JK 2009

East Midlands Orienteering Association has agreed to support the North East in putting on the JK in 2009. We have been asked to supply helpers for the starts on both the Saturday and Sunday events. Helpers will be eligible for a 25% discount on their entry fees by using a discount code when they enter. There are two starts to be manned each day but I have no other information at present. If anyone is interested in helping can they let me know by emailing me on dg.244@btinternet.com giving me the names of the helpers. I will provide the discount code and fit the names into the helpers lists as appropriate. If anyone has any special requirements can they ensure that this is in the email.

EMOA Committee Meeting Report - Dec 1st 2008

EMEWS Editor Change of Email - Just to make everyone aware my email address has changed to <u>mikegardvo@sky.com</u>.

International Committee Representation – John Palmer is being asked to continue in his role as International Committee representative for the East Midlands.

SportsCoach UK - SportsCoachUK approached BOF to participate in a pilot scheme for High Performance Coaches. Richard Robinson of NOC is participating. SportscoachUK will pay up to £1,000 of the costs and the Governing Body is requested to pay up to £500. It was agreed that EMOA would pay the contribution if British Orienteering could not.

Rules Group Report - Level 1 and Level 2 events in the new event structure would have appointed controllers. For level 3 events, controllers would be determined according to the event.

In the new structure clubs need to determine whether their events should be level 2 or level 3. Coordination within and between regions will be essential. Clubs need to be clear which courses are on offer at each event.

Colour coded certificates need to be awarded nationally, and not regionally to help those competing across regions.

It was agreed that those eligible to be EMOA or Midland Champions should be members of clubs within defined regions.

The new event levels are not compatible with the current Forestry Commission agreement. For now the old terminology will apply, and BOF are working towards a new agreement.

It is important to realise that the new event structure will require more level 2 controllers.

Next Years JK - EMOA is supporting the starts at the 2 main JK days. Derek Gale is coordinating this. Helpers will get 25% discount on entry fees.

Fixtures Review - The following comments were made around some of the major events coming up in EMOA:

- 2009 East Midland Champs NOC's event at Clumber Park on 1st February 2009.
- 2009 CompassSport Cup NOC are hosting at Sherwood Pines on 29th March.
- 2009 British Elite Sprint Championships / 2009 British Middle Distance Championships - University permission in place. Draft budget prepared. Final closing date for entries will be 27th April. For the Middle Race the map is progressing well, and car parking is being resolved.

- 2009 Compass Sport Cup and Trophy Final LEI Fineshade has now been confirmed as the venue.
- 2009 Veteran Home Internationals DVO Longshaw and Eyam (14/15th Nov) -Accommodation has now been resolved.
- 2009 Midland Champs is now WCH event on Dec 13th, not BOK National Event.
- 2010 Midland Champs LEI Belvoir (21st Mar) using large area not previously used for around 30 years
- 2011 Compass Sport Cup and Trophy Final DVO Allocated as 16th October
- 2011 British Schools Orienteering Champs EMOA to host
- 2013 Yvette Baker Trophy Final EMOA to host

Coaching Report - 800 participants have attended a Teaching Orienteering Part 1 course, and 150 participants have attended the Teaching Orienteering Part 2 course, since the new courses for teachers were introduced earlier this year.

There will be a Bridging course (two days) to the new UKCC Level 1 Coach accreditation on Jan 31^{st} and March 11^{th} on Cannock Chase for (a) those who assessed level 1 coaches and (b) those who did the current level 2 but did not complete the assessments

Map Group - Map registration is going electronic in 2009. The digital storage of maps is planned as a backup and archive.

National Forest - There is a move in Leicestershire for Charnwood Forest to be designated as a Regional Park.

Satellite Clubs - The Satellite Clubs project is so far proving very successful in Buxton. There is a committee meeting to learn much which will be of benefit to other projects. The Finances are going OK at this stage with EMOA contributing £200 per annum

EMOA Development Officer - We have still had no volunteer to take on the role of EMOA Development Officer. In order to move this forward a draft job description will be written.

Electronic Punching - The EMOA Committee agreed in principle to move towards 3 full sets of SI kit being available within the region. The cost will be £8,200, plus some additional kit for LOG. In the short term, the plan will be to move to 2 full sets of kit (cost of £4,400, plus supplement the existing LOG kit). The initial plan will be for LEI to have one set of kit, the other set to be shared between NOC and DVO. Discussions still need to take place on whether EMOA have a role regarding levy collection, insurance and replacement of kit, or whether these roles should be devolved with the kit to the clubs.

Committee Meetings - A reminder that any member can come and attend the EMOA committee meetings if they wish to do so (though they cannot vote). Next meetings will again be at Clifton Village Hall starting at 7:30pm on 2nd February 2009.

Out and About - Lincoln

Lincoln is to host another city race at the end of January, so I thought this month's out and about could cover the city of Lincoln. Then as you are sprinting round (or more likely as you look up between races) you can know a little of what is around you.

Lincoln began as a Roman town when the area was conquered by them and a fort built on the site in 48AD. However, by the late $1^{\rm st}$ century the area was pacified and the fort abandoned. However, a new town for retired soldiers was created on the site. The area was known as lindo (pool in the Celtic language), so the Romans called the new town Lindum colina which became corrupted in to Lincoln eventually. Lindum was an inland port and a walled town, laid out in a grid system which was most prosperous in the early $4^{\rm th}$ century AD. However, by the $5^{\rm th}$ century most of the town's inhabitants had fled and the Roman buildings gradually fell in to ruins.

The town revived in the 9th century when the Danes conquered the area. They created a network of fortified settlements called Burghs. Where possible they used old Roman towns as they already had sturdy walls. In the 10th century the town was captured by Alfred the Great's son but the Danish influence is still obvious in many street names. The Danish word for street was gata which was corrupted in to gate, hence the street names Danesgate, Thorngate and Clasketgate. Lincoln grew to a be a large important town with its own mint. Craftsmen made things like combs out of bone, and there are known to have been potters, blacksmiths, jewellers and shoe makers.

By the time of the Domesday book (1086) Lincoln probably had a population of around 6,000. By the standards of the time it was a large and important town. Even London only had 18,000 inhabitants. In 1068 William the Conqueror built a wooden castle to make sure the townspeople behaved themselves. He destroyed 166 houses to make way for it. In the 12th century it was replaced with stone. The keep of the castle was called Lucy Tower after Countess Lucy. The castle now houses one of only 4 remaining copies of the Magna Carta, as one of the original signatories was Hugh of Wells, Bishop of Lincoln.



In 1072 the Bishop moved his seat to Lincoln from Dorchester. He built a cathedral, which was completed in 1092. This first cathedral was severely damaged by an earthquake, which hit Lincoln in 1185. It was rebuilt after 1192. When completed, the central of the 3 spires is widely accepted to have succeeded the Great Pyramids of Egypt as the tallest building in the world. The central tower of the new cathedral collapsed in 1237. A new tower with a spire replaced it. The spire was completed in 1311. The cathedral is regarded as one of the finest medieval

buildings in Europe (and stood in for Westminster Abbey in the recent film, the Da Vinci Code).

The third main building around the Castle and Cathedral is the Bishop's Palace, which was one of the most important buildings in England at the time. It was built by the canonised bishop Hugh Of Lincoln, and the palace's East Hall range over a vaulted undercroft is the earliest example of a roofed domestic hall. The hall was modernised in the 1430s by Bishop William of Alnwick, but was sacked during the Civil war in 1648.

In the 12th and 13th centuries Lincoln's prosperity was based on wool. It was woven in the town and dyed. Much of the finished cloth was transported along the Witham then exported abroad. In Lincoln there were also the same craftsmen found in any medieval town such as butchers, bakers, brewers, carpenters, blacksmiths, potters and shoe makers.

In the 14th century Lincoln's prosperity declined. For one thing its wool trade faced increasing competition from abroad and also from other parts of England. Secondly it faced increasing competition from Boston and from the new port of Hull.

In the 16th century Lincoln declined further as west coast prospered with the trade to America, but the east coast stagnated. Henry VIII seized all the religious guild property in Lincoln and the spire of the cathedral collapsed in a storm, and many of the churches were closed as they were no longer needed. In the civil war the town changed hands many times, resulting in loss of many buildings. However, the town began to revive in the 17th century as trade picked up, though Lincoln still remained a small market town.

In the 18th century the Fossdyke was deepened, allowing larger ships to reach Lincoln, and communication improved further as turnpikes were built (the first toll roads?). The 19th century saw a rise in Lincoln's fortunes as it grew from around 7,000 people in 1801 (in the first census), but by 1900 the population was 50,000. Buildings like the Lawn Asylum were built (in 1820), and the streets were paved and lit by gas lights. The railway also reached Lincoln in 1846. Lincoln also changed from being a market down to an industrial town as engineering firms settled in the town, notably Clayton and Shuttleworth iron founders formed in 1842. Brewing and brick making also became synonymous with Lincoln.

In the 20^{th} century a typhoid epidemic killed 130 people in 1905, and this resulted in a piped water supply being turned on for the town in 1911. During the 1^{st} World War the first tank "Little Willie" was built in Lincoln, which now had both tank and aircraft factories.

So when running (sprinting?) round the streets of Lincoln you now have a little background to the city.
