

MINUTES OF THE 46th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE EAST MIDLANDS ORIENTEERING ASSOCIATION HELD ON SUNDAY 19th September 2010 at Carsington Pastures at 10.35 am

- 2. Minutes of the 45th AGM. Agreed the minutes were a true record, proposed by Ranald Macdonald and seconded by Dorothy Woodall.

3. Chairman's Report (in absentia)

Overall the past year has been another successful one for the Association –a quick snapshot shows a large number and level of events from low-key local events to large-scale National Events, the distribution of the SportIdent equipment, further positive work on a commitment to the Satellite Clubs, support for the Junior Squad, regular publication of EMEWS to members, and the EMOA League continuing to attract hundreds of competitors throughout the year.

Thanks must go to Dave Bennett for continuing to keep our 'financial ship' afloat even though he had stood down as Treasurer at 2009 AGM and a very warm welcome and thanks to Viv Macdonald for taking on the role of Treasurer, overcoming en-route Barclays Bank and their unhelpful attitude in transferring our account to HSBC, and for her first Financial Report, not forgetting a 'Thank You' to Roger Edwards as the Association's independent Auditor.

Thanks to Derek Gale for his work over several years as Co-ordinator of the SI equipment and, due to his continued purchase and updating of SI kit on behalf of the Association, the opportunity this year of completely distributing to DVO, LEI, LOG and NOC every piece of the Association's SI equipment on 'permanent loan' to enable all of the Clubs to put all but the largest of events without recourse to 'borrowing' from another Club either inside or outside of our Region. I believe that the decision to start to purchase and use SI equipment has been a major success for the Association and all members of our constituent Clubs have been able to benefit.

Thanks to Hilary Palmer for her continuing work on Coaching and Training, and in developing a training system for Club Coaches that has to be the best within the National Federation. Thanks also go to Richard Robinson for all his work with the Junior Squad. It is because of the work of Hilary, Richard, Pauline and others that the Association is able to support young competitors from the East Midlands chosen to take part in Training Camps and represent the UK at the very top level of our sport both here and abroad.

Thanks to Pauline Olivant for her work on behalf of Clubs and individual members, especially for the work involved in the Satellite Clubs Project which is fully up and running, for without Pauline's initiative, drive and enthusiasm, together with that of her helpers, the project would not have been so successful.

There is also the co-ordination by Pauline of the very successful Training Day held in Autumn 2009 which enabled Clubs to have more qualified Coaches, Controllers, Planners and Organisers. The Association's Committee is fully in support of the organisation of another Training Day in the coming months. Following the lead of EMOA this method for 'in-house' training is now seen as the most effective way of undertaking the training of Event Officials at national level.

Mike Gardner continues to do sterling work on our behalf in editing the regular editions of EMEWS and, during the year, organised the change from printed posted copies to electronic copies of EMEWS being distributed to members by email. Like all editors Mike needs us to make a positive contribution

to the contents of EMEWS and if you can contribute an article or two please do so, the more the better – it is our regional magazine after all!

I previously mentioned the large number of Fixtures within the Region at all levels, particularly at a time when Officers and Club members had to cope with the implementation of the new Event Structure and the subsequent amendments to it at the 2010 National AGM. I have to take the opportunity at this point to remind members that in the spring of 2007, following an initial suggestion from Steve Bones of LOG that there should be a National League to stand alongside the Regional Leagues, that a Four Level Event Structure document written by myself was presented to the Officers of British Orienteering and to Rules Group on behalf of EMOA that literally kick started the Event Structure debate of changing from five Levels of Event to four and which, somehow in the midst of a flurry of documents, emails and meetings, was then changed to the three Level Event Structure that caused the tabling of the resolution at the 2010 AGM. I can only hope that the Event Structure that we now have in place is allowed to bed in and continue to provide successful competition and participation at all levels from Local to Championships.

Ian Whitehead, although fully employed in Pakistan, has continued to oversee events within our Region and has regularly updated the EMOA Fixtures List during the year and acted as the link between the Clubs in our Region and the National Fixtures Chairman Mike Cope and Fixtures Group. To help Ian and Mike, and to help ourselves, I believe that we need to ensure that there is very regular communication between the Fixtures Secretaries of our Clubs, particularly so that there is as good as can be co-ordination of events, especially of Levels 3 and 4. Whilst it is good to have such a range of events available throughout the year, it can be very frustrating to put a lot of work into an event and then discover that there is a clash with another event elsewhere within the Region. Ian does an excellent job at spotting and trying to minimise clashes but we need to help him and ourselves whenever we can. Ideally links with Clubs bordering our Region should also be encouraged, particularly as our position within the UK is such that we are literally surrounded by other Regions hosting events.

There is a Committee meeting scheduled post-AGM in mid October and there are already plans for the November meeting of the Association to have two main items on the Agenda – namely a review of Development Plans for the future and a complete review of the Association's financial structure and resources.

Finally, a 'Thank You' to all members of the EMOA Committee –they give their time, experience and enthusiasm to the task of ensuring that the Association is there to support the individual members, the Clubs and the work of the Board, Committees and Groups at national level – to use a well known phrase being much used at present – "We are all in this together!"

4. Secretary's Report including activity statistics.

5. Treasurer's Report and approval of Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Statement.

Copies of the report were circulated at the meeting.

John Woodall thanked Viv Macdonald for volunteering to become EMOA Treasurer earlier this year and looked forward to Viv having a further three years in office.

The year end income and expenditure report showed an income of £9,546 and expenditure of £7,969, giving a surplus of £1,577 for 2009/10 on the General Fund. For the satellite clubs project, the income had been £46,950, expenditure £34,618, giving a surplus to carry forward of £12,332. The Independent Financial Examiner had confirmed the income and expenditure account and the balance sheet were a true and fair statement of the finances of EMOA but raised questions about certain payments in terms of the constitution – it was agreed these would be discussed at the next Committee meeting.

Acceptance of the Report, balance sheet and income and expenditure statement was proposed by Derek Gale and seconded by Chris Smith .

Budget projections and Fixing of Charges

The draft budget for 2010/11 was circulated, together with a note showing the updated bank balances. The projections for the budget had been made based on current membership levels and event levies. The budget showed a projected surplus for the year of £212. The opening bank balance for the year was £24,867 but this had been reduced by a number of payments to £5,847. A final grant installment of £24,450 had been submitted to Sport England for the satellite club project, bringing the total grant to £61,850.

The EMOA budget as set out by Viv Macdonald to the meeting was proposed by John Woodall and seconded by Steve Green, and on taking a vote this was carried with one member voting against the proposal.

Viv Macdonald proposed no change to the fees and charges compared to the previous year. As all the SI equipment is now devolved to clubs there will be no levy for such equipment in the future by EMOA.

There was one counter proposal that there be no fees or charges in order to reduce the overall balance of the EMOA. EMOA will review the situation in November in the light of other development issues which may compete for the money in the future.

The fees and charges as set out by Viv Macdonald to the meeting was proposed by Bob Alderson and seconded by Hilary Palmer and on taking a vote this was carried with one member voting against the proposal.

11. Plans for the coming year (Chairman in absentia)

In the near future we have the first Midlands Middle Distance Championships taking place at Irchester and early next year the Regional Round of the CompassSport Cup and Trophy at Beacon Hill, followed by the East Midlands Championships at Cademan and Thringstone Woods, with all three being hosted by LEI, and in the autumn of 2011 DVO is hosting the Final of the CompassSport Cup and Trophy at Longshaw. Whilst 2012 may look relatively quiet where major events are concerned, there are major events scheduled in the National Fixtures List in 2013 in our Region - the CompassSport Cup and Trophy Regional Round in mid-February, the British Sprint Elite and Age Class Championships in late Spring, the British Schools Championships in mid-November and, at some point in the year, the Midlands Championships.

EMOA Committee Meeting Report - October 18th 2010

Club Coaches - Hilary Palmer asked club reps to chase up their coaches to ensure they continue to meet all the required qualifications (e.g. first aid).

Forestry Commission - The Government has announced that they are investigating the possible sell off of some Forestry Commission land to private landlords. This is of great concern as it potentially means unless access for orienteering is included in the terms of the sell off we may lose access. However, there are also concerns about the terms of the new Forestry Commission agreement which could add major costs to events. This is still under negotiation with British Orienteering.

EMOA Constitution - It was proposed that the EMOA Constitution should be reviewed as it did not reflect some of the current spending plans.

Treasurer's Report - The spending on satellite clubs continues, but still awaiting a further sum from Sport England, which if not available soon may cause the coaches to need to be put on notice.

AGM Arrangements - Next year we need to make sure that if the AGM is organised at an event someone is nominated to bring along a tent.

Future Events - The following future events are planned for the Region:

- 16th November 2011 Compass Sport Cup Final Planned for Longshaw. National Trust being very supportive. Parking and assembly secured.
- 2013 DVO will host. Venue still to be decided.
- 2013 British Sprint Champs LEI now to propose a date. OD have declined the option to host the British Middle Distance Champs the same weekend
- 2013 Yvette Baker Trophy Final LOG are going to host this event.
- 2013 Midland Champs will be in Sherwood Forest in January or early February.

EM League - 2010 all going well. It was agreed that all EM League in 2011 should be at new level C. We may also want to introduce a Short Green course in the League. Clubs have been asked to consider this.

Coaching - An additional Coaching Committee meeting was called about funding and staffing issues. The post of Director of Coaching was to be removed. In addition there are likely to be further funding reductions from Sport England which will result in the need to find further savings.

There is still funding for coach development/training for clubs, in line with the 'Community O' targets. It is hoped once the impact of Government funding cuts is fully understood, that a post of 'Volunteer Manager' may be created to co=ordinate volunteer coaches, mappers and event officials.

National Forest - Despite the Government funding cuts the website states "it is to continue in its current form".

British Orienteering Board - The main items on the agenda were the finance and restructuring issues (see Coaching), the Forestry Commission agreement, submission of a bid to host the World Orienteering Champs in 2015 and a review of Events Committee and Group Governance.

Satellite Clubs - Buxton is now firmly established with no external coach support. Four clubs are in the 'middle' phase with some coaching support. The main problem area is Derby which may need another kick-start in 2011.

Electronic Punching - All of the equipment has been purchased and distributed to clubs. This will now not be covered in EMOA Meetings.

East Midlands Development Day - Clifton Campus has now been booked for the day on 11^{th} December. The map is being updated to sprint standards. Please contact your club if you wish to attend any of the sessions.

EM Junior Squad - There is a need to have representation from the Junior Squad on the EM Committee and include it as an agenda item. Regional squads are no longer financially supported by British Orienteering, so will need to come through East Midlands in the future.

EMOA Committee Meetings - A reminder that any member can come and attend the EMOA committee meetings if they wish to do so (though they cannot vote). Next meetings will again be at Clifton Village Hall starting at 7:30pm on 29th November (concentrating on development issues) and then 24th January and 28th March in 2011.

Report by Ernie Williams to the EMOA membership on the meeting of Rules Group in Birmingham on Saturday 23rd October 2010.

The role, training and accreditation of Controllers and other Event Officials: A very lengthy discussion took place the role, training and accreditation of Controllers. Helen Errington (British Orienteering Event Manager) has compiled from British Orienteering database records a Register of Grade 1 Controller appointments at Major Event level from 2000 to 2009 and, following a review of all those listed, had sixty wishing to be 'Licensed' for the period 2011-2013.

Updated lists already supplied by Rules Group members on behalf of Regional Associations will allow Helen to produce a Register of Grade 2 and Grade 3 Controllers who will also be 'Licensed' for the same period. Information on 2010 Event Officials is still to be inserted into the Registers.

Association Representatives, Co-ordinators of Controllers and Club Fixtures Secretaries, together with individual members, will need to access the database to check accuracy of personal records on the Registers by using their username and password. There is an expectation that all Regions will review the Licensed Controllers each year at April/May.

Helen Errington is also planning to set up Registers of 'Three Year Licensed' Organisers and Planners who, like Controllers, will have to re-apply for 'Licensing' every three years. It is also an expectation, particularly by British Orienteering's Insurers, that in future only licensed Organisers shall be named when Events at all four Tiers are registered with British Orienteering. At Tier D (Local Events) novice Organisers will require mentoring by a Licensed Controller and all Organisers will also be expected to undertake suitable training modules for Event Organisation and Event Safety. There is also an expectation that all Club Fixtures Secretaries will provide up-to-date information on Organisers and Planners of past events as when requested to do so.

It was also agreed that there is a need at Board and Event Committee level to clearly explain to all members of British Orienteering the reasons why the information on the database and in Club records will be required and used in connection with the licensing of all Event Officials in 2011 and beyond.

Helen Errington, with the assistance of Katy Stubbs and Hilary Palmer and others, will be rolling out, from November 2010 and throughout 2011 and beyond, Training Modules in Event Safety throughout the UK, which will require attendance for half a day on a Saturday by all newly Licensed and prospective Licensed Event Officials in order that, by 2014, it can be guaranteed that all Event Officials will be fully trained and licensed. Some Regional Representatives expressed the hope that some of the courses could be conducted on a mid-week evening rather than on a Saturday. It is also hoped that all Event Officials will be able to develop and have as a record a 'Portfolio of Skills' related to various aspects of orienteering organisation and administration.

Distribution of 2011 BOF Rules:

Discussion centred on the expense likely to be incurred if the 2011 Rules were to be printed and distributed to all members of British Orienteering or to a more limited number such as registered Controllers of all Grades. Helen Errington indicated that she had discussed the distribution of the Rules with Chief Executive Mike Hamilton and there was the possibility of funds being made available. It was agreed that the 2011 Rules, produced to be in line with the new '4 Tier Event Structure', should not require changing in the next two to three years, with a review in one or two years after publication. It was recommended that in the event of the Rules not being distributed to every member, then an A5/four page 'Summary of 2011 Rules for Orienteering Competitors' be prepared and distributed with 'FOCUS' and also made available from National office upon request.

The discussion on this Agenda item concluded with a request from Association Representatives that by 1st January 2011 a composite set of all of the Rules, Appendices, Competition Rules and Event Guidelines be publicised and made available for download from the British Orienteering website.

Updates to Rules and Guidelines for the '4 Level Event Structure':

A lengthy and detailed discussion took place on the '4 Tier Event Structure' and sections of the 'Event Quality Standard (Draft 3)' documentation (available for download from the British Orienteering website).

Terrain:

The scheduling of Level A Events is the responsibility of the Major Events Group. At Level B it was recommended that Fixtures Group consider adopting the method similar to that currently employed by Major Events Group at Level A. The Regional Association to initially recommend use of an area via the Association Fixtures Secretary to Fixtures Group with a Grade B or above Controller external to the host Club having been appointed for the event prior to event registration, and the Controller to then visit, judge and make an advisory report to Fixtures Group approximately eighteen months before the date of the event. At Level C the suitability of event area terrain is to be agreed by the Regional Association. At Level D the scheduling of events and the suitability of an area is the responsibility of Clubs.

Helen Errington raised the need for an 'Event Area Checklist' to be made available in order that Controllers will have to hand an appropriate set of criteria regarding the suitability and quality of terrain for a Level B Event based on that to be used by Controllers of Level A Events.

Maps:

Helen Errington is to request of Map Group that they produce a list of accredited Printing Companies, especially for maps at major events.

Event Officials:

Rules Group agreed need of and importance of all Organisers being trained and licensed as a British Orienteering priority.

Safety:

Rules Group agreed the need for the Organiser of an event at whatever Level to complete the Risk Assessment Form and to ensure that the Risk Assessment is also signed by an appropriate licensed Controller or Coach. It was also agreed that the First Aid available should be appropriate to the event as indicated in Appendix E: Event Safety.

Event Facilities:

It was agreed that the minimum requirements at each Level should be met but some concern was expressed regarding the type and number of toilets to be provided at Level C Events.

Publicity:

Concerns were expressed as to how British Orienteering's Website Manager would be able to cope with the wide range of publicity methods that would be required by the 'Event Quality Standard' requirements. Rules Group agreed to make the recommendation that on the British Orienteering website there should be a direct link

to the Event Flyer on the host Club website and that all Level A Events have dedicated pages that can be accessed and, wherever possible, a unique website be available for access by prospective competitors.

'Event Quality Standard' table:

Following the discussion on specific items in the '4 Tier Event Structure' document, Rules Group made a systematic check of proposed amendments to text in the 'Event Quality Standard' table. Barry Elkington, as Chair of Rules Group, is to report the proposed amendments to sections of the text in the 'Event Quality Standard' table to Events Committee and to also ensure that similar wording is included, where applicable, in the Rules, Appendices, Competition Rules and Event Guidelines.

BOF Rules for 2011:

Following a detailed check and amendment of text as required of the draft 2011 Rules, it was agreed to delete all vertical lines denoting changes to the 2007 and 2009 versions of the Rules as the 2011 Rules are to be seen as being completely new in relation to the introduction of the '4 Tier Event Structure'. Barry Elkington agreed to prepare an article summarising aspects of the new 2011 Rules for 'FOCUS' Magazine.

Appendices to the Rules:

The Appendices were checked and amendments made in the light of the '4 Tier Event Structure' document and the 'Event Quality Standard' table to ensure comparability. It was agreed that the following text in bold print be inserted at the beginning of each document before the 'Introduction' section:

'Text in bold below has mandatory status and shall be followed by relevant event officials. Other content refers to material provided for guidance and for information. This Appendix shall be read in conjunction with the BOF Rules and shall have the same authority. They shall be considered as their extension.'

Competition Rules and Event Guidelines:

Members of Rules Group are undertaking a final check of the suite of Competition Rules and the suite of Event Guidelines in the light of the '4 Tier Event Structure' document and the 'Event Quality Standard' table to ensure comparability before submission of the final drafts of the documents to the Events Committee and the British Orienteering Board.

Barry Elkington reported that Competition Rules for the UK Cup and the UK Relay League were not yet available and that, when they were, final checking would be required in the light of the '4 Tier Event Structure' document and the 'Event Quality Standard' table to ensure comparability.

A question was raised concerning the current January 2010 CompassSport Cup and Trophy Competition Rules J version 1.1 and it was confirmed that the 2010 version will be used for 2011 and be part of the whole suite of Competition Rules effective from January 2011 with the Qualifying Round as Level B and the Final as Level A.

Matters raised by Association Representatives:

Grade 1 Controller applications:

Graeme Ackland and Mark Dyer were approved as Grade 1 Controllers.

Rules Group agreed that there was a need to check how training opportunities for prospective Grade 1 Controllers could be undertaken other than at the annual Major Events Conference.

Reduction in embargo period for the 2011 CompassSport Cup and Trophy Final, the 2012 British Relays and the 2012 JK Day:

In light of the circumstances outlined in the three applications for a reduction of the embargo period for these three events Rules Group agreed to the reduction and the Organisers will be informed.

Masters UK Cup (League) 2011:

On behalf of Ranald Macdonald, Chair of Senior Competitions Group, and EMOA Committee, Ernie Williams distributed copies of the proposal document and requested that views on the proposals be submitted to Ranald Macdonald as soon as possible.

Rules Group Meetings in 2011:

These are scheduled to take place in Birmingham on Saturday 29th January, Saturday 4th June and Saturday 22nd October.

UKCCL2 Course - Jan / Feb 2011

Hilary Palmer had made provisional bookings for the classroom at Sherwood Pines to organise a UKCCL2 course on Sat/Sun Jan 8/9 and Sat Feb 12. Details of the course are available at:

People who are interested in taking this award are current UKCCL1, 'old' Level 2 / Instructor qualified and 'old' Level 3 / Club Coach qualified - you will be someone who enjoys coaching in your club and want to work towards the L2 qualification which replaces the 'old' Level 3 or Club Coach Award.

The first 2 days of the course are training days with a mix of practical coaching, discussions and short written tasks, all of which will be started during the course and completed before day 3 which is an assessment day - tasks are marked and each person coaches their peers.

Following these 3 days each coach has to plan and deliver 6 sessions in their club, do some additional home study tasks and then be assessed by an independent assessor coaching a 45-60 minute session. It is expected that this will be completed before February 2012.

For people wishing to do the courses, they will need to agree to do at least 15 hours of voluntary coaching in their club. The course fee will be between £150 - 170 depending on the numbers involved. The other substantial costs will be met by the British Orienteering Development Manager from Sport England funding. I would expect clubs and possibly County Sports Partnerships to meet the course fee for club volunteers.

Full fees of the order of £420-450 will be charged to any participants who cannot volunteer to coach in their clubs or those from outside the sport.

If you are interested in doing the course please let Hilary Palmer know as soon as possible.- there are places for between 4 (minimum) and 8 (maximum) people.
