# EMOA Committee Meeting Report - Nov 19th 2007

Local Membership - It has been identified that if new members join as local members they get their first year free. When they are signed up at events the total membership can end up being free for the first year. However, if they try to join online at the BOF website then they have to pay the EMOA component at the standard rate. We encourage folk to get signed up at events. The aim is always once someone is a member they will rejoin in future years.

Non-BO members and insurance - There have been rumours that from next year non-BOF members will be required to pay an extra sum to cover insurance. At this stage there is no decision on this. BO officials are still discussing the situation with the insurance company.

**EM League** - The presentation for the 2007 EM League will be at the Calke Park event on February  $3^{rd}$ . The 2008 EM League has around 15 C4 scheduled events. It is therefore proposed to continue with 8 counting events next year.

Coaching Conference - EMOA will provide funds for reps from clubs to attend the National Coaching Conference in February. The exact amount will depend on number wanting to attend.

First Aid Course - A First Aid course has been arranged for EM coaches, but there are a few spaces left on it for others. It is a 2 day event on  $15^{th}$  Dec/Jan  $12^{th}$ 

New Event Structure - See under Controllers Corner.

Courses - There is a Grade 3 controllers course taking place at Groby Wed 26<sup>th</sup> Nov/Sat 29<sup>th-7</sup> attendees at present. There is to be a Planners course, again at Groby, on Wed 30<sup>th</sup> Jan / 3<sup>rd</sup> Feb. There will also be an Organisers course before Easter.

New Class - There is consideration being given to a new M85 class. If there are enough people then this will be added to the rules.

**Senior Competitions** - Ranald MacDonald will attend the new senior competitions group on behalf of EMOA which is about to be started.

Future Events - Clarification is still being sought as to whether the events EMOA are hosting in 2009 are the British Elite Sprint & Middle Distance Champs (i.e. for Elite competitors only) or the British Sprint & Middle Distance Champs. It is not clear at present.

**EMOA AGM** - The full minutes will follow shortly. The AGM was quorate. The committee were all re-elected. The budget presented at the AGM is produced separately in EMEWS.

**EMEWS** - It was agreed that Mike should wait until Longshaw on December  $9^{th}$  to distribute this EMEWS to keep costs down. The original plan had been to get out in November but we haven't yet got the AGM minutes available.

**Electronic Punching** - LOG have purchased their own SI kit (with a grant from the local authority). They would like to purchase an additional 10 boxes if EMOA are getting rid of any old ones. This would enable them to stage an event without having to contact others. It was agreed that if Derek Gale identified 10 boxes that these should be provided to LOG on a permanent loan.

In addition a proposal for LEI to have more kit so they can run all their local C5 events is under consideration. With our SI specialist not at the meeting it was felt Derek should put a proposal together for the January meeting.

Sport England Funding - Ongoing liaison between NOC and DVO and their respective local authorities has enabled them to be seen as a way to get sport in to the community. One of the aims of Sport England is to get sport out to communities and get people involved on a regular basis. They appear to be looking very favourably on a submission to provide funding for the setting up of satellite clubs in major conurbations. These satellite clubs would meet weekly and establish their own programme of small events, training and social activities. The central funding for a 3 year programme would come from Sport England with the aim being to establish 1 new club in Derbyshire and 1 new club in Nottinghamshire in the first year, and then 2 new clubs in each of the next 2 years. The clubs already have ideas where these will be. We have agreed to work on the proposal centrally so if LEI get get their local authority backing it may be possible to extend this approach to Leicestershire sometime inthe 3 year period. The councils and other bodies are expected to also provide some additional funding to show their support, so EMOA has agreed to put aside a sum to support this initiative. More details will be provided if, and when the proposal is moved forward.

**EMOA** Website - John Cooke of LEI is going to take over the running of the EMOA website.

Electronic EMEWS - One way we could keep costs down is by distributing EMEWS electronically. Mike does this today to a small number of folk. If anyone else would like to be included in the electronic distribution list (and not get a paper copy) let Mike know at the email address on front of EMEWS.

Committee Meetings - A reminder that any member can come and attend the committee meetings if they wish to do so (though they cannot vote). The meetings are held at Clifton Village Hall starting at 7:30pm and the schedule for the next 3 meetings is  $28^{th}$  Jan /  $31^{st}$  Mar /  $2^{nd}$  Jun.

#### EMOA PLANNER'S COURSE

Will be held at Groby College on Wed  $30^{th}$  Jan / Sat  $2^{nd}$  Feb. All new planners are welcomed. It is a great way to get in to planning. Please contact Ernie Williams (details at front) if wish to attend.

#### Controllers Corner - New Event Structure

Why is there a need for change to the event structure?

- o Too many poor quality Regional events
- o Too few local events
- o Too few district events
- o Too few middle and sprint races

The proposed new event structure would be a reduction from a 5 level structure to a 4 level structure: (note that in the following the words National and Regional in these event titles bear no relationship to the current National and Regional events):

- o Championship Events: including JK, BOCs and the 6 Area Champs inc North, Midlands, South, SOA, WOA, NIOA National Fixtures Group in consultation with Major Events Group has responsibility for authorising these events and results from these events will be included in the National Rankings. (Another possibility was whether a British Score Championships could be included at this level as well.) The British Sprint and Middle Distance Champs would also fit in here. A Grade 1 controller would be required for these events.
- o National Ranking Events: National Fixtures Group has responsibility for authorising these events. These would include all the multi-day events and 'major' weekend events like SINS, Twin Peaks, White Rose, etc. A Grade 2 controller would be required for these events.
- o Regional Events: Regional Fixtures Groups have responsibility for authorising these events and they would have the full range of colour coded courses from White to Black. These could be declared as "Ranking Events" by request of Regional Association / Organising Club though there still is discussion about the Ranking aspect of these events. A Grade 3 controller would be required.
- o Club Events (more meaningful than local events): Clubs have responsibility for coordinating and delivering these events and could be whatever the club wants to organise. The stress is on the importance of local Club Events in encouraging participation and progression, using all sorts of available areas close to cities, towns and villages, schools and sports centres, and including parks, small local woods and heathland. (No Controller required but Clubs should arrange for experienced orienteers to be available).

Championship Events will have an age class structure; the decision as to whether age classes are used at a National Ranking Event (e.g. for Regional Association Championships, multi-day events, etc.) would be made by the club staging the event and could be a mix of age class and colour coded. However competitors would be eligible for National Ranking points whichever course they ran, regardless of their eligibility within the age class competition.

In order to make the above work the National Ranking list process needs to be updated in order that all participants taking part in these events can be awarded ranking points - this applies to various event formats sprint, middle, colour coded etc.

To support this approach a new levy structure will be introduced based on the number of competitors rather than the class of the event. This will stop events registering as a C5 so as to pay a lower levy rate, but still being eligible for inclusion in the ranking lists.

Another intention is to create a single ranking list.

Implementation of this new event structure is planned for 2009.

# A Short History of Maps

What is a Map? - Something we use in nearly every orienteering event is a map. But what is a map and who produced the first maps? A map can be considered to be a graphic representation or scale model of spatial concepts. It is a means for conveying geographic information. Incorporated in a map is the understanding that it is a "snapshot" of an idea, a single picture, a selection of concepts from a constantly changing database of geographic information.

The oldest map? -. The oldest known maps are preserved on Babylonian clay tablets from about 2300 B.C. However, even before then in the Bronze Age, there are paintings in caves in the Alps which appear to depict fields and houses. Whether these were true representations of geography is doubtful. The Babylonians produced quite detailed town plans on clay tablets, these clearly show town walls, temples and open spaces. However, the science of cartography was considerably advanced in ancient Greece. The concept of a spherical Earth was well known among Greek philosophers by the time of Aristotle (ca. 350 B.C.) and has been accepted by all geographers since. Greek and Roman cartography reached a culmination with Claudius Ptolemaeus (Ptolemy, about A.D. 85-165). His "world map" depicted the Old World from about 60°N to 30°S latitudes. He wrote a monumental work, Guide to Geography (Geographike hyphygesis), which remained an authoritative reference on world geography until the Renaissance.

Medieval Maps -During the Medieval period, European maps were dominated by religious views. The **T-O map** was common. In this map format, Jerusalem was depicted at the centre and east was oriented toward the map top. Viking explorations in the North Atlantic gradually were incorporated into the world view beginning in the 12th century. Meanwhile, cartography developed along more practical and realistic lines in Arabic lands, including the Mediterranean region. All maps were, of course, drawn and illuminated by hand, which made the distribution of maps extremely limited.

Renaissance Maps - The invention of printing made maps much more widely available beginning in the 15th century. Maps were at first printed using carved wooden blocks. Printing with engraved copper plates appeared in the 16th century and continued to be the standard until photographic techniques were developed. Major advances in

cartography took place during the Age of Exploration in the 15th and 16th centuries. Map makers responded with navigation charts, which depicted coast lines, islands, rivers, harbours, and features of sailing interest. Compass lines and other navigation aids were included. Such maps were held in great value for economic, military, and diplomatic purposes, and so were often treated as national or commercial secrets-classified or proprietary maps.

The first whole world maps began to appear in the early 16th century, following voyages by Columbus and others to the New World. Gerardus Mercator of Flanders (Belgium) was the leading cartographer of the mid-16th century. He developed a cylindrical projection that is still widely used for navigation charts and global maps. He published a map of the world in 1569 based on this projection. Many other map projections were soon developed.

Modern Maps - Maps became increasingly accurate and factual during the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries with the application of scientific methods. Many countries undertook national mapping programs. Nonetheless, much of the world was poorly known until the widespread use of aerial photography following World War II. Modern cartography is based on a combination of ground observations and remote sensing.

# Country fairs

Leicestershire Orienteering Club has been building on its low key development activity. For several years a small faithful band have been putting on a terrain adventure and taster course at the Burbage Country fair each May. We have also done similar events at Fosse Meadows.

This year, these activities were scaled up significantly and we attempted to put on similar programmes at several more venues.

This was in conjunction with a major advertising programme with sponsorship from the National Forest Company encouraging novices to come and try it at the Ratby National Forest Trophy Event.

Our first actual fair event was at Burbage and followed the traditional pattern with a giant string course through the woods and long grass. We were allocated a corner in the marquee from which children could exit across the fields. Those successfully completing this were then encouraged to try out a short white or yellow course. Unfortunately the weather was rather inclement and the stall in the corner of the marquee gradually deteriorated as water dripped through onto the display. By lunchtime it was clear we weren't going to get many more takers but we persisted as the rain intensity increased. Our stock of pre-printed maps and loan compasses was very underutilised - maybe next year! Nevertheless there were over 60 runs on the string courses (quite a few in the rain) compared to 220 runs in 2006.

Our second invitation was to be at the Forestry Commission Sence Valley Park in July. An early reconnoitre showed that there were significant difficulties in putting on our traditional format, but we persisted. The white and yellow would have to be much longer as it was difficult to swim across the lake. The Forestry Commission gave permission to remove fences if we needed. On the morning of the event there was a not unexpected phone call from the organiser. The lake had risen overnight and the marquee floor was under water and event had been postponed until next August! This set off a series of phone calls to all helpers, hopefully they will be available next year!

Bosworth Battlefield has various weekend events, and the orienteering club was invited to put on a navigation section to complement the County Council's Walking Festival. Over 70 beginners got a real feel for the sport, on a surprisingly good day weather-wise for this summer, using a string course. A good number then went on to try the orange we had provided for families. Club officials again took down contact details. One very keen junior looked a very good prospect but unfortunately was from Essex! Perhaps we should have put her in touch with SOS.

Our fifth invitation of the season was to Watermead for the Leicester City festival. This took place on in good weather on Saturday 1st September and there were about 80 runs on the all-terrain courses (String to you and me). Over 30 groups involving 70 people moved on to taster courses, white and yellow standard. Leicestershire's ethnic mix was well represented and all those giving details were mailed with further information on training and events.

Events seem to get to get around a hundred takers but whether it makes a real difference to the club membership is still an open question. However it is improving our profile with the local authorities and increasing the population of people who know what orienteering is who may come back to the sport somewhere down the line.
