cup 1^{st} round in 2007 at Stapleford Woods.

The East Midlands Champs for 2006 will be held at Stapleford Woods on March 5^{th.}

Presentations for Lloyd Davis League will be held at Clumber Park event on Jan 22nd.

BOF Council - The meeting was acrimonious as the BOF Councillors were seeking to redefine their role. Eventually agreement on current status prevailed.

New simpler proposals for the membership structure are being proposed for presentation to the EGM on September 24^{th} . See BOF Focus for details.

All anti-doping tests have proved negative.

Coaching - The 2006 Coaching Conference is to be held at Lilleshall 13-15th January. If you are interested in coaching you should consider attending. Clubs are encouraged to support the conference and provide funding for their coaches (or potential coaches) to attend.

Pauline Olivant is developing for BOF a Young Leaders Award which has been piloted and is available for all youth groups (schools, youth organisations, outdoor centres, Duke of Edinburgh Awards, etc). It needs a level 1 coaching qualification to lead the course.

The START programme is being reviewed. From 2006 the squad will be selected after the summer tours to take into account selection races and tour reports.

Elite - Consideration is being given to how many course should count in UK Cup when a course is voided.

Junior - It has been agreed that the mini-JK relay should continue to begin as first event (concerns had been expressed at having only the very young out in forest, but felt the benefits gained for them outweighed this and would recommend a number of additional marshals in forest at this time).

There are new Yvette Baker Trophy rules which have been sent to the clubs.

National Forest - Roy Denney is working with the National Forest to hold an event to commemorate the 10th anniversary of the National Forest. It is planned for March 2007, possibly at Ratby/Martinshaw at this stage.

Training for OCAD - Roger Edwards suggested a need for a training session for mappers in the use of OCAD. It is thought there are already plans by the mapping Group to host one close to our area. This will be followed up. It was also suggested that a follow up course for planners in the use of OCAD might also be useful.

BOC 2009 - LEI proposed the use of 2 LEI areas for BOC 2009 (Belvoir for individual and Grace Dieu for relays). It was asked that the other clubs should consider this proposal. We would also need a grade 1 controller to consider suitability of the areas.

JK 2007 - The organisation of JK2007 is still very much up in the air. SEOA have offered to provide some manpower for a day (event would be in Wales) if others provided major officials and additional manpower. The committee discussed whether EMOA could also assist, but the predominant view was that if we were hosting BOC 2009 then also asking members to get heavily involved in this JK would stretch our resources. Clubs and individuals are welcome to comment on this.

Next Committee meeting - the next EMOA committee meeting will be held on September 26^{th} after the AGM with new committee in place. EMEWS will be published after this meeting.

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BOF Rules Group Report - June Meeting in Birmingham

Four page (folded A4) Digest of BOF Rules to be distributed with August edition of BOF 'Focus'.

Problems related to mapping, planning and controlling at recent National Event and Scottish Champs at Tentsmuir. Discussion centred on the role of Planner and Controller and method of ensuring 'quality assurance' for events of Level 2 status in future. Agreed need that any problems related to access and/or permissions should be resolved at least 12 months before event and reported on to Major Events Co-ordinator, together with the resolution of any problems with mapping and subsequent updating.

'The Top Ten Problems' list to be compiled for the next 'Event Officials Newsletter' page in the August edition of BOF 'Focus' to highlight specific issues especially for Planners and Controllers. Suggestion also made that the Development Conference in September 2005 pre-EGM has 'Event Quality' as a discussion/workshop topic.

Need for more Controllers throughout BOF. After long discussion agreed need for work at 'grassroots' for Grade 3 with Clubs identifying and putting forward suitably experienced Club members for Grade 3 training with BOF Event Operations and/or Rules Group establishing a system for 'overviewing' and promotion of Grade 2 Controllers to Grade 1. Future Grade 2 Controllers will need to be identified and trained at a Regional level from established and competent Grade 3s, possibly with inter-Regional courses together with better publicity on BOF website and in BOF 'Focus' of available courses for both Grade 3 and Grade 2

A brief discussion took place on the removal of competitor's times over a leg or legs due to a misplaced control or inaccurate mapping at or near a control at Major Events.

Agreed to let current Rules stand unchanged.

A letter was received re map overprinting and the breaking of circles and lines in order not to obscure significant detail close to the control with particular regard to the recent 2005 SINS Event and Junior competitors in particular. It was agreed that all Planners and Controllers should be made aware of this problem and use OCAD accordingly (see also later item on use of OCAD 8 for planning).

There is a groundswell of support for some form of amalgamation of the Badge and Ranking Schemes especially as Chris Boycott the Badge Scheme Secretary has produced statistics showing that a falling number of 'over 21s' other than newcomers/novices are claiming Badges and that they appear to be more interested in the Ranking Lists

Three documents were available for any Club orienteer wishing to use currently available version of OCAD 8 for planning, overprinting and production of control description sheets - the 'Introduction to Course Setting using OCAD 8' by Teresa Winn and Jim Baker, the CLOK 'Using OCAD 8 for Course Planning' by Alastair Mackenzie and the 'Guide to using OCAD 8 for Course Planning and pre-marked maps' by Roger Edwards of LEI/EMOA. As present at the meeting Alastair Mackenzie agreed to produce before the next meeting of Rules Group in late October a draft document that contained basic information usable by a beginner planner using OCAD 8 that would incorporate the 'best practice' and advice currently available on the topic.

The newly revised Risk Assessment Form is now available from BOF National Office and is being distributed. Hoping to see available on the BOF website in a format that will allow completion of the 'blanks' by an individual Organiser.

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Quality Control of Events

I'm writing as invited in Mar/Apr 05 EMEWS to offer views on the proposal to have a system whereby individuals can provide feedback. My view are written largely from the perspective of being planner as this is the role I have usually undertaken.

- 1) Anything which encourages giving feedback is good. It isn't currently easy to get feedback as planner, especially from the full range of competitors including juniors. We ask some finishers, but usually only those we know. I for one would be delighted to receive more feedback in the hope that I could avoid any repeating the same pitfalls when I'm next planner. And who knows, I might even get some favourable comments (probably wishful thinking!).
- 2) I think most planners are realistic enough to realise that they don't always get it just right, especially for classes significantly different from their own. Thus I don't think it would inhibit people from volunteering.
- 3) Although I'd encourage the feedback, I don't think it would do a lot to ensure the ongoing quality of events in general. But if it helps avoid just one or two problems it would be worth it. After all one significant problem often detracts from the enjoyment of 50+ competitors.
- 4) In the modern world it is unrealistic to only have the recipient see the comments any replies would doubtless be discussed openly anyway. Thus I think it is best if the comments are completely open, thus encouraging further feedback and also perhaps keeping the tone of the comments slightly more constructive. Any official's replies should also be open it is important that the officials do reply wherever possible as there are often factors of which the competitors may be unaware, eg access restrictions or concerns re security of controls.

3. Chairman's Report

This year's report will be brief as I have been acting Chairman only. I have enjoyed doing it but I have merely kept EMOA ticking over forever hoping that a full chairman would appear. Even so quite a lot has happened and I have only managed to cope thanks to the excellent help from all the Office holders and Committee members of EMOA Executive Committee.

We have had a full year of generally excellent orienteering. The East Midlands events have been invariably well organised and usually well attended. To produce good events calls for much effort by a large number of volunteers, and we have been lucky to find that in the East Midlands at least volunteers are still prepared to give their time. The biggest volunteer requirement of course was for Day 2 of JK which we ran in the Lake District. Apart from all the work that had to be done for such a large International event, the problems of doing it over 100 miles away made it an order of magnitude more tiring and time consuming. All the more thanks, therefore, to Chris Philips, Roy Denney and Ernie Williams and their teams. Thank you very much – it was a most successful day.

Once again I would like to congratulate all the competition winners this year, whether Midlands champion, East Midlands champion, Galoppen class winner, string course winner or whatever. All have competed to their best efforts and achieved their goal – well done.

This is probably also a good time to congratulate three international representatives from EMOA. Helen Palmer won a silver medal in the relay in the World University Championships, Alison O'Neil won an individual bronze medal in the Junior World Championships and is representing GB this month in the World (Senior) Championships, while David Hodkinson also represented GB in JWOC.

While on the topic of competitions most of you are aware that your Executive Committee have decided to alter the Galoppen timings to bring them in line with the calendar year, and also BOF age year, by running it from January to December each year. For this year only the competition will extend over 15 months, September 2004 to December 2005, while we get into the new timetable. Again I would like to thank the Williamson family for the efficient and diligent way they have run the Galoppen again this past year. The prize giving was an incredibly well organised event – what a pity more of the prizewinners were not able to attend.

This year we shall see a much changed Executive Committee. First Roy Denney stands down after a very full stint with three years as Vice Chairman followed by three years as Chairman with one year as ex Chairman. Seven years on the Executive Committee is quite a sentence – well done Roy and thank you very much. Despite Roy's departure I believe the Committee will be strengthened as I am delighted to say that a volunteer has come forward for the post of Chairman and also one for Vice-Chairman –

wonderful! They will start off with a truly excellent secretary (accurate minutes produced within hours of the meeting!) – thank you Bob Alderson, and an accurate and meticulous Treasurer – thank you Roger Edwards.

I stand down as acting Chairman in the knowledge that, unlike last year, we should have all principal officer posts filled for the coming year.

A vote of thanks for John Woodall for standing in as Acting Chairman for the past year was proposed by Hilary Palmer and seconded by Ernie Williams and agreed by all.

4. Secretary's report

EMOA had 389 members (a slight decrease in senior and family members). We have a total of 40 controllers at the various Grades. 6 personal skills courses and 3 coach education courses were held. One Regional conference for controllers, planners and organisers.

5. Treasurer's report.

Treasurer reported that the accounts show a surplus of income over expenditure of £59. Membership income is lower. SI income was higher than expected. No JK profit share had been received but part of the estimated income had been included in the accounts and some more was in the 2004/05 budget. The Junior squad subsidy was similar to previous years and we were again fortunate to have a grant of nearly £500 from Nottinghamshire Country Council. SI equipment repairs were high and included a bill from work done in summer 2003.

Hilary Palmer raised need for BOF Correspondent Reps. On agenda for next committee meeting Ernie Williams raised the possibility of Life Vice Presidents being elected at the AGM according to the constitution.

9. Appointment of Independent Financial Examiner.

David Walker was proposed by Roger Edwards and seconded by John Woodall, was duly appointed.

10 Budget projections and Fixing of charges

The Treasurer proposed a budget deficit of nearly £1,000. This sum is allocated to regional development funds as in previous years, but it was likely that such money would again not be paid out. The Association now has enough in the bank to buy a completely new set of electronic equipment plus a working reserve. Therefore no further contribution to the SI fund was included. Members suggested that the new money from the JK should be allocated to the SI fund.

The Treasurer put forward his recommended charges for 2004/05. All charges and levies would be unchanged except for the hire of SI equipment for C5 events. After discussion it was agreed there would be no charge for C5 events hire. However members requested that C5 event hire should not compromise the use of equipment at C4 or C3 events.

Out and About - Rushcliffe Country Park

NOC have one of their Summer League events on Rushcliffe Country Park so I thought I'd do a little digging around for information about the area.

Rushcliffe Country Park is built on the site of a former Ministry of Defence Depot which was used for storing decommissioned weapons. The design and reclamation of the present site was completed by Nottinghamshire County Council in 1993, since when the park has been managed by Rushcliffe Borough Council.

The park is set within 85 hectares of wildflower meadows, grassland, conservation and landscaped areas. One third of the country park has been planted with over 80% of native broad leaf trees, such as oaks, alders, field maple, birch and wild cherry. These young trees will become the woodlands of the future. The 2 hectare lake and reed bed provides an invaluable habitat for a diversity of aquatic species and an excellent site for watching wildfowl such as the resident mute swans, great crested grebes and various duck species. Other birds regularly seen in the park include skylarks, meadow pipits, finches, cuckoos, kestrels, sparrow hawks, reed buntings, reed warblers and sedge warblers to name but a few. The best time to see mammals is either at dawn or at dusk. There are plenty of foxes, stoats, rabbits, hares, voles, hedgehogs, mice and shrews and various species of bats.

The Country Park is home to the Rushcliffe Barn Owls Project. The aims of the project are to reverse the decline of barn owls by providing nesting sites, and to create and manage the correct hunting habitats, these being young plantations, hedgerows and grassland areas suited to small mammals. There are seven nest boxes, each of which is on top of a telegraph pole, strategically placed around the park to attract barn owls. This initiative has encouraged farmers, landowners, and many local businesses within Rushcliffe to become members of the project and has begun the Rushcliffe Barn Owl Conservation Network.

Within the Country Park there is the Nottingham Transport Heritage Centre, with its growing fleet of vintage railway engines and rolling stock, a bus museum and a miniature steam railway. Facilities include a restaurant, souvenir shop and kiosk. Admission includes a two mile round trip on a steam train and vintage coach ride.

Nearby is the Ruddington Village Museum, occupying part of a Victorian school, this museum depicts the community life of Ruddington and consists of several reconstructed shops including an Edwardian fish and chip shop, a pharmacy, a cobblers, a school room and a toy shop. Admission charge payable.

Also nearby is the Ruddington Framework Knitters Museum, a unique complex of restored 19th century workshops, cottages and gardens. Experience the sounds of working machinery and gain a fascinating insight into the life and labour of a 19th century framework knitting community.

BOF Level 3 and 4 Courses 16th – 18th September 2005 Hawkshead Youth Hostel, Ambleside, Cumbria

There will be both a Level 3 Course and Level 4 Course based at the Hawkshead Youth Hostel over the weekend of $16^{th} - 18^{th}$ September 2005. Following the format of the previous years' courses, we have co-ordinated another two such courses to enable travel to be combined and an opportunity for coaches and aspirant coaches from different regions to train together. The limited social time will also be enhanced by this combination.

The weekend will comprise practical and theory sessions. Assembly will be after dinner on the Friday evening, the course will run from 09.00 - 21.00 Saturday and 09.00 - 15.00 Sunday. There will be no assessment during the weekend although candidates will be given details of potential assessors. The course will not cover any of the First Aid requirements of the awards and a further two-day course covering those aspects will need to be attended prior to assessment.

The course is being heavily subsidised by the Federation's coaching budget. The all-inclusive fee of full board after Friday's evening meal to lunch on Sunday and all tutoring/materials costs etc., is £50. Travel expenses are not however available. Day visitors will be allowed subject to availability at a cost of £30. Clubs and Regional Associations usually pay the candidate's costs.

Numbers are limited and attendance will be strictly on a first come first served basis. The closing date for applications is the 1st September and final details will be sent out on September 9th.

Please return by September 1st 2005.
