


EMOA Committee Meeting Report - Jan 28th 2008

EM Junior Squad Equipment - Some funding has been obtained from BOF to help purchase some additional equipment, such as banner and compasses to support the Junior Squad.

First Aid Course - EMOA hosted a Level 3 and above coaches 2 day first aid course in early January. The course was funded by BOF development funds and some income was generated by 'selling' 3 spare places to people outside EMOA (Nordic walking coaches). Once final costs are established it is hoped any final profits can be used to provide EMOA coaches funds to attend the BOF Coaching Conference.

BOF Coaching Conference - It was agreed that up to £50 would be provided from EMOA for each person who had already applied to attend the BOF Coaching Conference (and who had not got funding from other sources).

Survey of DVO National Event - It seems like the vast majority of folk had appreciated the event organization and courses for DVO's Longshaw event. This included surveying some competitors and reviewing Nopesport comments. People particularly appreciated the whistle check at the edge of the car park field.

2009 Major Events - The Sprint Championships are holding a site meeting in February to establish start/car park etc. The map is also in the process of being updated to sprint race specification. A controller is still required from BOF. The Middle distance championships are progressing and courses are being planned.

Belvoir National Event in 2010 - Verbal agreement has been reached with the estate to use the whole area, including the "gardens" nearer the house, The access fee is still being negotiated.

EMOA League - The 2007 results are available in EMEWS and the awards were presented at the DVO Calke Park event on 3rd February. A big thank you was given to Roger Williamson for all his work in running the League.

BOF Council - The BOF Council met for the final time recently (as it will be replaced by the new Board of Directors). Although no major decisions were taken a number of important points were covered:

- There will need to be changes to the memorandum and articles of BOF to cover Child Welfare policies. All clubs will also need to legally adopt these policies in to their constitutions. Therefore clubs may need to update their constitution to say it is subservient to the BOF Rules in this area.
- BOF are also introducing some further disciplinary policies and procedures which relate to paid officers of BOF and all volunteers.
- There is likely to be a proposal to increase membership fees at the AGM as the funding to BOF from other sources has been reduced. The proposal is to raise an

- extra £16,000pa and it is likely that individual BOF fees will go up from around £16.50 to £19pa.
- The BOF levy structure is also going to be changed. The aim is to encourage more local, low key events, so the proposal is that in future all orienteers (both junior and senior count the same current levies have different rates for juniors). Junior only events will pay no levy. Events with less than 75 competitors will pay no levy. Events with 75-250 competitors will pay £1.50 per competitor. Events with more than 250 competitors will pay a higher rate.
- There had been a lot of discussion about the need to pay 50p extra on insurance at events, or non-BOF members having to pay extra to cover insurance. This has been averted. However, the new rules state that everyone at an event needs to be registered to be insured. This includes helpers, but also anyone shadowing (or even a family group) needs to be registered before they go in to the forest. If they don't register they would not be insured. The importance of this can be recognized as at a recent EBOR event someone shadowing another competitor fell and broke their leg and the air ambulance had to be called. As they had been registered the insurance covered them.
- The new BOF website is up and running.
- Council are reviewing a Whole Sport Plan a five year plan for orienteering. This is still under development.
- As BOF moves to the model of a Board of Directors as opposed to Council, discussion took place on how the regional associations should be linked to the new Board. It may be that a Board member will be asked to "adopt" a region.
- The view of Council is that there needs to be more orienteers and that this needs to be developed through participant pathways. People need to see a clear path for them as they develop as orienteers. There is a lot of concern that today people develop through the colour coded structure, but then suddenly are confronted with age class structures as they move up the event hierarchy, and find this difficult. The event structure review has proposed moving to a 3 level hierarchy of events. The top level would be National competitions and would include the British, JK and Regional Champs. These would all be age related. The second level would be Standard and these events would be colour coded. The third level would be the equivalent of the C5 events today and would be colour coded (but only a limited selection). There is a feeling that membership don't like the change (certainly when DVO discussed this there was a very strong opposition to it) and Council feel there needs to be a good selling job done on it. This may be proposed to this years AGM.

Junior Competitions Group - A number of things came up from this group:

- There were a set of guidelines produced for better planning of White, Yellow and Orange courses. These should be available on the BOF website shortly and it is recommended that any new planners should read these.
- Clubs should be encouraged to make sure that colour coded times and badge times are clearly visible on their results.
- The Peter Palmer Relays are going to allow entries from regions / clubs together so that other orienteers who can't get a full team could compete. These teams would be non competitive, but it might allow, for instance, LEI and DVO to form a team and the juniors still get to experience the event.
- There have been a lot of debate on map scales for white and yellow courses. Some regions prefer 1:5000 for these courses. It is proposed to change the rules to make them say if appropriate these larger scales can be adopted for these courses.

Grade 3 Planners Course - A course was hosted by LEI at Groby Community College Leicester on Wednesday 30th January and Saturday 2nd February. The course provided planners with both theoretical and practical sessions and was led by Ernie Williams and Peter Hornsby.

National Forest - There are quite a few Permanent Orienteering Courses being set up in the National Forest at present.

EMEWS - It was agreed that Mike should distribute this EMEWS at Budby on February 10^{th} .

Electronic Punching - After discussion it was agreed that LEI could have an allocation of around 40 of the boxes and stakes for their Summer League. DVO and NOC did not feel it was essential to have a similar set at this stage.

EMOA Website - We are currently reviewing a new design for the EMOA website.

Expenses - A proposal was put forward for an increase in the travel rate for attendance at EMOA activities. The current rate is 25p per mile. It was agreed that for now the EMOA rate should continue to track the BOF volunteer rate which is still 25p.

Satellite Clubs - The proposal for satellite clubs is progressing and a meeting is due to take place in early February to progress this. The meeting will involve Sport England, Derbyshire County Council, Notts County Council, BOF, DVO and NOC. It is hoped that this should push everything forward and start getting the money in late March / early April so that the initial satellite club activity can et started. The initial club will be based in Buxton for DVO and Mansfield for NOC.

Electronic EMEWS - One way we could keep costs down is by distributing EMEWS electronically. Mike does this today to a small number of folk. If anyone else would like

to be included in the electronic distribution list (and not get a paper copy) let Mike know at the email address on front of EMEWS.

Committee Meetings - A reminder that any member can come and attend the EMOA committee meetings if they wish to do so (though they cannot vote). Next meetings are held at Clifton Village Hall starting at $7:30\,\mathrm{pm}$ on 31^st Mar / 2^nd Jun.


History of the Compass

In the last EMEWS I provided a brief history of the map. In this case I thought I would look at that other key item of the orienteer's kit bag, the compass.

Prior to the introduction of the compass, direction at sea was primarily determined by the position of celestial bodies. Navigation was supplemented in some places by the use of soundings. Difficulties arose where the sea was too deep for soundings and conditions were continually overcast or foggy. Thus the compass was not of the same utility everywhere. For example, the Arabs could generally rely on clear skies in navigating the Persian Gulf and the Indian Ocean (as well as the predictable nature of the monsoons). This may explain in part their relatively late adoption of the compass. Mariners in the relatively shallow Baltic made extensive use of soundings.

The find of an hematite artifact, fitted with a sighting mark and found in experiment as fully operational as a compass, has led the American astronomer John Carlson after radiocarbon dating to conclude that "the Olmec (a group in China) may have discovered and used the geomagnetic lodestone compass earlier than 1000 BC". Carlson suggests that the Olmecs may have used such devices for directional orientation of the dwellings of the living and the interments of the dead.

These initial devices in China were all based on a lodestone floating in water. By rubbing it on silk, the needle becomes magnetized and when placed in a straw and put in a puddle of water it becomes a compass. Over time these developed in to magnetising pieces of lodestone, a natural magnetic or, which provided basic north-south orientation. This was then replaced with a needle in the 6th century AD. Reports of Chinese sailors using this



early compass surfaced around the 12th Century, detailed in Zhu Yu's "P'ingchow Table Talk". It seems the Chinese did not develop to the dry compass. The first person recorded to have used the compass as a navigational aid was Zheng He (1371-1435), from the Yunnan province in China, who made seven ocean voyages between 1405 and 1433.

There are arguments about whether the Europeans independently developed the compass, or that via the Middle East the knowledge came from China. The first recorded instance of the compass being used in Europe occurred around

1190. This was similar to the early Chinese lodestone model, but by the end of the 13th century, the English had mounted a needle on a pin, the basis of the compass as understood today. Little was understood about the device and the superstitions of the time meant that some captains even believed that if their crew ate onions this would

impact upon the magnetism. The compass had a major impact on European trade. Before the 13th century the sailing season in the Mediterranean was restricted to April to October due to the need for clear skies to aid navigation. However, by 1290 the sailing season had been extended to start in late January/early February and run through to the end of December. It also enabled traffic to northern Europe to develop.

The familiar dry compass was invented in Europe around 1300. The true mariner's compass consists of three elements: A freely pivoting needle on a pin enclosed in a little box with a glass cover and a wind rose, whereby "the wind rose or compass card is attached to a magnetized needle in such a manner that when placed on a pivot in a box fastened in line with the keel of the ship the card would turn as the ship changed direction, indicating always what course the ship was on". While pivoting needles in glass boxes had already been described by the French scholar Peter Peregrinus in 1269, there is an inclination to honour tradition and credit Flavio Giojo, an Italian marine pilot from Amalfi with perfecting the sailor's compass by suspending its needle over a compass card, giving thus the compass its familiar appearance.

During the 15^{th} century it became apparent that the compass needle did not point to true north, but made an angle with the true meridian. In some sailings, such as by Columbus, it is known that mariners had their needles mounted askew to correct the variation.

By the 17th century, the needle was changed to become a parralelogram shape which was easier to mount upon the pin. In 1745 an Englishman, Gowin Knight, developed the Knight compass, an improvement in that the steel needle would retain its magnetization for longer periods of time. These compasses were adopted by the Royal Navy and copied in Germany.

In 1936 Tuomos Vohlonen invented the first successful portable liquid-filled compass designed for individual use. Modern hand-held navigational compasses use a magnetized needle or dial inside a fluid-filled (oil, kerosene, or alcohol is common) capsule; the fluid causes the needle to stop quickly rather than oscillate back and forth around magnetic



north. Most modern recreational and military compasses integrate a protractor with the compass, using a separate magnetized needle. In this design the rotating capsule containing the magnetized needle is fitted with orienteering lines and an outlined orienteering arrow, then mounted in a transparent base plate containing a direction-of-travel (DOT) indicator, for use in taking bearings directly from a map. So now you can go

and use your compass and know where the basic ideas came from!

Editorial

Firstly can I wish all East Midlands orienteers a happy 2008. There are plenty of developments going on in our sport, not least of which is the move towards more, smaller events. If orienteering is to continue to meet the requirements of bodies like Sport England we need to ensure that the sport does develop and that we can provide facilities to enable more C5 type events, available on a regular basis. Today many folk (especially kids) who take part in a sport do so on a regular basis. Orienteering is immediately at a disadvantage as it takes place in a locality on an occasional basis. Many folk therefore get involved in other sports and orienteering is only a secondary sport to them. The new proposed levies are a step in this direction. But this also needs a commitment from members in terms of manpower

However, the event changes proposed to take us to a 3 level fixture structure seem to me like they have not been thought through. Having only a very small number of events each year for age group competition seems to me to be stopping the regular, committed orienteers getting the events that keep them involved. The current district events and regional events become merged as colour coded events, so how do you know which are worth travelling to? In fact some events could nominate themselves as ranking events, which seems to take us back to the current structure (but not having age groups at these events). So at present we seem to expect more from our regular orienteers, but are providing a poorer event structure for those folk. What do others think? Is this the way we should be going?
