

EMOA AGM

The East Midlands Orient eering Association AGM will take place on Monday 11th September 2006 at the Red Lion, Kegworth.

The AGM will start at 8:00pm and will take place in the separate out building (a.k.a the Skittle Alley).

A small buffet has been arranged free to all AGM attendees (which is hoped will include veget arian options).

Prior to the AGM a street event will take place with starts from around 6:40 to 7:10pm. It will be a 45 minute score event around the streets and footpaths around Kegworth. Entry to the street event will be free.

EMOA Committee Meeting Report - July 10th 2006

EMOA Treasurer – We are still short of an EMOA Treasurer. We have managed for the past year thanks to the previous treasurer being willing to continue in a background role, but with the new AGM imminent we need everyone to consider volunt eering. It is essential we have a new treasurer for next year.

EMOA Secretary – At the AGM our Secretary will have completed his 3 year cycle, so we need a new secretary. Please be willing to help out.

EMOA Certificates – Ernie Williams is arranging distribution of certificates to the EMOA 2006 Champions once they have been printed. A person has agreed to take on the role of custodian of the EMOA trophies (to ensure they get returned, record who has them, etc). The committee also agreed that we need M/W70 trophies.

BOF Chair and Chief Executive to Attend EMOA Committee Meeting — The new BOF Chair man and Chief Executive are both planning to attend the next EMOA Committee meeting on September 25th. This will be the first committee meeting after the AGM, and as usual all members are invited to attend. The venue is Clifton Village hall, just of f the A453 coming in to Nottingham from the M1 (after first roundabout, continue towards Nottingham and turn left in to Village Road, the Hall is more or less across in front of you). Even if you can't attend, you are welcome to submit questions for the committee to bring up at this session. So what do you want to know? This is your chance to ask what you've always wanted to find out, so turn up, or send your questions to a member of the committee (addresses at the front of EMEWS).

Orient eering on Radio 4 — There was an item on Radio 4 which featured the success of the 2006 European Youth Orient eering Championships mens relay team which won a silver medal. The team included John Rocke from LEI. Thanks were recorded to Hilary Palmer and Pauline Olivant for all their work with EMOA Juniors.

Embargoed Areas – There was further discussion on the use of embargoed areas and what was appropriate access. From the point of view of coaches it is often OK to use such areas for junior coaching purposes without compromising the event. Also there is an expectation that 'common sense' will prevail as those most affected amongst competitors intending to take part in an event are the mapper, planner and controller of the most recent use of an area rather than all of the competitors.

Treasurer's Report – A detailed where has the money gone section provides more detail on this. The accounts appear to be heading toward a surplus of £400 compared to budgeted loss of £550. It was agreed to reduce SI income from 60p/20p to 40p/10p from 1st January 2007. It is proposed to keep event levy as it is.

Local Membership - It was also proposed that all Clubs in the Region are to encourage all 'new' BOF 'Local members' to have, from 1st September 2006 to 31^{st} December 2007, free membership of EMOA so that they will get EMEWS for between 12 and 16 months without needing to pay the £3.00 annual fee — the intention is to encourage them to take up full BOF National Membership, or at the very least, take up of EMOA membership from 1st January 2008 — a snip at only £3.00!

AGM – Details of the AGM arrangements are available at top of page. The agenda is provided here in EMEWS as are the minutes of last years meeting.

Fixtures – The Midland Nights and C4 Yvette Baker trophy event are due to be held at Grace Dieu on the weekend of Nov 11th/ 12th 2006. This is currently in doubt due to the area being part let to a shooting tenant. The fallback position is to use Bagworth Woods.

It is hoped we can have closer liaison between EMOA and WMOA for C4 events as there are a number of clashed in the current fixtures list. The problem is that both regions organise their C4 events to avoid clashes with C3 events.

DVO are to host a National event on 9th December 2007 at Longshaw. Final permissions are still being clarified.

EMOA intend to propose hosting the British Sprint Championships at Nottingham University and the British Middle Distance Championships on the same weekend at Grace Dieu in 2009.

EMOA League – Due to DVO's Hardwick Park event not having a Brown course, the event will be dropped from the EMOA League this year.

National Forest – A 10th Anniversary event is planned – see separate article in EMEWS.

DVO Development Project – Work is ongoing with this. The scope is wider than just DVO alone due to the different funding sources.

SI Equipment – There have been a lot of good comments received about the new light weight equipment.

Junior Inter-Regional – EMOA finished 8th which was a little poorer than previous years. However, the Men's relay team finished 3rd.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY National Forest Trophy



To celebrate the 10th running of this event LEI, with financial support from the Forest Company, are to advertise the event widely to turn the junior courses into a come-and-try-it. The event will take place on March 25th, 2007. Simultaneously the technical and longer courses will be given the opportunity to run on the much extended and newly mapped, now maturing area, interspersed with copses and plantations of ancient

woodlands. Under these circumstances it is felt inappropriate to include this in the East Midlands League so advantage is being taken to offer a long-O for those who like such a challenge. It is expected to be about 15k long.

Electronic punching and results will be employed but dibber hire will be free. There will be two starts but a common finish near Groby College which will be the assembly area. The jury will award the National Forest Trophy to the most outstanding performance on the day.

The concept is to piggy back National Forest promotional advertising to get to a large novice population and hopefully attract a lot of potential members. It has been pitched late March to allow us to follow up the leads and offer our summer league events to keep people interested. The event is heavily discounted to novices and families indeed we will lose money on many of them but if only a handful end upjoining the club we will justify our efforts and we are hoping for more than that.

We will be advertising throughout the local press and flyers / notices will go to schools, libraries, running clubs and local shops etc.

The novice courses will be designed so that they all do well but by having a proper event with competitive courses running simultaneously they will experience the excitement of the true sport. In addition the more orienteers there are about the more people can talk to anyone showing interest.

There will be an advert in the next EMEWS with more details.

Where's the money gone?

The Association's audited accounts will be presented to the AGM., below are simplified unaudited accounts. These again show membership is still falling but only a small reduction over last year. Event levies and SI levies up considerable following the 2006 increases. Unfortunately Nottingham County Council has made its final grant for Junior Orienteering. The Junior Inter-regional surplus was used to fund development work. In addition the Association is co-funding, with three other partners, an additional junior coaching scheme. The 2006/7 accounts for ecast a loss in order to fund this development for another two years out of reserves.

The association spent nearly £5,000 on buying new SI and second-hand SI equipment. This has been received very f avourably and more new boxes and stakes are to be bought this year too.

MINUTES OF THE 41st ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE EAST MIDLANDS ORIENTEERING ASSOCIATION HELD ON MONDAY NOVEMBER 21ST 2005 At Clifton Village Hall at 8.00 pm

3. Chairman's Report

The last year has simply flown by. It doesn't seem two minutes since John Woodall approached me in the drizzle at the LOG 2004 "Summer" Relays and asked me to consider standing as EMOA chairman. To be honest I haven't been as active as I would have liked over the last 12 months, either as Chair or orienteering in the forest, but hopefully this will change as our twins stop spreading their bugs around the Bennett family.

I have been lucky to be surrounded by such an experienced and highly motivated EMOA committee, my biggest problem has always been stopping them talking! I would like to give a special thanks to Ray Barnes as vice-chairman and short notice stand-in, Bob Alderson for being such an able secretary and keeping us organised, John Woodall for his sound advice from the president's seat, and Roger Edwards for his invaluable work as treasurer. Sadly Roger's 3 year tenure comes to an end at this meeting, and as I type I am unsure as to whether or not we have found a successor. Roger will be a difficult act to follow and I thank him on behalf of the EMOA committee for his efforts.

Earlier in the year I had the pleasure of presenting the trophies at the both the Midlands and East Midlands Championships. Congratulations to all the class winners, also NOC and DVO for putting on such high quality events. The sunshine and snow at Longshaw will remain in my memory banks for a very long time, but is it really compulsory to have sub zero conditions at prize-givings? Then there was the excellent Compass-sport Cup first round at Belvoir, a triumph for LEI's organisation despite the mud, and also nearly a triumph for LOG as they came a narrow 2^{nd} in the Compass-sport Trophy qualification at their first attempt.

East Midlands clubs continue to be highly competitive, with numerous international call-ups this year. Elite success has always been a major factor in recruiting new people to orienteering, especially youngsters, but the other end of our sport is equally important. This year I want to seek out all planners and organisers of Summer League events for special praise. Some of these events are of the highest quality, sometimes even with pre-marked maps and e-punching, on excellent areas for a fraction of the cost of Sunday morning orienteering. These events continue to attract new members in droves, the trick appears to be holding on to them.

Hilary Palmer and Pauline Olivant have been hard at work on the junior front again this year, with Pauline's new role as Regional Development Officer starting to make a real difference to school orienteering. Much is always made of the aging population of orienteers, so anyone who helps attract youngsters to our wonderful sport deserves our full support.

Many of us have benefited from the excellent courses put on by Ernie Williams and his band of happy helpers this year, but I'm sure Ernie would wish that a few more had taken up his offer of an Organisers course. As orienteering rules continue to be tweaked it is important that event officials keep updating themselves, to ensure that competitors experience high quality events. The length of "green" courses in particular has been a concern.

As we approach the climax of the Lloyd Davis East Midlands League can anyone remember how to spell "gal(l)op(p)en"? Seriously though, thanks to the Williamson family for collating the results again this year, and everyone who has helped to make this such an exciting series.

Finally a look to the future. Some of you will know that LEI have put forward a proposal to hold BOC 2009 in the region. This is subject to the usual processes, including vetting of the areas by a Grade 1 Controller, but following the successful EMOA contribution to JK 2003 in The Lakes it would be nice to see a major event in the East Midlands again.

On that note I can confirm that I am happy to stand as Chairman for the next 12 months, that is if you are happy to have me. Apologies to anyone I have forgotten to thank, you know who you are.

4. Secretary's report

EMOA had 371 members (a decrease in Senior and Junior members and a slight increase in Family members, with one additional club). We have a total of 45 controllers at the various Grades (increase of 12%). One Regional conference each for controllers, planners were held. There were eight coaching courses at Level 1 and one coaching course at level 2.

5. Treasurer's report and approval of Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Statement
The Treasurer introduced the accounts and explained the background to the overall deficit of £2,966.
This is the result of a surplus on the year of £2,000 less £5,000 set aside for the purchase of an extra set of SI equipment.

The Association has been saving up for the last four years but we did not have enough to make the purchase. So the sum of £5,000 set aside gives us £10,400 to buy this equipment and still leave some to replace the existing equipment in a couple of years time.

The other unusual factor relates to the Association's promotion of the Junior Inter Regional Championship. This event was held in the last weekend in June, so that much of the expenditure straddled the Association's year end. A balance of £1,805 shows in the accounts and this will be sorted out later in the year when any surplus will be made available to encourage more developments.

The Treasurer highlighted some of the key income and expenditure items: Membership is falling so membership income has dropped too. Event and SI levy was sustained as we held the Midland Championship and the Compass Sport Regional round within the Region. The event income from the very successful JK 2004 was more than expected so we had an extra £827 this year.

On the junior side, income and expenditure were both down as with the JIRC being on our doorstep and we did not have to pay to travel! We must welcome the grant of £442 from Nottinghamshire County Council. The cost of awards to support juniors was abnormally low.

After allowing for the loss, the accumulated balance is still a healthy £5,716. This is a sufficient buffer against bad times.

The accounts for the year, having been circulated were accepted.

Out and About - Kegworth

The EMOA AGM is to be held in Kegworth and preceding that we have a free street score event, so why not know a little more about the village you are running round! I'll try and ensure that controls will be near the features mentioned in this article.

The site of Kegworth was situated well within the territory of the Caritani, one of the most powerful Ancient British tribes. While a date cannot be put on the foundations of the first settlement, although Anglo - Saxon burials have been found in Kingston - On - Soar and at Hathern, a pin of the Seventh century was also found near the Hermitage which may indicate the date and location of the earliest settlers. The name of Kegworth comes from two languages, English and Danish, so it must date from some time between 874 and 1086. It means 'Worth' or 'enclosure' of a man named Kaggi, the Danish name for Redbeard. Kegworth was recorded in the Doomsday Book as being held by Earl Harold Godwin, who became the last of the Saxon kings. After Harold's defeat at the Battle of Hastings in 1066 the Earl Hugh of Chester was given the land by William The Conquer or. It was know in those days as Cachworde, Caggworth and Cogga.

After the Royalists defeated Simon de Montfort in 1265, estates gained by the Earl of Gloucester included land in Kegworth. The privilege to hold a weekly market was granted in 1290. The earliest surviving building as one would expect, is the church The tower base dates from 1250 and the rest was built in 1370 when the two manors of Kegworth were united under a single Lord of the Manor.

The next oldest building visible is the cruck cottage forming the street front of the Cottage Restaurant. This is 15th Century, but the stucco covering conceals its age. Many other buildings similarly hide their oldest parts under stucco or modern fronts as at the top of Packington Hill, where early 18th Century timber frames show at the rear.

Many buildings in the High Street and London Road date from the 18th Century when the main London - Manchester Road went up the High Street and down Packington Hill. Some were town houses, others farm houses with yards. Most of the latter have had their yards subsequently built on. The barn of number 55 High Street was demolished in 1979 to make room for another house, but the farm yard of number 48 remains, although the farm house was rebuilt in Victorian times.

The internal road system of the village gradually developed as time went on as it became necessary to obtain access to neighbouring villages. The Romans used a ford across the Trent nearby and a Romano - British farm lies at the end of Long Lane. A Saxon cemetery was found two hundred years ago and the bumps and hollows between the A6 and the Soar may be the remains of a Saxon village.

During the middle ages the Parish was responsible for maintaining the condition of the roads. To try and improve the rough roads in the village, an Act of Parliament was passed in 1555 ordering every man in the parish to work for four [later six] days a year on the roads; each farmer had to provide horses and carts according to his land holding. This continued until the early 18th Century when, with the increase in traffic, it became necessary to change this to paid labour.

Although farming was a large factor in Kegworth life, and still remains on the fringes, industry started in the late 18th Century/early 19th Century with the introduction of Stockingers Shops. Some still exist (e g behind the Britannia) and can be recognised by the long rows of windows on the first floor. As the industry grew, small courtyards of cottages were built in the old farm yards. Women and children also worked when they could, and the hosiery and lace trade were ranked as two of the most important industries in the village from 1841 onwards. The Kegworth hand frame stockingers were highly skilled in the art of making silk stockings and they received many orders from royalty and people of high rank. Queen Victoria, the Prince of Wales, the Danish Royal family and the King of Spain were all customers of the stockingers of Kegworth.

Meeting House Yard lay behind the present 'Friends Cottage', and included a Quaker graveyard The last trace of these 'yards' was demolished when the entrance to Australia yard was removed to make way for the Library in High Street.

A depression in the 1890's coincided with the introduction of the internal combustion engine, A motor bike factory was started which developed into the present Slack and Parrs.

Domestic service was also important. In 1851 as many as 121 people were described as servants, housekeepers or Charwomen. In 1899 their work was arduous with long hours, and the restricted personal freedom and the lack of privacy was poor by the standards of today but at the time they counted themselves lucky to be fed, clothed and housed.

Industrialisation was the beginning of the end of this era in Kegworth's history, but there were still socks and stockings being made in the village as late as the 1940's.

Despite the growth in trade and manufacturing, there was only a very slight increase in population during the 19th century. The number of inhabitants rose from 1416 people in 1801 to 2078 a century later, but with actual decline in some decades, today there is approximately 3,500 people living in the village with 1,500 houses.

Kegworth has always prospered from its advantages of trade and routes Originally these were farming, road and river, later textiles, rail and canal, and now light industry, motorway and airport. It has been lucky in having relative prosperity and slow but steady growth which has given it the character of a friendly, active community.

Kegworth was part of the Rural district of Castle Donington until 1974 when it became part of the District of North West Leicestershire, whose administrative centre is located at Coalville.
