

It seems to be a traditional pastime to take pot shots at those in positions of power and influence, and nationally orient eering has certainly been affected by this, with all sorts of recriminations and blood letting at BOF in recent times. But unless I am incredibly naive this doesn't appear to have been a problem in the East Midlands during my time as Chair man. I have received some very kind words since my resignation, but I have to say that the smooth running of the EMOA is down to the whole committee not just the Chairman. I have worked alongside some very enthusiastic and gifted people during my life, in many different settings, but I have to say that the EMOA committee put most of those in the shade. Some of you will know the personalities involved, some very colouf ul ones it has to be said, but what ever else our differences the mutual love of orient eering always won through. We had some wonderful debates, and some very long meetings, but everyone got their say and I believe

that we always came to a good consensus in the end. Despite a lack of much top quality terrain, we are a strong region, with excellent youth development work in particular, which bodes well for the future.

One of my greatest regrets of having to leave so quickly was knowing that I had left the committee in the lurch, with not just a vacancy for chairman, but also vice-chair and treasurer. I am confident that these posts will be filled shortly, and if anyone is still considering whether or not to put themselves forwards I can honestly say that they will receive a lot of support from some very experienced people. No one is left isolated on EMOA committee, all knowledge and expertise is shared willingly by everyone. There are too many people to thank personally, suffice to say that I have appreciated your friendship and support over recent mont hs.

I hope to be able to get back out in the forests regularly again soon and renew old friendships and rivalries. That is after all why we love orient eering, committee work is all well and good but not hing quite compares to running on the compass through a beautiful sunlit forest! Finally, I hope those of you that attended enjoyed your time at Stapleford Woods for the East Midlands Champs. It was a bit of a labour of love for me as mapper and planner, although I missed most of the day itself, and feedback was universally positive, it was most appreciated.

EMOA Committee & AGM Meeting Report - March 20th 2006

EMOA Chairman & Vice- Chairman — Shortly after the last Committee meeting the Chairman sent out a memo to the committee stating that due to a change in personal circumstances he would no longer be able to continue in his role as EMOA Chairman. At the committee meeting Derek Gale and Ernie Williams put themselves forwarded as Chairman and Vice-Chairman respectively and this was gratefully accepted by the committee.

Thanks were expressed to John Bennett for his role as Chairman.

Start Programme – There will be a meeting on the Friday of the JK at the Event Centre for anyone (parents, juniors, coaches) who may be interested in finding out more about the Start Programme. Details will be in the JK programme.

Club of the Year - CLOK has been named as BOF Club of the Year for 2006. The club receives a trophy and a cheque for £300. HOC were second (£200) and OD third (£100). It is hoped that all clubs will be presented with their awards at this years BOF AGM.

BOF AGM – The BOF AGM will be held at Bost on Spa High School, the JK Event Centre on Saturday 15th April, starting at 5:00pm. The posts for election at the AGM are Chairman, Vice Chairmen (two), Treasurer, and Councillors (four).

Development Grants – Clubs and Associations can be provided with financial assistance to put on Level 1 and Level 2 courses, but they must contact their Regional Development Officer first so that clear guidance on funding can be given before advertising any courses.

BOC 2009 - EMOA is still considering the possibility of hosting BOC 2009. The Grade 1 Controller has reviewed the suitability of the areas and will submit his report to LEI shortly which will be reviewed at the next EMOA committee meeting. If the areas are deemed suitable then EMOA will formally submit a proposal to the Major Events Panel.

Coaching Kit – Level 2 (and above) Coaches are to be encouraged to adopt new Coaching Kit. Financial assist ance will be available in appropriate cases.

Treasurer's Report -SI hire and levies are low compared to budget, but still much income to arrive. Some costs have been incurred due to the cancellation of Whitbarrow National Event.

Fixtures Report – The current event guidelines will be provided to registered event officials. It was agreed that EMOA should drop the answerphone service. It was also agreed that the Yvette Baker Trophy round would be at Grace Dieu on 12th November.

BOF Funding – Funding of BOF by the Sports Council will be reduced. There will therefore be no free places on Summer tours, so there will be increased funding

requests to EMOA and Clubs. There will also be increased charges for courses such as First Aid, Level 3 and 4.

C3 Event Controllers — A proposal had been put to Rules Group to allow clubs to source controllers for C3 events from their own clubs. This will be discussed at next Rules Group. EMOA felt they did not agree with this proposal.

National Forest Report — Roy Denney reported that Sam Lattaway was the replacement for Audrey Brown and he seems keen on promoting orient eering. Roy has also met with the team promoting "Get active in the forest"—this is an initiative of South Derbyshire Council out of the Rosliston Forestry Centre. They include orient eering in the courses they run and are willing to publicise local events.

SI Kit -It was agreed that the hired dibbers should be apportioned between the 3 major clubs as with the other SI kit.

Midland Championship Trophies – It was agreed that a nominated and agreed person should be responsible for the administration of Midland Championship Trophies and that the 3 regions involved should share costs on an equal basis.

BOF Premises – The new premises for BOF are likely to cost more than originally thought, but all Council reps who responded agreed to go ahead with the new venue.

Next Committee meeting—the next EMOA committee meeting will be held on May 22nd 2006.

Qub Summer Lægues

LEI again have a full programme of C5 events throughout the summer starting with an experimental 'Micro-orienteering' type event at Cademan and High Sharpley. There are 20 events in all and two are being organised in conjunction with LOG and two in conjunction with OD.

We have several times been asked why our summer league C5 fixtures do not appear in BOF lists and other lists produced from that source. Other clubs do feature such events in these lists.

The difference arises when the event is registered. Clubs can register a series of events on a simple form or fill out a complete registration form for each such event which is a time consuming process.

The Club has elected to not normally do individual registrations as our summer league events are already so very well attended that many more participants from outside our area would put pressure on the organiser and car parking facilities.

Members of our neighbouring clubs are as always very welcome and the full list is of course published on our web site.

Our ever popular Summer Series of mid-week evening events is once again bigger than ever for 2006. This year sees us join forces with The Leicester Orienteering Club, with 2 events shared as part of each other's Summer League. The format remains the same as recent years, with 3 courses on offer each evening;

The "short" course is fairly straightforward, mainly on paths and aimed at beginners or those who only want a short walk/run of 2-3km.

The "long" course is also fairly straightforward, with the emphasis on a running rather than navigation over 5-6km distance. This course would be an excellent introduction to orient eering for road runners looking to get off the tarmac for a while.

The "technical" course is aimed at serious orienteers, roughly "green" in standard, but expect the unexpected. At some point in the series you will no doubt experience score courses, "Norwegians", map memory, corridor, window and all manner of ingenious challenges.

Fees are again only £ 1 per person, making the series some of the cheapest orient eering in the Country, so bring a friend!

Starts are from 6.30pm-7.30pm, possibly earlier if the planner is ready in time. But be aware of approaching darkness early in the series, and remember that someone has to collect the kites in after everyone has finished.

As always there will be trophies for the winners of each course, based on the best 6 performances over the Series. Post-race analysis in a nearby pub after each event!

Your Local Regional Development Officer - Pauline Olivant

Whilst recently talking to a committee member I discovered he thought I was still only working on schools development so I thought it might be useful to EM members to explain a bit more about what I now do. My job title changed 2 years ago when I started to cover only the East Midlands, less than half the area I had before.

I have always tried to work with the clubs, but now I have more time to work directly to support the development work with the EM clubs. To give you just a sample idea of some of the work I have been doing over the last 6 months, I have been supporting DVO in the employment of their new Community Sport coach. In Lincolnshire Carres Grammar School, Sleaf ord have also appointed a CSC who will work full time in the schools around Sleaf ord, I am supporting her and assisting her to link up with LOG.

I am working with LEI to look at ways they might develop at stronger junior base in their club. In NOCI have organised the publicity with the one partnership of schools for them to attend a local summer league event, where the club will also provide come and try opportunities.

I do still advise schools, but generally I help arrange mapping, training and put them in touch with their local club, (anyone interested in having a go at schools mapping give me ring, we are always looking for more mappers).

I am employed for just over one day a week, but as we are a small region, I also have some National responsibilities for BOF, one of which was to develop a Young Leader award and I still continue to support the BSOA.

Out & About - Crich Chase (The Cromford Canal)

For those of you attending the Crich Chase event in May, you will find that one edge of the map is coloured blue. This is the Cromf ord Canal. So I thought I'd do a little research in to the history of this canal.

The roots of the canal can be traced back to 1779 when a new waterway, the Erewash Canal was opened at Long Eaton. It ran from the River Trent to a point near Langley Mill and it soon became very successful. This lead to businessmen around Pinxton requesting an extension, but soon other businessmen such as the iron furnaces at Butterley and Somercotes, the limestone quarries at Crich, the lead-works at Alderwasley and the cotton mills at Cromford were demanding an extension. In 1788 a meeting in Matlock proposed a link from the southern side of the Peak District to the Erewash Canal. A local businessman, William Jessop, volunteered to do a survey. Many local businessmen supported the application but the strongest voice by far was Sir Richard Arkwright, who owned the cotton mills at Cromford. As those of you who remember your history will know, he was the pioneer of the factory system with his Cromford mill being the

first successful water-powered cotton-spinning works. Cromford had the advantage of being well away from the machine breakers who wrecked many similar businesses elsewhere, but getting the goods to market was proving difficult. Arkwright needed a reliable and cheap transport system. In December 1788 a further meeting was held and with a positive proposal from Jessop, interest was so great that half of the estimated cost was raised in just 2 weeks following the meeting.

By 1789 the Cromford Canal authorisation went through Parliament, the only contest ant being the Erewash canal company who feared the new canal would impact their water supply. The new line was to be 14 ½ miles long and would serve several mines, quarries, lead-works, the ironworks at Butterley and Somercotes and the cotton mills at Cromford. It was to have 3 aqueducts and 4 tunnels of which one at Butterley was to be 2 miles long. It would require 14 locks, all in a section south of the Butterley Tunnel.

However, money was soon a problem and it ran out by 1791 and the company was forced to take out loans and make calls on shareholders to raise more cash. But good news was just around the corner. A new company was formed to build the Nottingham Canal to Langley Mill where it would join the Erewash and Cromford canals. Once agreements had been reached to build extra reservoirs the situation looked more promising. Then in 1792 Richard Arkwright died at the ago of 60. Many of the public saw him as the driving force behind the canal but it appears he had a more minor role, more of a figurehead and during his life ha had several disagreements with his colleagues. including complaining about the inconvenience he would suffer by the canal crossing his land, even complaining that "The roads would be soiled during construction and the horses used on the canal will eat all the meadows". In fact the animosity between Outram, who was one of the main proponents of the canal and Arkwright became quite entrenched with Outram saving to a friend "Arkwright ought to have his head cut off". and Arkwright countering by insisting "I must recommend a proper person to superintend that part of the canal that goes through my property and that Mr. Outram's office shall not extend to the part of the canal that crosses my land" which the rest of the committee allowed. Arkwright, while not a driving force was seen as a figurehead and many got involved because of his name.

In February 1972 the Cromford Canal was opened to the western portal of the Butterley Tunnel. However, the Bullbridge Aqueduct was already in need of repair. As architect, Jessop paid for the rebuilding out of his own pocket and later in the year when the same problem occurred with the Wigwell Aqueduct over the River Derwent, he again had to pay out of his own pocket.

In August 1794 the Cromford Canal was fully opened and became a great success, despite having cost twice the original estimate to build (any current government projects come to mind?). With both the Nottingham Canal and the Derby Canal opening in the next few years, the goods could flow in many directions out from the Peak District. But the canal was not just used for goods, in 1797 the first passenger (or "fly") boat service began operating from Cromford Basin. It was run by Nathaniel

Wheat croft who made twice weekly trips to Nottingham, a distance of 38 miles, costing 5 shillings (25p) first class and 3 shillings (15p) second class.



By 1800 the canal was becoming more and more successful and the idea of linking with the Peak Forest Canal near Manchester to the Cromford end of the canal was mooted. It was seen as a quick way of getting goods to London. At the time the idea was dropped due to it's complexity but in 1825 a new proposal was made to link the canals by rail, and the Cromford & High Peak Railway Company was formed.

By 1830 dividends were increased to just under 20%, the canal was in it's heyday, and with the opening of the Cromford & High Peak Railway in 1831. However, the railways were soon to begin replacing canals. However, by 1841 the canal was still going strong, carrying twice as much coal as it had at the turn of the century and dividends getting as high as 28%. The canal also carried substantial quantities of farm produce, ironstone, gritstone and limestone as well as iron from the Butterley works. But by 1843 revenue was down by 25% and also the original water supply dried up (it had come from the lead mines, but as they moved to deeper levels their supply dried up), so the company had to build a new pumping station near Cromford which drew water from the River Derwent.

The owners of the canal were far sighted enough to realise they could not fight the railways and in 1847 it agreed to sell the canal to the Manchester, Buxton, Matlock & Midlands Junction Railway Company. However, it took a further 5 years for the canal to change hands and some say the canal owners were over compensated.

By 1888 only 15% of the volume of cargo was transported on the canal and most of this was local traffic, all long distance traffic going by rail. In 1889 subsidence in the Butterley Tunnel meant it had to be closed for 4 years for work to take place. However, this was not just lost revenue for those 4 years but in the mean time many of the canal

users had found alternative modes of transport and the canal never recovered. And when in 1900 there was a second collapse in the Butterley Tunnel, the closure was permanent. In 1937 the owners announced their intention to close the rest of the canal and this closure took place in 1944. Much of the southern section of the canal was filled in, while the area north of the Butterley Tunnel was left untouched. In 1974 Derbyshire County Council bought the northern 5 ½ miles of the canal from Amergate to Cromf ord and the towpath is now walkable, though the canal itself still needs a lot of work to get it back in to a workable condition.

We are still short of officials for the committee, and although we have replaced our chairman we still need more volunteers, if only to bring in new ideas. Please think carefully about whether you can give up just a little of your time to sit on a committee, or just help at events. By the autumn, clubs and the region will be looking for new officers, so don't be afraid to step forward (help will always be given to those joining committes for the first time).

To end, as we now have British Summer Time, may you enjoy your runs in much warmer woods with no brashings, brambles or nettles.
