

EMOA Committee Meeting Report - Apr 6th 2009

Shadowing of Juniors - This was discussed at Rules Group but after further discussion at the EMOA committee meeting it was felt that we need to encourage juniors and therefore the committee proposed the rules be changed to allow shadowing by parents after they had run in a competitive class. If this was not going to be allowed this should be stated in the event information.

EMOA report to Coaching Committee - **Hilary Palmer** - Coaching continues to be offered at local events and separate activity and coaching sessions by EM clubs and notable news re coaching is:

- The Buxton satellite club project has brought almost 60 new members to DVO and around 40 people attend the weekly activity /coaching sessions. Some are now entering events elsewhere in the county. A UKCCL1 coach course has started for some Buxton volunteer helpers.
- NOC held 2 awareness-raising 'Try orienteering' sessions in Ashfield and Mansfield last weekend with over 100 newcomers. Coaching was available and publicity for the new West Notts weekly activity satellite group was given out. The first session was held on Tuesday 17 March with a mix of ages and newcomers to the sport as well as some club members about a dozen attendees which was pleasing as Ashfield/Mansfield is a challenging location with low sports activity levels.
- LEI is part of the Clubmark clubs 'grow' project this spring 12 projects around England holding weekly activities for families and publicised through schools. There was so much demand in the LEI focus area that the sessions will be repeated for more newcomers after Easter.
- LOG has a new UKCCL1 coach from the Sheffield course (December 2008) and 5 EM members (3 from LEI, 1 each from DVO and LOG) have attended the recent UKCCL1 Bridging course.
- In summary, coaching has a much higher profile now in the EM clubs and is appreciated by the club members who attend.

East Midland Grants - A grant was provided to a LEI member to attend the BOF Coaching Conference.

Treasurer's Report - The treasurer's report shows a lot of money flowing around the accounts due to the satellite club projects. This does tend to distort the rest of the account figures and makes them a little more difficult to read. It may be worth considering whether we can propose a way to present the accounts so we can see the "normal" activity separately from the satellite club activity.

There are likely to be an increase in some costs. The Junior Inter-Regionals are in Northern Ireland this year, and while everything is being done to keep costs down, the costs are likely to be higher than previous years.

EMEWS Distribution Costs – It was noted that 2nd class postage has gone up by around 20% in last few weeks. As postage is the major cost in distributing EMEWS discussion took place as to it's impact. EMEWS postage costs around £1,250p.a. on the budget so any way we can keep the costs down will allow us to keep subscriptions rates down. The committee discussed whether we should just make EMEWS available through the website, but it was felt that people would not read it if this was the case, and we wanted folk to be able to have easy access to the information to keep communication to members as open as possible.

Fixtures Review - The following comments were made around some of the major events coming up in EMOA:

- 2009 British Elite Sprint Championships Entries have already started coming in.
 Start and Finish more or less agreed, though still trying to get written permission
 from the University. Sports Hall will be available with toilets and showers.
 Catering is going to be available. Radio commentary/small PA will be used. There
 will be voucher prizes for winners of Sprint
- 2009 British Middle Distance Championships All Team Leaders have met to discuss things on site. Everything appears to be in place. There is a helpers meeting in April. The buses are all booked. Around 150 entries so far.
- Discussion took place on whether we had sufficient sportident kit to support the
 weekend, or whether we needed to get additional sets on loan. After discussion it
 was felt that while we may just about have enough it was better to be on the safe
 side and Derek Gale was going to approach SYO about borrowing around 40
 additional units.
- 2009 Compass Sport Cup and Trophy Final LEI Fineshade confirmed..
- 2009 Veteran Home Internationals DVO Longshaw and Eyam (14/15th Nov) Only problem appears to be cost of the accommodation and this is to be discussed
 with country leaders over next few weeks,
- 2009 Midland Champs is now WCH event on Dec 13th, not BOK National Event.
- 2010 Midland Champs LEI Belvoir (21st Mar) no additional comments.
- 2011 Compass Sport Cup and Trophy Final DVO Allocated as 16th October
- 2011 British Schools Orienteering Champs EMOA due to host, Scotland may want to host in 2011 so waiting for their input.
- 2013 Yvette Baker Trophy Final EMOA to host

EMOA League 2009 - Four events have now taken place for the EMOA League 2009. All seems to be going OK at present, though have lost the DVO Linacre event due to permission problems.

We will need to select the 2010 events well in advance, so clubs should be thinking of which events they are nominating as East Midlands league events.

Map Group - It was pointed out at Map Group that the British Orienteering license with the Ordnance Survey does not include Route Gadget and maps available from web sites. If clubs use those they need to get their own licenses from the OS. In addition it has been pointed out that all map should normally have acknowledgement to the OS on them. Even where they only used a PG plot, the acknowledgement is still pertinent to the OS.

Mapping Awards - The majority of the mapping awards have been delayed as due to the change in systems at British Orienteering it has been more difficult to register new maps. Clubs should still send them to BO so that the mapping group can review them for this year's awards.

ISO Mapping Spec - The ISO mapping spec is being reviewed for republishing in 2011, so if any mappers have any issues with the current issue can they let Mapping Group know.

International - It was pointed out that the structure of future squad structures is likely to change a little with the new Sports Plan Funding. Juniors used to be selected for summer tours and automatically be in the National Squad. In future, they will probably expect to remain in their Regional Squad and not automatically be considered part of the National Squad. Selection for races will still be based in the same way, selection races.

British Orienteering Board - Derek Gale has been in contact with the Board. After the re-organisation of the Council where each region had a rep, we were told that one of the BOF Board members would provide a focal point for each region. However, since the Board was created we have never been told who the EMOA Board representative is. This means it is difficult for us to put our views forward in the BO decision making process. Derek has asked who our Board rep is. The position is likely to change shortly as John Woodall is going to be one of the new BO Board members,

Satellite Club Project - We now have 2 satellite clubs in the region, Buxton and the new West Notts area (based at the West Notts College). It appears that the West Notts area is a little more challenging than Buxton as only have around a dozen people attending the sessions at present. Buxton is continuing well, and the sessions are being extended to include an early evening session for younger children (7-12 year olds), which will then be followed by a session for adults.

Electronic Punching - The 15 controls and stakes, plus 10 version 5 dibbers that were approved for LOG have been purchased and arrived. The elastic for the EM dibbers is in a poor state and it was agreed that Derek Gale should purchase a new set of 100 straps

at around £1.50 each. In addition, to try and prevent the loss of dibbers at events, it was agreed to purchase a secondary elastic loop as well.

The way we are starting to use the equipment is changing. We used to programme controls in competition mode, which meant they come to life at specified times. However, we are now moving to new versions of kit using SI-Config which means the controls are woken up once someone dibs them and they stay awake for a time period. This means less work in setting up an event. The problem is that the controls then maintain all the punch records, and at some time you need to clear the log. This can in particular impact safety check boxes when mapping with the start (it would also download all previous events as well). The plan is to purchase 3 purple clear backup ecards at £25 each, one for each gadget box and one spare. These can be used to clear boxes easily.

There are a number of things that folk need to be aware of in programming SI kit and the committee discussed whether we should have a regional SI conference for all those involved in using the kit to discuss how best to use it. One thing that could be discussed is a plan to ensure clubs use numbers from 101 onwards, and each club having a discrete set of numbers within this range. The advantage being that when brought together for a major event all numbers would be unique and no need to re-program.

Colour Coded Certificates - See article on separate page.

East Midlands AGM - The plan at this stage is to hold the AGM at the DVO event at Calke Park on 20th September. Further details will be in the next EMEWS. We will need a new Chairman and a new Treasurer as both have served their 3 year terms, so please consider volunteering for one of these posts.

Future Courses - We are planning to hold a Planners course soon in the East Midlands. We also plan to hold a Coaching course. Discussion took place whether we should do what some other regions do and choose a single venue on a specific date in the calendar in a single venue where we could host a number of different courses - Planners, Controllers, Coaching, Organiser, First Aid, etc. This would allow for a social function as the different groups could work together, use common facilities and share transport. Clubs are being asked for nominees for attending courses, and also for tutors.

BBC Filming - Hilary Palmer thanked LEI for providing access and maps of Wakerley at the last minute for some filming for a BBC show.

Committee Meetings - A reminder that any member can come and attend the EMOA committee meetings if they wish to do so (though they cannot vote). Next meetings will again be at Clifton Village Hall starting at 7:30pm on 1^{st} June, and the following meeting on 27^{th} July 2009.

It is hoped that members can collect these at club shops or at enquiries at most colour coded events in the East Midlands.

The intention is provide a clear incentive scheme for members to develop their levels of competition. You should be able to take the 3 sets of results showing where you have reached certificate time for the colour you want and exchange them for a certificate at the club shop or enquiries. Or contact your club in advance and they can arrange to have the certificate available for collection at an event.

National Forest Report



This has been a strange year for the National Forest. The tender scheme fell foul of EU rules and whilst a new scheme has now been introduced, the transitional period did not permit much new grant aid and as such not many new areas were created. There has also been a strategic review as the scheme is at the half way point in their 10 year plan. The new plans involve a reduced annual planting

rate, recognising that the next few years at least will be tough for forest creation. But against that, more will be done to connect woodlands, and this proactive approach will assist orienteering as pockets of woodland become 'joined up'. The National Forest is also diverting more of their funds to projects within the Forest to promote its use and benefits.

The key message is that they still have an ambitious Forest creation target of 200-250 hectacres a year (down from the original 400-500). This reflects a changing context which is likely to persist for some time given the financial situation. Green infrastructure around developments, small scale planting and high value connectivity between woodlands will become more significant. This more targeted approach can improve the potential for some existing orienteering areas for example some new small blacks have made it practical to now include the Saltersford Valley lakes and picnic areas with the adjoining Donisthorpe Woodland Park.

Amongst the specific targets within the new documents is the provision of a Permanent Orienteering Course within 5km of all larger settlements within the Forest. Funds are available for this work and if DVO or LEI wish to put together projects to use these facilities for say school or satellite club promotion, it will be worth applying for a grant.

Rules Group Meeting - 7th March 2009

Event Guidelines and Rules - Following complete revision of the Event Guidelines and new Event Rules, arrangements are being made to make them available on the BO website at the end of June, for full implementation on 1^{st} January 2010. There should be a four page summary of the Rules made available for members shortly.

Rules Group made a number of recommendations based on the new event structure -

All events need to be defined by the quality of the competition not the available facilities.

Level 1 events shall be controlled by a Grade 1 controller, appointed by the Major Events Groups and that Level 2 events shall be controlled by a Grade 2 controller or a Grade 3 controller with a Grade 2 Adviser/Member to be agreed by the Regional Association

All participation events at level 3 need to be 'signed off' by a controller with at least a Grade 2 qualification as meeting British Orienteering requirements re permissions, risk assessments and health and safety, and that a Grade 2 controller may be appointed if deemed necessary by the host club

There is an urgent need for C2 courses to be held annually at Regional Association level for current Grade 3 controllers wishing to be formally trained and gaining a Grade 2

controller qualification, together with Organiser3, Planner3 and Controller3 courses to be held as often as is deemed necessary by Regional Associations or Clubs

A list of events to be made available that contains those events that shall publish details of the area(s) to be embargoed for either 12 or 24 months prior to the competition; if an event is not on the list then it is to be accepted that there shall be no need for an embargo of an area or areas

All regional associations, working with their constituent clubs, shall endeavour to have, or average, between ten and fifteen level 2 events in their annual Fixtures List that provide quality competition (e.g. a Regional series of League/Galoppen events, Regional Long Distance, Middle Distance and Sprint Events including Championships, Multi-Day Events lasting between 2 and 7 days, etc. There is an expectation that all of these events will be Ranking Events and have a reasonable level of facilities including good pre-event publicity, appropriately qualified organisers, planners and controllers, suitable parking and assembly areas, pre-marked maps, electronic timing, toilets, a fast results service, etc.

All level 1 and 2 events shall be Raking Events linked to the proposed Single Ranking Scheme and be part of the Colour Coded and Championship and National Badge incentive scheme

Club Conference on Rules – It was recommended by Rules Group that a Club Conference is arranged in autumn 2009 in order that a clear presentation be made to those attending of what happened regarding the new Event Structure and Rules, Appendices, Event Rules and Guidelines to the date of the conference and what is scheduled to happen by 1st January 2010.

Refund of Entry fees - It was agreed that any refund of entry fees following cancellation of an event shall be at the discretion of the organiser.

Controller of Controllers - The Rules Group felt there is a need for the appointment of a controller of controllers at a national level, to ensure records of all controllers are maintained. In addition Rules Group wanted to encourage Clubs and Regions to appoint event officials co-ordinators, if they have not already done so, with one of the major tasks being the identification of members of suitable experience to attend Organiser3, Planner3 and Controller3 training courses, and to encourage members already qualified at Grade 3 to upgrade to Grade 2 and Grade 1 by attending the appropriate Courses and Conferences.

ICE

We all carry our mobile phones with names & numbers stored in its memory. If we were to be involved in an accident or were taken ill, the people attending us would have our mobile phone but wouldn't know who to call. Yes, there are hundreds of numbers stored, *but which one is the contact person in case of an emergency?* Hence this '*ICE*' (*I*n *C*ase of *E*mergency) campaign!

The concept of 'ICE' is catching on quickly. It is a method of contact during emergency situations. As mobile phones are carried by the majority of the population, all you need to do is store the number of a contact person (or persons) who should be contacted during emergency under the name '*ICE*' (*I*n *C*ase of *E*mergency).

The idea was thought up by a paramedic who found that when he went to the scenes of accidents there were always mobile phones with patients but they didn't know which number to call.

He therefore thought that it would be a good idea if there was a nationally recognised name for this purpose. In an emergency situation, Emergency Service personnel and hospital Staff would be able to quickly contact the right person by simply dialling the number you have stored as '*ICE*'.

For more than one contact name simply enter ICE1, ICE2 and ICE3 etc.



Course: One hour score event

Terrain: Steep woodland with open areas, areas of contour detail, many line features. Little undergrowth but can be slippery. Whistles must be carried.

Parking: At High Leas Farm, in an open field away from the road. Do not exceed 10mph on farm track. Parking fee £2. The parking fee will fund a new project to plant trees at Riber Hillside. From A6 at Cromford crossroads follow Mill Road/Lea Road for $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to Lea Bridge (SK318564) from where event will be signed.

Dogs not allowed on courses, and must be kept on lead in the car park as there will be sheep grazing.

Fixtures
