A happy new year to you all, and what an eventful one it has been so far orienteering wise. As I type this it is only January 23rd, and I've already orienteered 6 times, probably more than I managed in the latter half of 2005. These have all been incredibly varied events too, showing the different forms of orienteering in all their glory. A team score street-O (now there's a strange concept for you!) helped clear the haze on New Year's day, although pounding the streets of Lincoln gave me the worse dose of shin splints that I've had for years. The beautifully runnable Eccelshall Woods was the day after, and what a cracking little area that is.

The following weekend was another unique experience, helping to push cars onto the car park at Linacre. Thanks to Ernie Williams for stepping into the breach and starting the EM League prize giving while I was still messing around in the mud! Congratulations to all the prize winners, the experiment of presenting prizes at 10.30 rather than after the event seemed to work, with most recipients there in person. Thanks also to Lloyd Davis who sponsored the League last year, the vouchers were a nice touch.

The next weekend saw LOG's most complicated event come to fruition, the Lincolnshire Bomber Weekend was a great success, and despite a lot of heartache in the run-up it is highly likely that the concept will be repeated. This was a joint effort with RAFO and a huge amount of fun, with people travelling

hundreds of miles just to get to the planning meetings.

Yes it's a wonderful sport this orienteering malarkey, now it's back to course planning for the East Midland Champs in Stapleford, and a few more grey hairs!

EMOA Committee & AGM Meeting Report – January 23rd 2006

***** URGENT **** EMOA Treasurer** – East Midlands is in desperate need of a new treasurer. The job is no way near as onerous as a club treasurer as there are far fewer transactions to handle. The committee will also do all that it can to simplify any procedures to assist any new volunteer. Please step forward as we do need someone to perform this role.

Fixtures were discussed including:

BOC 2009 – EMOA is still considering the possibility of hosting BOC 2009. LEI are arranging for a Grade 1 controller in the region to assess the potential areas before the end of March.

BOC/ JK Rota – At present it was unclear whether EMOA should stay in the rota for the JK and BOC. The EMOA committee felt EMOA should stay in the rota for both events.

Midland Night Champs 2006 – Discussion took place on likely area and event and it was felt that the LEI event at Grace Dieu on November 12th could probably accommodate a Night Event on the evening before it, so that is the plan.

East Midlands League – We continue looking for sponsors for the 2006 league. If anyone has any contacts who might be willing to sponsor the league then please get in touch with one of the committee.

BOF Council – A Council meeting was held that covered a number of items:

The role of the President and Vice-President needs to be refined. Since the death of Chris Brasher there is a vacancy for a Vice-President and a potential person is to be approached. However, we need to ensure we understand what is expected of them going forward so they understand those expectations.

It was felt that the outgoing chief executive had bargained very well on behalf of orienteering and achieved a good funding from the various bodies. There are still gaps to be resolved but we are in a better position than we thought were going to be in. There is also a possibility that there may be some further funding from Sport England who have just “found” an additional £70million over 3 years to share across the sports they support.

The use for the World Championship monies from 1976 is still under discussion. A plan to purchase a wood in the Lakes and give it to the Woodland Trust has been put on hold as it was pointed out that the objectives of the Woodland trust vary greatly from ours and although the wood may exist with permission for us to have access, the quality of the terrain may not be appropriate.

The Communication Report should be available on the BOF web site shortly.

The Membership Working Group brought forward a 2-tier proposal such that all current BOF members would be called Full members and all local members would be BOF

members. The overall cost for Full members would be a slight decrease, while the cost for the BOF members would be £6. Council agreed to the proposal which will go forward to the AGM.

Appointment of Chief Executive - Following interviews, the Chairman and Officers announced that the new Chief Executive of the British Orienteering Federation will be Mike Hamilton. The selection panel reported that the standard of the candidates short listed was very high and the Federation is lucky to have been able to appoint someone with Mike's qualifications and experience. With an IT and sports background Mike has spent the last 15 years with English Hockey ending up as the Chief Executive of World Class Hockey Limited. Mike joined the Federation on 10 January 2006 and after a three week handover Robin Field, the current Chief Executive, will retire on 31 January.

DVO Schools Development – DVO have now appointed their new Community Sport Coach for Derbyshire. Val Johnson has taken up the post and will officially work for BOF Office, while reporting to DVO. Regular 6 monthly reports will be produced on the progress of the development work.

SI Equipment – The new SI equipment is out in the forest and being used, and the lighter “stakes” and smaller boxes seem to be meeting with approval, especially from planners. The equipment is split into 2 groups and being circulated separately. Each of the 3 larger clubs will also get a master set so they can start and finish events using the SI equipment if they want to do this.

Next Committee meeting – the next EMOA committee meeting will be held on March 22nd 2006.

Young Orienteers Festival on May 20 alongside British Sprint Championships - After the popularity of the YOF at Battersea Park this year there will be a similar competition for town or district teams at primary and lower secondary ages.

The British Sprint Championships will have classes for juniors, seniors and veterans and the YOF is designed to give less experienced orienteers from schools and youth groups the chance to take part in a major competition with all the razzmatazz and the chance to see our British elite 'stars' in action. Clubs are asked to encourage their linked schools and youth groups to form teams. This is an opportunity for clubs to make excellent links and, hopefully, to enthruse these youngsters ready for the autumn club competitions.

Out & About – Belvoir Castle

For those of you who attend the LEI event at Belvoir on 26th March I thought I'd provide a little extra information. When you look at the castle perched on the hill above the vale you can understand how Belvoir got its name – Belvoir means 'Beautiful view'.

The original castle is believed to have been a Norman earthwork motte and bailey fortress founded by Robert de Todeni, le Fundeur. In 1267, Robert de Ros founded the stone castle when he was granted a licence to crenellate. Its layout is depicted on a medieval seal, showing the motte supporting a shell keep, with a central square tower. In 1461 during the Wars of the Roses, this Lancastrian fortress was partially dismantled and left to decay, rebuilt by the Manners family, it was slighted after the Civil War. In the 19th century, the total reconstruction of the castle and grounds destroyed the medieval fortress but it left us with a dramatic Gothic Revival Castle, dominating the Vale of Belvoir.

The current owners are the Duke and Duchess of Rutland, who is the 11th Duke. As well as having a stunning position the castle provides an elegant and stylish interior, including rooms such as the Elizabeth Saloon, the State Dining Room, the Regent's Gallery and the Guard Room.

Close to Belvoir Castle is the village of Harby. Here fossils called Devils Toenails have been found which date back to the Jurassic period (200 million years ago).

The Romans were believed to have had a settlement around here as Roman pottery has been found in the fields, also a Roman stone head has been found



in the village. However, the first recorded settlement is a Danish settlement around 850AD. It was made up of the temrs “by” a settlement in Scandinavian, and “heorde”, which means herdsmen (so Harby was the village of the herdemen). And in 1086 Harby does get a mention in the Domesday book (and by this time the name seems to have changed to Herdebi or Hertebi). At this time there were recorded 47 working men in the village.

For those of you who are exhausted after your run in Belvoir, then you probably need some of Daffy's Elixir! The Reverend Thomas Daffy was rector of Harby from 1617 onwards. During his time he was constantly extolling the virtues of Daffy's Elixir which he claimed it would “cure anything and everything”. Those who drank it describe it's effect as “cheerful”. In fact the potion continued to be made long after his death, and was still being made in 1759. The Reverend Daffy also appears to have been a bit of a rogue as the Countess of Rutland had him transferred to Redmile (a much poorer parish) for “conduct unbecoming a clerical gentleman”.

The canal reached Harby in 1798, while the railway came in 1879. Both are now closed, the canal in 1936 and the railway in 1960. The canal route now provides good walking and cycling for those who want a little more exercise.

Edit orial

Someone said to me the other day that there had been very few events in the autumn, but looking at the spring programme you are almost spoilt for choice. Regional events are happening throughout the spring and in between are plenty of district and local events, so no matter what your preference there should be something for you out there.

Try DVO's Riber Hillside (steep Derwent hillsides, but quite runnable woodland, through to the East Midland Champs on a fairly flat fast Stapleford (just don't get on the wrong sides of those large ditches – I've done that before and leaping them does result in wet feet unless you are Jonathan Edwards).

My rest day at the Scottish 6-day event

After the event at 'Inver' me and my dad had planned to attempt a rock-climb called 'Square-face'. This is a 300ft climb on one of the most remote cliffs in the Cairngorms. So after the event we cycled from the assembly area at Inver on our mountain-bikes for four hours up-hill deep into the Cairngorms. On our backs was our rock climbing equipment and bivi stuff. The first three hours was on rocky tracks too a remote ruined shooting lodge. For the next hour we rode on a new purpose built mountain bike track beneath the corries of Ben-na-briude. After leaving the bikes at the end of the track we walked up to the Smith/Wyndrem bivi passing two stag deer. The bivi was at 2500 feet and was made by big granite boulders under which were half burned candles and room for 2 people and a few mice! After a meal of pasta we had a warm night despite snow still lying in the high corries.

The following morning the sun was shining through the cracks between the boulders of the bivi. After noodles for breakfast we packed up and left the biv. It was another hour's uphill walk to reach the climb. The approach route took us through a gully which was still full of snow. A stream had worn out a 200ft long snow cave which we walked through to reach the plateau. We had to cross this to reach a steep sided rocky corrie hidden on the other side of the mountain. We left one rucksack near the top of the climb before we scurried down the steep grassy slope to get to the base of the climb. Already my hands were cold as I put on the climbing equipment. The climb was amazing it consisted of 3 pitches all 100ft long. The belays were on the very edge of the rock so you felt like you were on the edge of space. The climbing was very exposed especially the top pitch and the gusts of wind made it scary. I was over the moon to reach the top and looked at the amazing vista. It felt like we were only people to exist. It was now very windy at the top so I ran down to the 'sneck' while my dad collected the rucksack with the biv gear. We visited a big boulder which our Scottish 6-days campsite neighbour had slept below it in winter. He must have been crazy because it provided almost no shelter. We walked down to our bikes passing a hiker who was the first person who we had seen for over a day. We then cycled downhill, very fast, for the next two hours which was the best mountain-biking I have done. After a short rest near the main road we cycled along the road to Balmoral castle and had a drink and ice-cream. We then cycled along the much quieter back-road to the next day's assembly area near Ballater. We chained the bikes up and waded across the river Dee so we did not have to go all the way round. In Ballater we got the bus back to the event centre campsite which driven by a crazy driver, this was certainly the most dangerous part of the journey!

Many thanks to EMOA for supporting my BOF training at Laganlia, it was great.
