EMOA Committee Meeting Report - March 19th 2007

Apologies - It seems like the EMOA committee is very international as we had 3 apologies for being out of the country. Ian Whitehead in Pakistan, Ranald MacDonald in New Zealand and Mike Gardner in the US (which means the report is rather shorter than usual).

Secretary - We have now had a volunteer for EMOA secretary and Julie Lord of NOC is appointed to this role.

Ancient Woodlands - In the last issue, concern was expressed about the designation of a large part of Annesley Woodlands as an "ancient wooddland" and a consequential loss of access. After further discussions with the Forestry Commission, this blanket objection has now been withdrawn and events can go ahead, subject to the usual permissions.

Management Committee - BOF Liability Insurance - It has been confirmed with the brokers that non-BOF members are currently not covered under the British Orienteering liability insurance cover, but for an additional charge of £1 for senior non-members and 50p for junior non-members each time they run, they could be covered under the British Orienteering insurance policy, on the condition that the event organising team sent a list of all non-member names and addresses to the British Orienteering National Office for filing in the event of a claim. There was a discussion about how the events would generate the £1 for each senior non-member and 50p for each junior non-member and it was decided that it would best be left to the club putting on the event to decide but that the National Office would provide a few options and a recommendation. The importance of making clubs aware of these insurance implications was noted.

National Forest Trophy

The President and Officers of Leicestershire Orienteering Club having reviewed the results from the National Forest Trophy Competition held at Ratby Woodlands on 25th May have awarded the National Forest Trophy to Mairead Rocke (W16) LEI for her exceptional performance on The 15Km Long O Course. We also noted outstanding performances by Andrew Llewellyn (M20) NOC on the Blue Course. and Harriet Lawson (W12) DVO on the Light Green Course. It is hoped to make the presentation of the trophy and commemorative T shirts at the Bradgate Orienteering Event on Saturday 21st April. - Chris Phillips (Chairman - LEI)



Views and recent news from Ernie Williams, the EMOA Representative on British Orienteering's Rules Group.

As Barry Elkington (OD) the Chair of Rules Group is finding out by writing the Event Officials Page in British Orienteering's 'FOCUS', I am finding the same - give information about Rules, Appendices and Guidelines and responses are made that can lead to changes in the way that our sport is organised, planned and controlled!

In response to the EMEWS article on course planning standards, Dai Bedwell (DVO) made the following comments and suggestion re Technical Difficulty 1 and Decision Points:

"Now it has been a little while since I've planned a full C4 (must do one soon) so I was interested to read Ernie's article and see how the rules have evolved slightly over the years. One issue that Ernie didn't cover and I know has always been contentious is just what constitutes TD1, i.e. the White standard course? This is generally interpreted as a control on every decision point such as a path junction or where some other handrail such as a stream or wall leaves the path. Ideally on a white course the kite is placed so as to help the competitor along the correct new handrail towards the next control. However, this rule does not seem to extend as far as leaving the path to follow a series of tapes or streamers through the forest. I would have thought that a change of handrail constituted a decision point and as such there ought to be controls at the start and end of taped routes? This is rarely the case.

I know that taped sections are often only put in relatively late in the day when a planner/controller looks at a course and decides it isn't as easy as it might have appeared from the comfort of the armchair, but I know that coupled with the issue that the tapes aren't on the map, taped sections often lead to confusion for younger competitors. Planners and controllers, can we treat the starts and ends of taped sections as decision points, please?"

Dai's comments were raised at the most recent meeting of Rules Group and Barry Elkington has responded by saying:

"I agree with this - I don't see how you can manage without a control at the start and end of a taped route through the forest." Planners please note!

Steve Bones (LOG) commented on the flourishing branch of the sport - City Races:

"At the moment these events are cropping up thick and fast and to say I'm really chuffed is an understatement, this is a fabulous extension to our sport, there is however an however! At the moment we don't seem to have any guidelines for said events. By this I mean how the event is registered (Lincoln in Jan was a C4, York in May is a C5S & Oxford in Nov is a O4S); also the format of the courses is still a bit vague. I think it is about time some guidelines were brought in so all these wonderful events were based on a similar structure. If all events are registered as say O4S (or one specifically for an Urban/City/Park - again another vague area! - race) then it will be

quite easy to flip through the fixtures and find them. Also if they have a standard 4 or 6 or 8 courses (say M/W Open, M/W Junior, M/W Vets & M/W Super Vets) we would all have a level playing field to run events by."

The general consensus at the moment is that as Sprint and City racing is evolving quite quickly there is no overall agreement on what constitutes the standard courses, or age groups, but with enthusiastic 'O' folk like Steve and Stewart Caithness - who made a presentation on City Races to the most recent meeting of British Orienteering Event Operations - I am sure that before too long a Guideline will be drafted which will then join the growing list of Event Guidelines. For example, the first drafts of Guidelines for the British Sprint Championships and the British Middle Distance Championships have been produced recently and are being reviewed by those already active in putting on events such as these. Also, it can be reported that Rules Group has begun the process of a complete review of all Appendices A to L of the Rules of Orienteering.

Dave Bennett (DVO) sent in a comment about the Event Guideline and fast terrain:

"I compared the Event Guideline to the Green course I planned for Allestree Park. This was 5.7k with 180m climb (=7.5k), and times excluding first and last three were 50 - 96 minutes.

I agree the course was too long, but by how much? If the distance was reduced to 5k, then I would expect the times to also reduce by a third, to 33 - 64 minutes, which is too short.

The guideline is clearly intended for more difficult terrain than Allestree Park. There is obviously a balance to be struck for runnable areas - perhaps 6k with times of 40 - 75 minutes for Allestree Park - but as a planner I would find it useful if the time/length guideline either gave greater ranges to allow for very runnable areas, or stated whether time or distance should be given precedence, or a balance of the two? In my planning I have tried to give precedence to times."

This was brought to the attention of Rules Group and received a positive reply from Barry Elkington:

"I will write something about this in the next edition of 'FOCUS'. In the Colour Coded table the range of course lengths are actual lengths, so the amount of climb helps to decide which end of the range the course should be. No climb = long end. Lots of climb = short end. The adjusted course length ratios only help to get the relative lengths right.

There is no real need to give precedence to length or times, except in very fast areas where the length should take precedence - but this only applies to really open parkland where you can run flat out at every control. What you find is that if you get the length right then the times are right. It sounds as though Allestree should have been 15% shorter at about 4.8 km which would have reduced the 50 - 96 minutes range to 42 - 81 minutes. This is then almost exactly what the Guideline gives for both length and time."

A matter that has been raised a number of times at Rules Group re appeals for setting aside or changing the rule about embargoed areas - this led to a lengthy discussion after which it was agreed to simplify the rule on embargoed areas as of the date of the meeting whereby all Level 1 Events such as British Championships (e.g. Elite, Individual, Relay, Night, Middle Distance and Sprint etc.) and the annual Jan Kjellstrom Orienteering Festival to have an event area embargo of 24 months and all Level 2 (National) and Level 3 (Regional) Events to have an event area embargo of 12 months, whilst Level 4 (District) and Level 5 (Local) Events will have no event area embargo. All Clubs within British Orienteering will be asked to respect this by not holding any events of any Level, including Level 5, on event areas within 12 months of a Level 2 or 3 Event and not within 24 months of a Level 1 Event. If there are any problems in complying with this then Clubs and Associations are asked to contact the Chair of Rules Group who, with the assistance of the members of Rules Group, will arbitrate on any such appeal.

All existing Guidelines have been revised for issue and use from 1st January 2007. The intention is to hold an annual review before the end of each year in the foreseeable future and initiate issue of any revised Guideline on or before 1st January annually. Rules Group has also begun the process of a complete review of all Appendices A to L of the Rules of Orienteering. Also, as reported to the EMOA Committee late last year, an A4 Event Assessment Form for Event Officials and Independent Assessors to complete is being drafted by Neil Crickmore of Southdown Orienteers following input from a number of Regions that included members of EMOA.

A number of items for the Agenda of the Rules Group meeting held on 17th March 2007 were put forward by our Regional Committee. I think that these particular items will serve to emphasise the fact that EMOA is playing and will continue to play a positive role in the administration and management of our sport.

Blank maps to be in start lanes at all events with pre-marked course maps - this was supported by Rules Group and is to be recommended to all Clubs who provide, at Level 4 and 5 events, pre-marked maps for competitors after the start line has been crossed. This equalises the provision of blank maps in start lanes at Level 1, 2 and 3 Events.

Map scales - it was agreed that major events need to provide specific age classes with 1:15000 scale maps in order to allow them to compete using a map scale that is standard at International Events. Clubs are encouraged to consider having one scale i.e. 1:10000 where this is deemed suitable for all competitors at Level 3 Events and below and that where an event has both map scales of 1:15000 and 1:10000 in use and where a course has a conflicting range of age classes both over and under the M/W45 bar then the scale should be 1:10000 for all rather than 1:15000 for all e.g. Course 5 at Regional Events has five age classes of M/W45 and over and two under M/W45 age classes of M21V and W21S so a 1:10000 map would be more appropriate.

New Annual National Competition for M/W35s and over allied to the formation of a Senior Competitions Group - this detailed proposal by myself was welcomed and is to be sent to Lyn West, Chair of Event Operations, who has been tasked to review orienteering fixtures and competitions for Senior's within the UK. Lyn is also forming a group of interested orienteers - I have already been asked to be a member of said group - initially discussing material by email but later to meet as a group that ultimately may lead to the formation of a Senior Competitions Group. Steve Bones is also working on a proposal regarding Galoppens and Regional Leagues.

Finally, it will come as no surprise to my readers that further entreaties will continue to be made to all Clubs and appointed Event Officials to adhere to the Rules, Appendices and Guidelines of our sport via 'FOCUS' and Regional Newsletters so here is my six pennyworth - "let us all pull together on this, bearing in mind that a stitch in time saves nine, that many hands make light work and that it's no good spoiling the ship for a ha'porth of tar!"

Out and About - Bramcote


The NOC Little John Relays are due to be held on Bramcote on July 1^{st} . As well as being a fun event, Bramcote is an interesting area itself.

Bramcote comprises of 2 areas, Bramcote Hills Park which was once part of the Bramcote Hills House Estate which dates back to the 19th century. The estate was owned by the Sherwin family and comprised of a large Manor House overlooking the parland and a walled garden on the western boundary. The Manor House was built in 1805 and was of late Georgian style with bay windows and a rendered frontage.



In 1809 the house passed into the Longden family and John Longden married Charlotte, the sister of the last of the line of the male Sherwins. They had a son John who later inherited the estate. He took on the Sherwin name and later married changing his name again and became heir to the Gregory family estate. The bringing together of the Sherwin and Gregory estates meant that the family was now extremely wealthy.

The names Sherwin and Gregory are still today synonymous with the Bramcote area and both the family crests are displayed at the entrance to the walled garden, having been relocated from their original position on the front elevation of Dairy Cottage.



The Prince of Wales visited the park on 22 May 1929 to exhibit his Royal farm stock in the cattle classes. Apparently the Prince was very complimentary about the park and woodland with a quote of "a more delightful outlook than that afforded by the thickly wooded park that rolled away on all sides it would be impossible to conceive".

Gregory moved from Bramcote Hills in the mid 19^{th} century and with no children the estate passed to his brother in law Henry Holden. Bramcote Hills remained in the Holden's family until 1937 when the last descendant died. In a family will from the 18^{th} century the estate's gardener was left 500 pounds (a significant sum at the time) and shows the feeling that the family had for the importance of their garden.

During his life John Sherwin Gregory was an extremely generous benefactor, he gave Bramcote Village its first school in 1836 and gave land for the new church. His sister (Frances Jane Longden) gave the almshouses at the top of Cow Lane in Bramcote in 1852. Longden Close near the Hemlockstone on Coventry Lane was named after her. His wife also provided a new school on Town Street, Bramcote in 1885.

The last private owners of the land at Bramcote Hills were Mr and Mrs Fitzherbert Wright the grandparents of Sarah Ferguson, Duchess of York, whose mother was born in Bramcote Village.

During World War II, Chilwell Ordnance Depot used the house as a rehabilitation centre for A.T.S. drivers. In 1950 the Council bought the building and estate and divided the property into two flats for employees. The house was demolished in the 1960's but it's footprint can still be seen in the middle of the area

Across Coventry Lane is Stapleford Hill and the Hemlock Stone. The area is red sandstone that was deposited during the Triassic period, over 200 million years ago. The upper part of the Hemlock Stone is heavily impregnated with barium sulphate, also known as barytes, a mineral which is resistant to weathering and thus created a

protective cap over the sandstone. It is even puzzling as to how the Hemlock Stone got it's name. While theories of witches using hemlock on the site sound great it is more likely to come from the Danes who settled in the Nottingham area, and the old Danish term of "hemmling" meaning a cover or overhang. There are many myths about the Hemlock Stone and one of the better ones is about a very pious monk in Lenton Priory who found he could not sleep and decided that the Devil must be near. He began praying as hard as he could and this woke the Devil who was asleep on the Stony Clous, near Sandiacre. In his anger the Devil threw a large piece of rock, aiming at the Priory, hoping to smash it, but his aim fell short and the stone lodged on Stapleford Hill.

So as you run around the area keep an eye out for the remains of evidence of the old estate and keep your head down to avoid the devil throwing stones!
