## EMOA Committee Meeting Report - Jul 28th 2008

East Midlands AGM – You will find the agenda available elsewhere in this issue. However, it was decided to try to encourage participation by holding the AGM at an event. The best venue seemed to be Kedleston Park, and while we could not get a room in the hall, we will have a tunnel tent set up for the AGM (in good weather we can sit outside). Please bring a suitable chair or stool if you wish to sit down. So the AGM will be held on Sunday September 7<sup>th</sup> at 10:30am.

Satellite Clubs - In last EMEWS the problems of signing off the document and what seemed to imply committing EMOA to possibly 21 years when the funding could be clawed back by Sport England had been highlighted as a problem. Following discussions with BO and Sport England a compromise was reached whereby it was pointed out that this was not a capital project so the claw back did not apply. The project is therefore going forward.

An advert has gone out for the Buxton hub position and so far one candidate has applied. There will need to be an interview of the candidate, but it was felt that the project would proceed, starting formally at the beginning of the next school term, though there will be some setting up work required before then. So far we are getting good support from the local councils and schools.

Treasurer's Report - As we get close to the year end Dave Bennett's accounts show that EMOA is making a slight surplus. Most of this is due to income from the Satellite Clubs project where no expenditure has yet occurred. In addition, both income from event levies and membership fees were up against the budgeted figures. This seems encouraging for orienteering in EMOA.

The meeting approved the initial purchase of some Junior Squad kit.

East Midlands Champs 2009 - NOC have formally agreed to host the East Midlands Champs in 2009 at their Clumber Park event on  $1^{st}$  February.

**Fixtures Review** - The following comments were made around some of the major events coming up in EMOA:

- 2009 CompassSport Cup NOC have agreed to use Sherwood Pines for the East Midlands first round of the CompassSport Cup.
- 2009 British Elite Sprint Championships / 2009 British Middle Distance Championships - The BO Event Committee have asked that these events be given a joint image wherever possible so folk see these as a weekend event.
- 2009 Compass Sport Cup and Trophy Final LEI Ratby? (18<sup>th</sup> Oct) Progressing as expected at this stage.
- 2009 Veteran Home Internationals DVO Longshaw and Eyam (14/15<sup>th</sup> Nov) -Everything on schedule.

- 2010 Midland Champs LEI Belvoir (21<sup>st</sup> Mar) using large area not previously used for around 30 years
- 2011 Compass Sport Cup and Trophy Final DVO (Now allocated as 16<sup>th</sup> October 2011)
- 2011 British Schools Orienteering Champs EMOA to host As NOC have now done this a few times recently and DVO have CompassSport Cup final at same time, it was suggested LEI may be best club to host this.
- 2013 Yvette Baker Trophy Final EMOA to host

East Midlands League - This years league seems to be progressing well. Clubs have been asked to nominate their events by the October meeting so that they can be included in next EMEWS for start of next year. With the new event structure it will be important to differentiate those events to be included in the EM League.

**Rules Group** – The group reviewed the new event structure as it works towards the implementation date of  $1^{st}$  January 2009. Events already in the process of being planned and organized are able to still use the old standards. The following is a summary of the new event structure:

Level 1 (National) events:- JK, British Championships (Sprint, Middle, Long, Night, Relay), Area Championships - Aimed at experienced orienteers. Organising club must agree to standards required at such events. Policed by Major Events Group (who may delegate requests for variations to the appropriate special interest Groups) - Extra ranking points.

Level 2 (Regional) events:- Serious competition. Not all the trappings of Championship events, but high standards for organisation and planning. Include sprints and city races as well as cross country. Co-ordinated by Fixtures Group. Ranking points can be gained on any course. Cross country will use colour-coded courses, but, for example, at events such as Regional Association Championships age classes can be allocated to a particular course. Probably about 100 such events per year.

Level 3 (Local) events:- The majority of previously Level 4 and 5 events. Handled by Clubs / Regional Associations.

JK relay - classes: The Elite Competitions Group (ECG) would like to decrease the number of laps in the JK Trophy from four to three. This would make it easier for clubs to get teams together, and be in line with the World Championships. To improve competition the ECG also suggested that the 120+ classes would remain, but could share courses and start times with the Trophy courses. These two suggestions were supported by Rules Group.

**Board Meeting** - The new Board of Directors had it's first full meeting and their minutes are available on the British Orienteering website. It fundamentally looks at the direction and financial management of British orienteering. Discussions took place on aligning budgets with Sport England requirements.

Rosliston National Forest Centre in Get Active Final – The National Lottery has a set of annual awards to find the best lottery funded projects as voted by the public. In the Sports Category "Get Active in the Forest" has reached the final 3 for which voting takes place until August 8<sup>th</sup>. This is a forestry centre in the National Forest which, as well as other facilities has provided a number of orienteering capabilities (a number of C5 events, permanent orienteering course, plus the recent South Derbyshire Open Championships and Primary "Sprint-O" championships were held there. **EMEWS** - It was agreed to have the next EMEWS out with information about the EMOA AGM. So we delayed publication until this was available.

Electronic EMEWS - One way we could keep costs down is by distributing EMEWS electronically. Mike does this today to a small number of folk. If anyone else would like to be included in the electronic distribution list (and not get a paper copy) let Mike know at the email address on front of EMEWS.

Committee Meetings - A reminder that any member can come and attend the EMOA committee meetings if they wish to do so (though they cannot vote). Next meetings will again be at Clifton Village Hall starting at 7:30pm on 6<sup>th</sup> October.

## EMOA World Champion

Congratulations to Liz Godfree of DVO for winning the Gold Medal at the World Masters Orienteering Champs in Portugal in W60 in the sprint race.

As ever with Sprint races a tight contest but Liz completed the 1.4km course in 13.22 so becoming World Champion.

There were also wins for other GB competitors including Elizabeth Brown (W90 Sprint and Long), Sarah Dunn (W40 Long), and James Crawford (M50 Sprint).

## Junior Inter Regional Championships - Jenny Evans

The Junior Inter Regional Championships (or JIRC's as they are known) are the main competition of the year for junior squads, and this year were held over the weekend of  $28^{th}/29^{th}$  June in the North East.

The East Midlands Squad went with high hopes of repeating last year's amazing 3<sup>rd</sup> place; the highest every achieved.

Feldom Ranges on the Saturday staged the individual event which has classes for W/M14-18. The event was done very professionally with commentary and a large warm up area. After much commotion trying to put up the tent eventually Ben Windsor showed all of us how it should be done.

With a long start block and the best runners off last, there was excitement all day as runners continuously came in knocking others off the top spots. There were some great results for East Midlands runners with Fiona Claxton grabbing 3<sup>rd</sup> on W16 and Peter Hodkinson 2<sup>nd</sup> on M18. Finally, on his JIRC's debut and after the efforts with the tent, Ben Windsor ran to an excellent 3<sup>rd</sup> place on M18. Other top 10 finishes came from Harriet Lawson, Mairead Rocke and Laura Evans. For the individual we finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in the girls and were lying 4<sup>th</sup> overall overnight. Also, at the prize giving top year M18 Matthew Wallace was given a t-shirt for competing in all 6 JIRC's right the way through M14-M18.

After being well fed and having a not so good night's sleep on the floor of a maths classroom in Richmond Grammar School, we set off to the relays which were being held on the army training area of Rossmede. The order in the relays is 16, 14, 18 and with short, fast courses on open army land there was excitement right through until the last leg.

Ours boys teams came in to claim  $16^{th}$ ,  $19^{th}$  and  $21^{st}$  positions which was great considering that there were lots of team members running in their first JIRC's.

In the girls it was extremely exciting with the teams getting 5<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> placings.

Overall EMJS came  $4^{th}$  in the relays and  $4^{th}$  overall behind North West, Scotland and Yorkshire. Although a place lower than last year, this is still really good and higher than many of our other previous performances.

This year we have received lots of funding from EMOA and therefore been able to have lots of training weekends and days. We all agree that this has been the main factor in our continuing success and would like to thank East Midlands Orienteering Association for their generosity. Finally, all the squad and coaches would like to thank Squad Leader Richard Robinson for all his hard work and congratulate him on his marriage to Amy.

# Out and About - Shining Cliff - Or Rock a Bye Baby

In November DVO are hosting their Badge Event at Shining Cliff Woods, one of the most technical areas in the East Midlands, so I thought a look at the history of the area was in order.

In medieval times "Schymynde-cliffe" was one of the seven royal parks within Duffield Frith and, as such, belonged to Edmund Crouchback, Earl of Lancaster. It was an estate within the manor of Alderwasley and in 1284 was given to William Foun who was given the job of maintaining the boundaries between the Pendleton and Peatpits Brooks. They

passed to Thomas Lowe by marriage in 1471 and in 1514 he was granted by Henry VIII the right to "empark and empale" his estate and enjoy "free warren" within it.

The woods also contain a waymarked trail for visitors featuring the remains of the "Betty Kenny Tree", an old Yew believed to be the source of the "Rock a Bye Baby"



nursery rhyme. Betty Kenny and her husband lived here in the 17th century in a huge yew tree said to be 2,000 years old. According to legend, a bough of the tree was hollowed out to form a cradle for their children, the probable origin of the nursery rhyme 'Rock-a-bye-baby.'

Shining Cliff has also been featured on BBC's East Midlands Today as the possible boundary

between the North and South of England. As you run past those ant hills keep an eye out for the ants as you may see some of the Hairy Northern Wood Ant (Formica lugubris). Measuring over one centimetre in length and with black and red markings, this ant is the largest of all the nation's ants, taking its name from the bushy hairs around its eyes. For good measure, it also spits formic acids if it takes offence. Shining Cliff is the furthest south they are known in the UK, so could be regarded as the dividing line between North and South.

Because the ants need to keep warm, they build their enormous cone shaped nests, made from millions of spruce and pine needles, with a southerly view to catch the rays of the sun. Worker ants then sunbathe before retreating inside the nest to keep eggs warm by releasing their body heat. But when forests become too dark and overgrown, the ants get chilled and are forced to flit to another location and began all over again. Now as part of a project to restore the woods, conifers are being removed to let the light flood in once again, boosting the wood ants' fortunes.

The cliffs of Shining Cliff are low gritstone.

At the bottom of the area are the old wire works. These were established in 1876 by the Johnson family. The company was run as Richard Johnson & Nephew, and at its peak the site employed over 500 people. Johnsons specialised in telegraph wires and fencing, also suspension cables – even putting in a tender for the Brooklyn Bridge's suspension wires. Richard Johnson & Nephew produced the telegraph cables laid underneath the English Channel during WW2 – they ran parallel to PLUTO, the fuel pipeline from Dungeness to Normandy. The suspension wires were steel, due to its tensile strength, but the wires for telegraphy were spun from copper, as it's a better conductor. The wire mills at Ambergate became "Bridon Ropes, Johnson & Nephew Wire Works Ltd." when Bridon took over in 1990 – wire-making ended in 1996, but Bridon continued using Ambergate as a storage and distribution centre until the end of the decade.

At the top of the area is Alderwasley Hall. This was owned by the Hurt family (most of you will pass the Hurt Arms on the A6 as you approach Shining Cliff, this was named after the family). The Hurts were great landowners, timber suppliers, wealthy lead merchants and iron manufacturers. They were also Magistrates, Justices of the Peace, and Lieutenants of the county, and held high rank in the Army when it was officered by purchase. The family is ranked among the chief gentry of Derbyshire. Marriage into similar families was all important.



Alderwasley Hall was mainly built in the 18<sup>th</sup> century and was the home of the Hurt family for many generations but is now a private school. The earliest holders of land hereabouts were the Le Fawnes, however there is no longer any trace of their ancestral home. When the Lowe family acquired the

Alderwasley Estate in 1471 a Tudor house was built, but this was mainly demolished and rebuilt by the present Regency structure.

In 1690 the Lowe Estate was transferred to the Hurt family of Dovedale by the marriage of Nicholas Hurt of Casterne to Elizabeth Lowe of Alderwasley. The Hurt family were ardent Royalists in the Civil War, with one member being killed at the battle of Gainsborough in 1643. They established an iron forge in the valley below in 1764 and a blast furnace at Morley Park near Heage in 1776. The vast Alderwasley Estate comprising of some 3,500 acres contains numerous ornamental trees and lakes.

The renowned Francis Hurt built a tower on Crich Stand in 1851 replacing the earlier structure of 1788, but which itself has now been replaced. In 1920 the Alderwasley Estate was broken up and the house then sold in 1930. The Hurt family retired back to Casterne Hall and for 44 years a preparatory school for Belmont was run at Alderwasley by the Benedictine Order. In 1974 the grade II listed Alderwasley Hall was taken over by the Honormead group of schools.

Alderwasley is also reputed to have been the site of an ancient battle. Killcroft Field opposite the school being named after the event, and this could also be an alternative explanation for nearby Bury Hill.

DVO are in the middle of revamping their website. The new design is available to view on the current site.


