EMOA Committee Meeting Report - November 28th 2006 / January 22nd 2007

Grade 1 Controller - Ray Barnes has been appointed a Grade 1 Controller.

Secretary - We are still desperate for an EMOA Secretary. The job is fairly straightforward and simply needs someone to minute meetings and forward any correspondence. Please could a volunteer step forward.

Fixtures Secretary - Our Fixtures Secretary will be working in Pakistan for the next 3 years. Unless someone else steps forward he will continue to perform the role but not attend any meetings.

Club of the Year Competition - BOF are holding a Club of the Year competition. Applications had to be in by 25th January. It was looking for clubs that encouraged more people to take part in orienteering, has a proven track record of working with schools, local authorities and other community organisations and has high standards of good practice, safety and governance. The top 3 clubs would get prizes and also go forward to the national sports club of the year awards. Previous winners have been WCH, OD and DVO.

Membership Structure - With the new membership structure it is strongly recommended that clubs advertise events at the higher rate with a discount for BOF members (to encourage folk to join BOF).

Completion of Courses - A reminder to anyone who has attended a 1^{st} for Sport level 2 Coach training course, that they have 2 years to complete the assessment. Please complete your tasks and if you need advice please contact your tutor.

Over 35 Competition - Following the discussion with the BOF Executives, Steve Bones of LOG had thought about how a more formal structure could be put in place for linking together local leagues / galoppens to create a national competition for over 35s. Ernie Williams took the proposal to Rules Group and though the proposal for linking together regional leagues was not accepted it was agreed that a new National competition for seniors should be created. The outline would be to include scoring from 5 Championship events, 3 specific National Events and 12 Regional events. This is still being looked at by the Rules Group. Steve Bones is also looking at whether it may be possible to merge EM and WM League.

Age Class in District Events - EMOA are looking in to the suggestion to show district event results by age classes. We hope to try this out using the computerised results at a forthcoming EMOA event.

Future Internationals - BOF has been asked informally to consider hosting a World Cup Race in 2009. Also, there are thoughts of possibly bidding to host the World Championships in the UK in conjunction with the Olympics.

Championships in 2007 - The East Midland Championships will be held at Longshaw, while the Midland Champs will be held at SMOC's event at Salcey. Both events are in the Autumn.

Status of Major Events in EMOA - Longshaw C2 is on schedule. No problems so far. In terms of Sprint Championships in 2009, NOC have negotiated potential access with Nottingham University for 9th May. So EMOA intend to submit this as part of the proposal with the Middle Champs in Grace Dieu to provide a Sprint / Middle distance race weekend. The potential C2 at Belvoir in 2010 is to be discussed with Belvoir Estate in early 2007. The Veteran's Home International in 2009 is still being discussed. Carsington has been suggested as a possible area. EMOA are willing to commit to this, but it may have to be early November.

Ancient Woodlands - Concern was expressed over the cancellation of the Annesley event as the Forestry Commission had designated a section in the centre of the wood as ancient woodlands. If this was the case it could impact many areas in the East Midlands (and possibly across the UK).

DVO Development Project - This is going well with continued development taking place. It has run for the first year of it's 3 year period. The only concern at present is that it is likely that funding after that will be difficult as Derbyshire Council have already indicated they will probably not provide further funding.

Missing Gadget Box - Has anyone who has been using the electronic punching equipment seen a small Tupperware type box which houses a number of gadgets to go with the equipment. The box included a couple of master stations and while one set of equipment still has the box with it, the second set of SI equipment has lost it's gadget box. Please can folk check to see if this has been placed in equipment stores or garages and contact Derek Gale if they find it.

Colour Coded Badges / Certificates - Have you claimed your colour coded certificate? You can claim your colour coded badge and certificate if you achieve the colour coded standard in 3 events (the standard is normally shown in the results). We are looking to ensure it is easier to claim your badges by making them available through club shops and nominated representatives in clubs. So all you should need to do is take along the 3 sets of results to the appropriate folk or shops to claim your badge. Look out for further details of contacts.

Lincolnshire Bomber - There have been a lot of good comments on the Lincolnshire Bomber weekend (on forums such as nopesport). The group of Swedes who came over really enjoyed it and want to come back next year. There is also a video on You Tube that proves how difficult a street event can be - http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=G9JUyul6fGU.

Level 2 Coaches - From April all level 2 coaches who have the old BOF level 2 qualification must have an Emergency First Aid Award to go with it to continue as a level


2 coach.

National Forest

So what is the current state of the National Forest? Below is a map depicting the area planned to be covered by the National Forest with the dark green areas showing where woodland has been planted (already existed) as of Summer 2006. Towns are shown in grey. The M1 is the major road on right of map, Burton-on-Trent is the major town towards top left.



The National Forest continues to expand and a number of new plantations are underway. Two new areas near Swepstone - Church View and Wynn's Woods comprises of 100 acres of new woodland, and Tempe Farm (140 acres), which also links to a further 37 acres called Gilwiskaw Wood. There is a further 60 acre plantation near Bagworth which is already planned to have orienteering included as part of it's designation. There is also a new area near Coton in the Elms in Derbyshire which is 35 acres of plantation. In total there is around 450 acres of plantation around Coton in the Elms. However, there are unlikely to be funds for further developments in 2007. The National Forest Trophy is taking place on March 25th. This is deliberately not a part of the EMOA league to allow the more athletic to have a go at the 15k long O without impacting on their league performance. The event is heavily subsidised by the National Forest Company as part of

their 10th anniversary celebrations and is being widely advertised in the press and on the radio. The event includes the long -O, normal C4 SI courses of red, light green, green and blue courses. Alongside this operating from a separate start is to be a come and try it offering junior courses with a coaching team and displays on hand to try and 'capture' new orienteers. Given the unusual nature of the event entry costs have been sponsored and are therefore much reduced and as such no further BOF members' reduction is on offer.

Controllers Corner

It has been suggested that not all controllers get all the information they need. The EMOA Committee have therefore asked me to include a regular Controllers Corner in EMEWS where changes to the rules can be highlighted. It was felt that controllers and non-controllers would find this section useful. I know I cannot always remembers one of the updates and have missed at least one while controlling Sherwood Pines. So I hope you find the following section useful.

There have been questions on who appoints controllers and what level of experience they require. The following table hopefully assists:

Level of Event	Responsible for appointment	Experience required
1	BOF Rules Group (delegated to major events co-ordinator)	Grade 1 controller - The Controller shall be a member of a different Association from that of the Organiser and the Planner(s)
2	Association (BOF Rules Group to approve (delegated to major events co-ordinator)	Grade 1 or experienced Grade 2 controller. The Controller shall be a member of a different club from that of the Organiser and the Planner(s)
3	Club	Grade 2 Controller. The Controller shall be from a different club from tha of the Organiser and Planner(s)
4	Club	Grade 3 Controller. The Controller should be a member of a different club from the Organiser and Planner(s)
5	Club	Controller not necessarily require, but club may consider one should be appointed to check and advise as necessary. If not a formally qualified Controller, then the official appointed should have organised and planned several events at level 5.

Notes:

Any deviation from the above should be authorised as follows:

Level 1 and 2 events: With the agreement of the major Events Co-ordinator. Note that it would be preferable to appoint a Grade 1 Controller from the same region than a lesser qualified Controller from another region.

Level 3 events: With the agreement of the Regional Rules Group representative. Note that it would be preferable to appoint a Grade 2 controller from the same club than a Grade 3 Controller from another club.

AN ORIENTEERING NEW YEAR RESOLUTION

At the start of a New Year, can I make a 'Resolution' for all Planners and Controllers within our Region - "I, (please insert name here) will make every effort in 2007 and beyond to keep to the British Orienteering Rules, Appendices and Guidelines for Technical Difficulty and Course Lengths, not forgetting that 100 metres of climb equates to 1 kilometre of length".

A number of orienteers have noticed what has been described, quite accurately, as 'course creep'! A simple hypothetical example is a Green course which has a length of 4.8 km and climb of 160 metres - simple maths gives an overall course length of 6.4 km. Throw in the variable of tough and testing terrain and you have the majority of competitors taking far too long and feeling not only disgruntled but also somewhat shattered by the time they reach the Finish, Download and the Car Park. You will also have competitors telling you why they have moved down to Light Green when Green is their preferred choice.

The table accompanying this 'New Year Resolution' - extracted from the British Orienteering Guideline A (available at a website

http://www.britishorienteering.org.uk/asp/homepage.asp familiar to most orienteers - if it isn't it ought to be! - click the 'Site Map' button and then click on 'BOF Event Guidelines' and then click on 'Event Guideline A: District Events - January 2007') - gives details of Course Colour, Technical Difficulty, Expected Time For Most Competitors (in minutes), Minimum and Maximum Lengths (in km), and Approximate Course Length Ratio (where M21L/Black equals 1.00) in the table given below:

and which also states the following:

'The time range shown is that expected for the majority of the competitors to complete the course. It would not be unusual for someone running below their normal colour to complete the course considerably faster. Similarly, someone may choose to run above their normal colour (e.g. for training) and take considerably longer than the time

shown.

The lengths of the courses needed to achieve the expected finishing times will vary greatly according to the physical and technical difficulty of the terrain. The lengths shown are intended as a guide. For easy areas the course lengths will be towards the top end of the range. For difficult or more physical areas the course lengths will be towards the bottom end of the range.

Whilst at the British Orienteering website why not also have a look at Rules 'Appendix B: Course Planning' as pages B9 and B10 are detailed tables about 'Technical Difficulty 1 to 5'.

If we go back to our hypothetical Green Course of 6.4 km then most of the competitors – I always discard the top and bottom two or three to determine the 'the host that makes up the most' – should finish between 45 and 75 minutes. If 'most of the competitors' finish within a band of, for example, 55 to 105 minutes, then however much the course adhered to TD5 the course was too long and physically too hard!

It only remains for me to wish you 'Good Luck' with your orienteering this year and may your chosen course be well within the Rules, the Appendices and the Guidelines.

Out and About - Fineshade Woods

The LEI District Event on March 4th is to take place at Fineshade Woods, near Corby. Fineshade Wood is an ancient mixed broadleaf and conifer woodland. It contains rich semi-natural native woodland, as well as areas of conifers that are gradually being restored to site-native broadleaf woodland under the 'Ancient Woodland Project'. The wood was coppiced for many centuries, and the remnant coppice banks can still be seen. The coppice was used in the past for charcoal making, and there is evidence of medieval and roman iron smelting in the wood.

One of the things to look out for at Fineshade is the Red Kite. It is a rare majestic bird that was until recently extinct from England. Thanks to an ambitious and successful reintroduction programme by English Nature, RSPB and the Forestry Commission, Red Kites can again be seen in the sky above Rockingham Forest in the East Midlands. The bird has a wing span of 1.7m, with distinctive rusty red plumage. The birds pair for life, rearing two to three chicks each spring. Last year 42 chicks fledged from 20 nests. The Red Kites @ Rockingham Centre is housed in the old barn on the edge of Fineshade Wood. The centre, which is open daily between March until September, gives visitors an opportunity to view video highlights of the Red Kites on the nest, and speak to RSPB and Forestry Commission Rangers about the kites.

Fineshade is part of Rockingham Forest which is a medieval hunting forest. It covers an area of some 200 square miles in North-East Northamptonshire, lying between the Rivers Welland and Nene and the towns of Stamford and Kettering. The forest has been inhabited since the Iron Age and since that time there has been a general progression of woodland clearance and conversion to arable and pastoral land. It was following the Norman Conquest that the area was designated a royal hunting ground for William the Conqueror and was given the title of Rockingham forest. The term 'Forest' represented an area of legal jurisdiction relating to the King's hunting preserves rather than an area of continuous woodland. The name of Rockingham came from the castle nearby, though it was sub-divided in to 3 administrative areas of Rockingham, Brigstock and Kings Cliffe.

Charles I saw the Forest as an opportunity to raise funds for the royal coffers and, as well as selling off further tracts of woodland, he resorted to rigorous enforcement of the forest law and fines. In 1639 Charles extended the Forest boundaries far beyond those set in 1299. This action was intended to force the major landowners into paying for disafforestation but following intense protests the king gave up his attempt to maintain forest law. A final perambulation was made in 1641 and this time the boundaries reverted to being even smaller than the 1299 levels as a result of newly disafforested land.

The Forest continued to benefit from varying degrees of royal ownership and laws until its final dissolution at the beginning of the 19th century.

During the remainder of the 20th century the Forestry Commission carried out further clearance and replanting, mainly with Norway Spruce. When the Spruce suffered large scale die-back in the 1980s and 1990s Forest Enterprise carried out a policy review and decided to concentrate on the restoration of native woodland. The Ancient Woodland Project was launched in March 2000 and involves the removal of conifer plantations and the restoration of semi-natural woodland with species such as Ash, Oak and Field Maple.



Just North of Fineshade is the village of Duddington. Duddington was recorded as Dodintone in the Domesday Book. The village stands on a low terrace above the River Welland. The green in the centre of the village was originally much larger, extending south as far as the Manor House and west to St Mary's Church. The Manor House has belonged to the Jackson family since it was built in the late 17th Century, and extended during the 18th and 19th Centuries.


