Veteran Home International 2009 – According to the calendar East Midlands is scheduled to "host" the VHI in 2009.

BOC 2009 – The possibility of East Midlands hosting BOC 2009 is still under review. LEI have only just approached Peter Hubberstey about the potential of reviewing the areas.

Midland Night Champs 2006 – East Midlands should be hosting this event next year. Clubs should nominate an area for this as soon as possible.

East Midlands League – We are looking for sponsors for next years league. If anyone has any contacts who might be willing to sponsor the league then please get in touch with one of the committee. Thanks was given to Roger & Ursula Williamson for all their work in organising the League.

AGM Budget Proposals: Roger Edwards proposed the following changes for next year:

Subscriptions to stay the same as this year:

Seniors: £3Juniors: £1Family: £5Group: £10Club: £15

Interms of event levy from 1st January 2006 the event levy will be increased by 15% to:

Regional Senior - 85p Junior - 20p less first £25 of the sum due

C4 Senior -60p Junior -15p less first £25 of the sum due

C5 As C4 but only pay if levy is more than £ 10

Interms of SI levy this should be increased by 20% from 1st January 2006 to:

C4 and above Senior -60p Junior -20p

These proposals were agreed by the AGM.

BOF Council – The main it ems covered were that there is a new Vice-Chairman for BOF, Neil Cameron. Also the funding for the movement of premises for BOF has been agreed.

Rules Group – Clubs must be aware that for all levels of event registered with BOF and with Third Party I nsurance Cover all Organisers and Planners must be BOF members. Mention was made of Clubs who appoint a non-BOF member but use for Registration purposes a BOF member as Organiser/Planner at C5 level – Clubs must ensure that the BOF member is present at the event.

As the Harvester Trophy is in Scotland next year it has been agreed to amend start times because of "shortage of darkness" so that orienteers will run in dark rather than daylight. This change applies to 2006 only.

It was agreed that all events of level 3 and higher shall be expected to have some form of independent back-up at each control site and that the back-up must be seen to have been used otherwise the competitor will be disqualified. In the case of SI the most obvious back-up would be a pin punch attached to the stake. In EMOA all the aluminium stakes already have this and the new lighter stakes will be set up with pin punches when they arrive.

There was lengthy discussion on further proposed rule changes for the CompassSport Cup but as the agreement had been to use the new format for 3 years before changing it, no changes will be made to this years rules.

The Regional Event Experiment had been trialled by 3 regions (e.g. the DVO event at Longshaw). This had identified 3 issues:

- Need for publication of course lengths prior to entry in the preliminary details
- •Need for a course for small numbers (e.g. course 8 for "aged competitors")
- A Guideline to be produced for an event with shorter and less courses (e.g. a "Medium" course for all M50s rather than courses for M50L and M50S).

The badge scheme is currently under review by Alex Ross and Mike Napier.

3 Grade 1 controllers were approved.

There is encouragement for regions to put on Organiser, Planner and Controller courses using BOF materials. Alex Ross is to get the slides used on training courses scanned and added to a Course CD.

Junior Competitions – The Young Orient eers Festival for 2006 is to be held between the 2 races of the British Sprint Championships at Milton Keynes on 20th May 2006. The aim is to have town or district teams rather than orient eering clubs.

DVO Schools Development - All funding is now in place with the funding coming from Sport England, Derbyshire Sports and orient eering for a part time coach - see separate advert.

Rex Bleakman is continuing to work with secondary schools and feeder primary schools in developing maps for schools.

SI Equipment - It was agreed that East Midlands should purchase the DVO SI equipment so that we will end up with the potential to have 2 batches of SI equipment. We should have as a region 115 aluminium stakes, 46 glass fibre stakes, 126 large control boxes and 49 small control boxes as well as 3 sets of master stations.

Going forward the plan will be to create 2 batches of controls with a mixture of aluminium stakes and glass fibre stakes in each. The numbers on the aluminium stakes will be 101-148 in batch 1 and 149-198 in batch 2 (so they can be brought together for a district event). 72 dibbers will also be associated with each batch. These batches can then rotate around the region more easily but they will still need to be booked out via Derek Gale.

Next Committee meeting—the next EMOA committee meeting will be held on January 23rd 2006.

Out & About - Bradgate Park & Swithland Woods

Bradgate Country Park is Leicestershire's most popular country park with about 900,000 visitors each year although I am not sure how they manage to count us.

It is part of the ancient Charnwood Forest and is now on the eastern edge of the new National Forest. The Country Park is made up of Bradgate Park itself, an 830 acre mediaeval deer park of relatively unspoilt countryside with grassy covered slopes running of f one of the highest hills in Leicestershire with walled copses, areas of bracken and rocky outcrops, and the pretty valley of the River Linrunning into Cropston Reservoir. Apart from the creation of the reservoir it is probably little changed and largely unimproved over the centuries, with parts looking much as it would have done in the Middle Ages.

Famous

for the folly known as "Old John Tower" this building in the shape of a tankard can be seen for miles as can the Yeomanry War Memorial. Old John is the subject of much myth and legend and stands at 690 and was built in 1784.

No record exists of when it was enclosed, but it was certainly

Herds of red and fallow deer about 340 in number at the last count, wander at will within the park - one of the finest herds of parkland deer in the country. Deer

have been kept at Bradgate, in this fine example of ancient parkland, since the 13th century and to

protect them from stress they have areas of the park reserved to them where they can escape from human presence when the park gets to busy.

Bradgate Park contains nationally important geological exposures (some are over 700 million years old and rank as some of the oldest in

England). It also contains some of the last important fragments of wet and grass heathland in Leicestershire, wonderful veteran trees and other special habitats, with a diverse range of flora and fauna including rare plant species and is also a valued site for a wide range of birds, vertebrates and invertebrates.

The park includes the ruins of Bradgate House, one of the first unfortified brick built country houses in England, begun in about 1499 and completed over a considerable span of years. The mansion house continued to be occupied until the death of the Second Earl of Stamford in 1719.

There are historical connections with Lady Jane Grey (1537-1554), the nine days Queen of England. Lady Jane, elder daughter of Henry Grey (later Duke of Suffolk) and his wife Lady Frances Brandon, was born and spent her early childhood at Bradgate House. There are a range of other important historical connections including the Grey family, influential nobles in Mediaeval and Tudor England who married into the Royal family.

Also within the estate are Swithland Woods - some 146 acres of ancient woodland, again being a remnant of the original Charnwood Forest Oak Wood. Swithland Wood is one of the few woodland areas in Leicestershire of national nature importance (being on acid loamy soils) and a significantly important area of ancient woodland in the East Midlands. It contains some of the best remaining examples of oak, small leaved lime and alder woodland in the county and as such is an ecologically rich woodland habit at. It has a very important, rich and varied range of flora and fauna including a diverse butterfly, moth and bird population.

There are two water filled former Swithland Slate Quarries within Swithland Wood. One is some 58 metres (190 feet) deep and used for sub aqua diving.

Bradgate Park was privately owned until 1928, when it was purchased from the Grey family and generously donated in Trust by Mr Charles Bennion to be preserved in perpetuity in its natural state for the quiet enjoyment of the people of Leicestershire and visitors to the County. Subsequently, in 1931 Swithland Wood was gifted by the Leicester Rotary Club. Over the years, various other areas of conservation and amenity woodland and agricultural land on the edge of the Country Park, have been donated or purchased and the estate now extends to some 1261 acres (510 hectares)

Throughout the estate there are 350 veteran trees - some over 500 years old and growing at the time of Lady Jane Grey and many others over 300 years old. Throughout the seasons, it is possible to find up to 106 species of bird, 20 species of mammal, 4 species of amphibians, 8 species of fish, a host of plant species, trees and shrubs as well as lichens, fungi and a host of invertebrate species with many of the flora and fauna regarded as locally rare.

The estate comprises a total of 1261 acres of which 984 is an SSSI and as such we have to use it sensitively. We are only allowed into Bradgate during the summer months and parts of Swithland are off limits to us.

Within the estate there are 36 miles of paths tracks and roads etc, 40 miles of ditches, streams and river, 6 miles of hedges, 17 miles of stone walls and seven miles of other fencing. There are 9 lakes or ponds of one sort or another.

The JHI relay was held on Brought on Burrows, a much more complex sand dune area with a lot of intricate contour detail.

Scotland were the winners in the men's relay after a very speedy run from Duncan Coombs brought them from 3rd to a comfortable victory of just over 4 minutes. England were 2nd with Wales close behind.

The woman's relay had an exciting finish on the last leg with all four English teams and one welsh team all running together from the spectator control. The strength in depth of the English showed through with England claiming 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th. However, all 5 teams finished within 1 minute of each other.

Over all it was a very enjoyable weekend made all the better by good courses planned on interesting areas. The good course planning also made both the individual and the relay very spectator friendly for all the coaches and minibus drivers who gave up their weekend to drive us all there without even the chance of a run!

The overall result of the competition was;

1st England 129 points 2nd Scot land 96 points 3rd Wales 92 points 4th I reland 43 points

Wales were unlucky, finishing 2 points behind Scotland on both days.
