A small buffet has been arranged free to all AGM attendees (which is hoped will include veget arian options).

Prior to the AGM a street event will take place with starts from around 6:40 to 7:10pm. It will be a 45 minute score event around the streets and footpaths around Kegworth.

Entry to the street event will be free.

## EMOA Committee & AGM Meeting Report - May 22<sup>nd</sup> 2006

**EMOA Treasurer** – We are still short of an EMOA Treasurer. We have managed for the past year thanks to the previous treasurer being willing to continue in a background role, but with the new AGM imminent we need everyone to consider volunt eering. It is essential we have a new treasurer for next year.

**English Orienteering Council** – Derek Gale attended the EOC meeting. The main concern is that the funding for the EOC which comes through BOF is not "ring-fenced" in the future. It is important that there is an athlete pathway available for English orienteers.

East Midlands Trophies — There were a number of problems with the trophy distribution, packaging, certificates this year. We need a volunteer to administer the East Midlands Trophies on a long term basis — ensure they are returned from the previous year's winners, ensure certificates are provided for the event, ensure all packaging stays with the trophies, ensure list of names and contact details of holders is maintained. Please could someone out there volunteer to help with this task (it only happens once a year).

British Orienteering Championships 2009 — Peter Hubberstey had reviewed the areas that LEI proposed using for the British Orienteering championships in 2009 in terms of suitability for a BOC. Peter had produced an excellent report on each area which basically concluded that it depended on whether BOF wanted the championships always to be on prime orienteering terrain, or whether rotation around the regions was of prime concern. This lead to a lot of discussion as to whether EMOA should continue with the proposal. In the end it was concluded that we would not take the proposal forward, as it was felt that for the British championships quality of terrain must be paramount, but that we may propose using the areas for either the British Middle Distance or British Sprint Championships. The committee formally thanked LEI for their submission.

**New BOF Logo** – There is a new BOF logo available. You will see this on a lot of future BOF correspondence and publicity.



**Treasurers Report** – The acting Treasurer believes we should still have a surplus this year despite fall in membership. It was also agreed to stop the process of writing down depreciation on kit and simplify the accounts. Need to determine EMOA charges for new Local BOF members. Should it be no charge - and no services of fered, £ 1 per head, say, including EMEWS, or £ 3 per head as for Full BOF members. Clubs to consider and feedback to July meeting.

**Fixtures** – EMOA agreed that we will ensure that the Veteran Home Internationals are run in 2009, either in our region or elsewhere if necessary. In 2007 the Midland Champs will be hosted by East Anglia. It is proposed that the East Midland Champs are held at Eyam on December 9<sup>th</sup>. For 2008 it is proposed that we host the Midland Champs at Budby on Feb 10<sup>th</sup> and the East Midland Champs at Grace Dieu on 8<sup>th</sup> November. Discussion also took place on whether Stapleford was still feasible for the Compasssport Cup 1<sup>st</sup> Round next year given the discussions at Rule Group (see later notes). It was agreed that it was still appropriate to use.

#### **BOF Council Feedback**

- 1) The new Chief Executive and Chairmen would like to join us at a formal committee meeting. After discussion we wondered if it was better to invite them to our AGM and provide an opportunity to have a 2 way conversation between them and members attending the AGM.
- 2) There were a number of items on communications that BOF were looking at prioritising. The EMOA committee felt that the 2 things to get right were the website and providing an on-line capability for membership applications.

3) The next item is a lot more abstract as it concerns the Vision, Value and Priorities of the Federation. With a new Chair and a new Chief Executive, BOF Executives want to have a focus for their activities. It is something we may want to discuss with the Chairmen and Chief Executive so it was agreed we should ask EMEWS readers where should orienteering be going. Should we look to have more technical events? Should we look to broaden the base of orienteering? Do we look to put on more city street events? Should events have closer ties to the community (always ensuring we have a local WI or similar in attendance selling cakes)? Should clubs just be event organisers or should they look to have a wider social capability? Where should orienteering be going? So what do EMEWS readers think. Please provide feedback to the editor and they will be taken to the committee (and if you agree we can publish the ideas in EMEWS).

#### Report on BOF Rules Group

1) A key area for discussion was the status of embargoed areas and what constitutes a competitive / non-competitive orienteer. The rules do cover this but are open to interpretation. It is intended that the Rules Group will produce a short document to cover this for the future.

The problem is that rule 3.1.2 states that "at level 3 events and above competitors shall declare themselves non-competitive if their acquaintance with the terrain would give the, substantial advantage over other competitors. Nothing that occurred more than 24 months before the date of the event shall be taken into account".

If this rule is taken as saying if you have been on the terrain for a grade 3 event within the last 24 months you could declare yourself non-competitive (though the regional events guidelines suggest this is 12 months). Even on the 12 months basis, an event like the Compass Sport Cup First Round scheduled for Stapleford early next year (which is classified as a grade 3 event) could mean that anyone who competed in the East Midlands Champs there earlier this year could be classified as non-competitive. The EMOA committee agreed that this should not be the case for this event in particular.

The EMOA Committee felt that in many ways a state of "common sense" is OK. Orienteers will declare themselves ineligible if they have planned or controlled on an area.

2) BOF will be distributing a letter in the near future to all Club Secretaries asking each Club within BOF to consider giving a ref und of some sort if a competitor has pre-entered an event and then has to withdraw before the closing date e.g. the retention of a specified amount or percentage of the entry fee with the return of the remainder as a cheque or a voucher to cover the cost of entry at a future event held by the Club. After the closing date it would be up to each Club to decide on the level of ref und, if at all—it is well known that in the athletics world there is an easy to follow way of working which is 'no ref unds' and no athlete expects that there will be because, having pre-entered, there is always the

possibility of not being able to compete on the day — but at the very least a competitor who has pre-entered should be able to ask for or be offered the map of their course after the event using an SAE.

When a Club has agreed a 'Ref unds Policy' there is an expectation that the policy will be printed on events flyers and on entry forms and in final details sent to pre-entered competitors.

- 3) There is a list of Controllers available by Grade and/or by Region available from BOF when required.
- 4) Graham Nilsen's 'Guide to Good Planning' updated by David May and available in full as a 12.7 MB download from BOF website.
- 5) National and Local Membership proposals agreed that there is an expectation that all Controllers and Level 1 and 2 Coaches will be National Members of BOF whereas Organisers and Planners could be either National or Local Members of BOF.
- 6) For eign competitors taking part in British Championships agreed that the Championships are only for eligible competitors as stated in the latest edition of BOF Rules. For eign competitors could start early, run the course as a 'control checking' exercise, but not to be included in any results list. Agreed it would be worthwhile to investigate Rules and views of other National Federation / Members of IOF.

#### Map Group Feedback

One of the key problems being faced by mappers at present is the ability of planners to change maps using OCAD after the mapper has finished. This has resulted in inconsistent standards being used, even at major events. Both LEI and NOC have protocols written that specifically state this should not occur and offered to share them with Map Group.

**DVO Schools Development Project** – The DVO Coach is now in place and implementing the agreed plans. As well as supporting DVO they also assisted in the training day in the Lakes where members of other clubs such as LOG were also supported.

**SI Kit** - Derek Gale reported that there had been a lot of positive feedback on the new fibreglass stakes as they were much easier for the planner to get out into the forest.

After discussion it was agreed that EMOA should purchase an additional 50 fibreglass stakes and 10 new control boxes at an estimated cost of £ 1,000. This would mean that most club events should all have sufficient fibreglass stakes and equipment.

One thing that has been noticed about the new SI boxes is that the first person around a course sometimes notices a slight delay before it beeps as they do go in to a snooze mode.

**Next Committee meeting**—the next EMOA committee meeting will be held on July 10<sup>th</sup> 2006 at Clifton Village Hall. As a reminder all members are invited to attend and listen to discussions.

**AGM** – The notice of the AGM is at the front of this section. Anyone with any items for the agenda should let the secretary know before Jully 20<sup>th</sup>, 2006. Important – As already noted elsewhere it is essential that we have a new treasurer at the AGM, but the EMOA secretary is also due to retire after his 3 years in office. Please consider volunt eering to help your EMOA committee.

## BOF Level 3 and 4 Courses 13<sup>th</sup> – 15th October 2006 Shackleton Lodge, Brathay, Ambleside, Cumbria

There will be both a Level 3 Course and Level 4 Course based at the Shackleton Lodge over the weekend of 13<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup> October 2006. Following the format of the previous years' courses, we have co-ordinated another two such courses to enable travel to be combined and an opportunity for coaches and aspirant coaches from different regions to train together. The limited social time will also be enhanced by this combination.

The weekend will comprise practical and theory sessions. Assembly will be after dinner on the Friday evening, although snacks will be available. The course will run from 09.00 - 21.00 Saturday and 09.00 - 15.00 Sunday. There will be no assessment during the weekend although candidates will be given details of potential assessors. The course will not cover any of the First Aid requirements of the awards and a further two-day course covering those aspects will need to be attended prior to assessment.

The course is being heavily subsidised by the Federation's coaching budget. The all-inclusive fee of full board after Friday's evening meal to lunch on Sunday and all tutoring/materials costs etc., is £75. We will be self catering and everyone will be expected to assist with that. Travel expenses are not however available. Day visitors will be allowed subject to availability at a cost of £50. Clubs and Regional Associations usually pay the candidate's costs.

Numbers are limited and attendance will be strictly on a first come first served basis. The closing date for applications is the **1**<sup>st</sup> **October** and final details will be sent out on October 9<sup>th</sup>.

### Out and About - Orienteering in Tudor Times

Normally in this section I 've looked at a local orient eering area and found out information about the area and surrounding countryside. However, I was looking at a map book I have the other day "The Counties of Britain: A Tudor Atlas by John Speed" and started to try to match the orient eering areas we use today to the maps in the book which date from around the period 1611-12.

So I started by looking at Leicestershire. The first thing that leapt out at me was that the largest, densest wood drawn on Speed's map was of an area called Dalby Woode which appears just to the east of Wymeswold. While Dalby village still exists just to the east of the A46 on the current OS map there is not much sign of any woodland in the vicinity. Moving south west into the Charnwood area the map does show woodland covering the area, the south end of which is a fenced park of Bradgate. Looking at the map you can certainly see where the areas of Charnwood Forest today would fit on the map. However, the wooded area does appear to go further east than today.

In the introduction to the Leicestershire section it states "unlike the counties adjoining it to the west and north, Leicestershire had few trees and hedgerows, and its most heavily wooded areas being the ancient, but much reduced, forests of Charnwood, Dalby and Leicester. Leicester Woods as shown on the Speed map were to the west of the city of Leicester and to the south of Ratby village. So the National Forest areas that are now sprouting up appear to be bringing back some of the old Leicester Forest. If you look further at the Leicestershire map it is very difficult to spot any other patches of woodland. There only appear to be 2 others, Staunton Harold, around the National trust church on the border of Derbyshire, which still has woods surrounding it today, though none have been used for major orient eering events, and another patch of woodland near the Rutland border. This wood appears to still exist today, called Launde Park Wood, just to the North of Loddington. Again this area may have been around since Tudor times, but I am not aware of ever having orient eered there.

If we now move North to Nottingham, you would expect to find a lot of forests in the county. And the introduction starts by saying "From the tenth century Nottinghamshire has been known as 'the shire with the wood'. In fact Speed's map of Nottinghamshire appears to have a green woodland spine to it from Nottingham northwards. The Southern end of the spine was called Thorney Wood, which is close to Burntstump Country Park which NOC use today. The map continues with an enclosed area which looks like Best wood Parke Lodge which seems to equate to Blidworth woods today. Interestingly enough if you look at Speed's map Blodworth village is surrounded by woods yet if you look at Blidworth today that is the one area with no woodland. Lyndhurst Wood on Speed's map seems to equate to Strawberry Hill today while Budby seems to exist as woodland in the past and today. Although the name has changed from



Budbye, a detail of the woodland around Budby in Tudor times is shown on the attached diagram below. If we move North and look around the Clumber area on Speed's map, there is no sign of any woodland around the current national Trust areas. That came later. However, Welbeck Abbey and Park are shown as wooded, and there are still some woods around here today. In fact there appear to be a number of patches of woodland to the west of Worksop on Speed's map. None of which appear to exist today. It appears that many of Nottingham's woods are in a similar position today to where they were

in Tudor times. One thing I thought I would share was that Speed commented that one of the commodities for which there was a culinary and medical demand which grew well in Nottinghamshire was liquorice, cultivated in the neighbourhood of Worksop. So far I haven't seen much of the liquorice harvest in Nottingham recently.

If we move east to Lincolnshire, as you would expect Speed's map shows very few woodlands. The main area in the North of the county does seem to have remained though. Speed's map shows a patch of woodland just between where Scunt horpe and Brought on are today and the woods still exist in this area. If we move to the South East of Lincoln, Speed's map shows another patch of woodland between 2 rivers just north of the village of North Kyme. This is near where Tattershall Castle stands today. If you look at the OS map today you will find the village of Timberland, and the main drain is the Timberland Delph. So though no wood exists today in the area, the woodland at least lives on in name.

Speed's map of Der byshire appears to have a large number of woods scattered across the county. Starting in the north east of the county a large area of woodland is depicted near Barleburgh and a further area to the eat called Whit well Woods. Whit well still exists today, and Barlborough has a hall grounds and surrounding woods still. High in the Peak, Peak Forest appears to be exactly that according to Speed, though only small clumps now remain. What stands out on Speed's map of Derbyshire is that the county does not appear to have the open woodlands of Nottinghamshire or Leicestershire, but has large numbers of enclosed woodlands. The forests also seem to have moved. Speed's map shows no woods around Matlock, but as we come south Crich Chase is clearly shown on Speed's map, and across the River Derwent is clearly another patch of woodland (Shining Cliff Woods). Speed shows 4 major clumps of woodlan in a triangle of area with Ashbourne to the west and Wirksworth to the north, and West on

Under wood to the south. Today this area appears bereft of woodland. Kedleston is shown on Speed's map as a wooded park.

If we move into South Derbyshire we again come into areas of open woodland. Ticknall, near today's Robin Wood, and areas north of Swadlincote are all shown as heavily wooded. So again, the National Forest is taking us back to our Tudor days.

Speed drew all his maps the same size, so Lincolnshire and Rutland are both given 2 A4 pages. What immediately struck me was that Rutland has woods, lots of them, according to Speed. Starting at Oakham and running north east is a string of woods, and while there are some small patches still in existence today, most seem to have disappeared. However, the large area of wood in Rutland is Leef eilde Forest. Looking at an OS map today a wood called Prior's Coppice exists which does have a number of small patches of woodland still around it, but not orient eering size areas.

This fixture list is intended to list all major events in the UK, and all East Midlands events. It includes all the information available to me about the event at the time of going to press. Unless otherwise stated, District events of fer entry on the day (EOD) to a range of colour coded (C4) course with start times from 10:30 to 12:30. Local events (C5) will only have a limited range of courses. Regional and National events (C3 & C2) provide a range of age related courses and are normally entered in advance using a Standard Entry Form (SEF); entry on the day (EOD) will usually be limited and more expensive. Most will offer a limited number of colour-coded courses for EOD. Cheques payable to organising clubs given at beginning of details, if not specified.

The OS map reference is either the car park or point from which the event will be signposted. The list is based on BOF registration, but events are sometimes cancelled. If you are uncertain of whether an event will be on, check with the organiser. The editor takes no responsibility for wasted journeys.

The East Midlands Orient eering Association has an answerphone which provides upto date information on events and also late cancellations. It is available on 0906 270 3419 at a cost of 25p a minute.
