EMOA Committee Meeting Report - June 6th 2011

Note: Unfortunately I was unable to attend as I had a work commitment in the US. This report is based on the minutes produced by Secretary Bob Alderson.

Treasurer's Report - The Treasurer has moved some funds in to a 3 month fixed term bond to earn better interest. Overall we are hosting more events but currently seeing lower participation in those events, thus seeing less income than expected.

EM League 2011 - The series is going well so far. See tables later in EMEWS.

EM League 2012 - The aim is to try to include different types of events in the league moving forward. All clubs agreed they want to see the inclusion of 2 urban events in the 2012 League (where they use the BO recommended courses), though still to work out scoring for these events. In addition it was agreed that the Short Green should be included alongside the existing 7 Colour Coded Courses in the League.

Future Events - The following future events are planned for the Region:

- 16th October 2011 Compass Sport Cup Final All still to plan.
- 3rd February 2013 Midland Champs planned tol be in Sherwood Forest though some problems with landowner communication and Natural England priorities.
- April 20th 2013 British Sprint Champs Loughborough University 24 month embargo
- April 21st 2013 British Middle Champs Stanton Moor 24 month embargo.

- 7th July 2013 Yvette Baker Trophy Final LOG are looking to host at Belton.
- November 2013 British Schools Championships DVO will host at Shipley Park all OK.

Newcomer Membership - The response from BO about free membership for first year is that it is not currently possible if you sign up electronically on the BO website to arrange this. It is recommended that new members should do a paper entry so they can get the free membership period.

JK 2014 - Wales OA have requested assistance with organising JK2014 (especially from regions like ourselves where we don't normally have areas to host the JK. The committee were supportive of helping out anywhere from assisting on one day, or even taking one of the areas (e.g. Start) for the whole event. The EMOA Chair will communicate our interest to WOA and see what they want us to do.

BO Board - Congratulations to Judith Holt and John Woodall for their election to the BO board.

BO aim to develop 100 satellite clubs - details to be published soon. EMOA well on track with their development of such clubs.

Rules Group - Ernie's minutes are available elsewhere in EMEWS. A few key points were that there is a need to record all involved in an event, including competitors on all Courses including those on String Courses, and all helpers whether competing or not, for insurance purposes. In addition Ernie reported that the review of Grade 2 Controllers has been completed and all Associations have been asked to complete review of Grade C Controllers.

Map Group - David Olivant is the new Chair of Map Group. Congratulations were offered to Don Moir on being highly commended in the Chichester Trophy for his Belvoir map.

Senior Competitions Group - Compass Point Masters Cup 2012 will be published soon with 8 events to count from 18.

Junior Competitions Group - JCG asked for feedback to Major Event Group on major events (Level A) and junior participation.

The Rules and Guidelines for most of these events have not changed substantially since last year. Minor changes were made to correct the estimated winning time for M16 at the long distance races. However the British Sprint was a new event with heats and a final. Some questions are asked for our comments.

- 1 M/W 10 had one heat leading to one final should this have just been a final?
- 2 M 12 had three heats, (2 -1 -1 in each heat) leading to 1 final W12 had 3 heats, (2 1 2 in each heat) leading to 2 finals A and B (4 1) Should this have been just 1 final?
- 3 Should M/W 14 have had only 2 heats? Any other comments on Level A events and juniors?

EMOA agreed not to recommend any changes at this time after only one year of competition.

National Forest - As the budget is significantly reduced, there are limited new opportunities. Meetings of the Forest Board have been reduced from 4 pa to 2 pa so effective involvement and influence decreases. Roy Denney was thanked for his successful work and his continuation in the role is fully supported.

EMOA Committee Meetings - The new format of meetings will be continued. The venue for the next meeting will be Clifton Church Hall, Pace Room at 7:30pm. This meeting will cover in the additional section the EM Development Plan and planning of the EMOA AGM.

Post EM Meeting - EM Constitution and Plan

It was agreed that there is a need to keep membership fees and levies as low as possible, so the plan is to continue with the current levels, using any surplus funds to do this for as long as possible.

Looking forward there should be a reserve available of around 3 years budget as a reserve (which currently would mean around £7,500).

It was agreed that a formal development plan would be drafted and circulated to clubs by July 31st and then discussed at the next EM meeting.

In addition it was agreed to invite representatives of the EM satellite clubs to the next meeting to provide a 2 minute presentation on their activities.

Post Meeting - BO Governance Review

Many of you will have seen the articles in BO Focus magazine. The main comments raised by EMOA were:

- 1. Yes, there is a need for change.
- 2. The changes as outlined may or may not be the correct way to ensure a healthy future for orienteering in Britain.
- 3. Democracy and representation is important. Do Associations still have a meaningful role in the future?
- 4. Getting the right expertise is important at all levels of the sport.
- 5. We need more detailed information from British Orienteering in order to be fully involved in the consultation process and subsequent implementation.
- 6. The presentation of the document implies imposition rather than proper consultation with the membership.
- 7. Can the tension between Director's responsibilities and member's involvement be better balanced?

Report to EMOA on the meeting of Rules Group in central Birmingham on 4th June 2011

Present: Representatives from EAOA, EMOA, NEOA, SCOA, WMOA, WOA, YHOA and Events Manager Helen Errington.

Apologies: Received from NWOA, SEOA, SOA and SWOA Representatives.

The following items were discussed:

- (a) Update on the role, training and accreditation of Controllers: Club Fixtures Secretaries now able to access detailed database re all Grades of Controllers. This access also needs to be available to those in Regions responsible for Controllers. Also agreed that basic Controller information Name, Grade, Club to be available to all on BO website. Grade B Controller returns from Associations have been received from Association Representatives and British Orienteering database updated re 'Qualifications and Licensing'. Grade C Controllers returns are required from all Associations, who are asked to process returns re Grade C Controllers in the next few months and to delete from Association list any Controllers who do not respond to request re information update.
- (b) Roll-out of Safety Training courses: Currently on-going with trained 'Tutors' now available in several Regions. It is hoped that these 'Tutors' will be able to train members of their own Clubs and also, if possible, members from neighbouring Clubs.
- (c) Training Course materials: Comments have been received and it was agreed to update course materials re new Rules etc. and also obtain new maps, overprinted courses and control descriptions, particularly for Controller and Planner Grade B and Grade C Courses.
- (d) Mapper Accreditation: Possibility in future of mappers to have at least two levels of Grade e.g. 'Map Technician' (ability to survey and update/upgrade existing map) and 'Mapper' (ability to produce full orienteering map from initial survey to print).
- (e) Governance Review of Committees and Groups: Discussion took place on Rules Group feedback to the Board. Concern was expressed re Terms of Reference and the ownership and responsibility for a wide range of matters related to the Rules, the Appendices, the Competition Rules, the Generic Guidelines and a variety of advice documentation. Clear and enhanced communication is seen as being vital together with equally clear ownership and responsibility. It is believed that Rules Group works well with input from Regional Representatives who bring a wide variety of experience and knowledge to aspects of the sport and the point of view of those at the grassroots. As such Associations and their Representatives have a real role to play in the administration of the sport. Concern was also expressed as to what criteria such as 'How', 'By Whom' and 'Definition of expertise' will be used to create the proposed new Committees, Standing Groups and Working Groups, members of whom will consist of 'experts in their field'. Clarification is therefore required re the process of selection of Committee/Standing Group/Working Group members. If there is to be a new 'Standing Rules Group' then the expectation is that it will be provided with suitable Terms

of Reference and be responsible to the proposed 'Events and Competitions Committee' and ultimately to the Board.

- (f) Update on Rules and Guidelines Review: Still ongoing probability of complete rationalisation with title of document and date of issue paramount. Also documentation to be available as one all-embracing download or as specific sections e.g. Rules and Appendices, Competition Rules etc. Need for an 'Index' to be available if at all possible. Stress placed on need, for insurance purposes, for full record to be kept of all competitors at an event together with details of all helpers whether competing or not, and it will be necessary to suitably amend text in all Rules, Guidelines etc.
- (g) Feedback and review of Level B events re adherence to 2011 Guidelines: Helen Errington has produced spreadsheet of January to May 2011 Level B Events (very detailed for the thirty one January to March Events, less detailed for the eight April to May Events) plus analysis of Events and comments from Event Organisers and Controllers. Amongst multitude of details it was noted that majority (twenty one of the thirty one Events) have less than 400 competitors and that only two Events had over 500 competitors. Also, when available, Very Short Green and Long Orange Courses have attracted very few competitors. Clubs need to ensure that link from BO website re Fixtures List goes directly to Event 'Flyer/Information Page' or, failing that, to 'Club Fixtures List' page on website.
- (h) Competition Rules A to E Eligibility for British Championships: BO Board has tasked Helen Errington to produce a statement for future BO Board decision re changes to 'Eligibility Qualification' for British Championship Events amongst the possibilities discussed by Rules Group were:
- (i) No restriction and open to all-comers;
- (ii) Only those eligible who are British Passport holders
- (iii) Those eligible must be British Passport holders or qualify by length of residence over a specified number of years.
- (i) Competition Rule B British Middle Championships and Competition Rule C British Sprint Championships: These documents are being revised, particularly the latter, following the 2011 British Championships and JK.
- (j) Competition Rule E British Night Championships: Course length table and estimated winning times for older male competitors to be revised by David May to bring it in line with other Competition Rules.
- (k) Map scales of 1:10,000 for all age classes M/W35+ at Level A Long Distance Events to bring in line with World Masters? A lengthy discussion took place in light of recent major events Rules Group Chair to discuss with Map Group Chair David Olivant. Also, the revised Appendix H Mapping is now available from the Chair of Map Group. Agreed to change 'must' to 'shall' throughout document and other suggested amendments to be discussed with DO.

- (1) Timed starts and dealing with people turning up late: Following use at a recent major event of the 'half-minute' in between full-minute allocated starts it was agreed that, in exceptional circumstances, it had been worthwhile but that no change would be made at the present time to the current wording of Rule 8.1. It was agreed that this matter needed to be included in the annual Major Events Conference training sessions for Organisers and Controllers.
- (m) Issue of maps to TD1 and TD2 competitors: After discussion it was agreed that JCG should be asked their view on the following before decision finally made at Level C and D Events competitors on White and Yellow Courses can have map at Registration/Assembly or at pre-Start area, at Level B Events all competitors on White and Yellow Courses can have their map issued in the start lane(s) irrespective of whether pre-entry for Age Class or EOD, and for Level A Events competitors who are EOD only on White and Yellow Courses shall have their maps issued to them in a separate start lane to all other competitors.
- (n) Updates to Junior Competition Rules from JCG: The existing Competition Rules have been revised and the draft is presently under discussion between the JCG Chair, Rules Group Chair and Event Manager Helen Errington.
- (o) Event Summary / Overview of Event Structure to be Guideline A or new Appendix A? Agreed to have new Appendix A Event Structure, and recommend that Appendix F Environmental Policy to be an 'Advice/Information Document' rather than an Appendix and to review all Appendices in light of these decisions.
- (p) Guideline B Course Tables: After review it was agreed to amend the existing Course Tables and to have Table for Large Level B Events (over 400 competitors), Table for Small Level B Events (up to 400 competitors) and a Table for Level C Events.
- (q) Appendix G Protests, Juries and Appeals: David May to review, revise and report back to Rules Group.
- (r) Appendix J Championship and Badge Schemes: Revision awaiting outcome of Competition Review and Incentive Schemes.
- (s) Generic Night Event Guideline: Currently being drafted by Arthur Vince.
- (t) Controller from same club for Level B event Rule variation request on behalf of Croeso 2012: Following discussion on request from WOA variation approved.
- (u) Grade A Controller applications Richard Oxlade (SOA) and Donald Grassie (SOA): Both applications approved on the understanding that, having undertaken Grade 1 Controller Training in SOA Region in 2010, the two Controllers attend a future BO Major Events Conference.
- (v) Any Other Business. There were four items of AOB from Associations:
- (i) Teleconferencing it was agreed to look into this e.g. use of 'Go To Meetings' program but to wait for conclusion of the Governance Review and possibility of new Committees, Standing Groups and Working Groups.

- (ii) Northern Championships and SI disqualification competitor had Officials interrogate SI box on his behalf and due to technical glitch he was re-instated following 'interrogation of SI box'.
- (iii) Major Events Handbook and Checklist still ongoing and in a draft state.
- (iv) Two year embargo for Level A Events following discussion it was agreed to keep the Level A embargo at 24 months and the Level B embargo at 12 months with no embargo for Level C and D Events.
- (w) Date and venue of next Meeting: Agreed to be on 29^{th} October 2011 in central Birmingham at 12.30 p.m. #

I DON'T WANT TO SCARE YOU BUT

Lyme Disease is a fairly rare illness, but it has recently started to become more prevalent and the risk of infection should not be ignored. It is caused by bacteria carried by ticks and people who run or walk in the countryside through rough vegetation are most at risk. Ticks are found in any moist, rough vegetation in woodland, heath and moorland areas including deep vegetation such as bracken and often in others that are decaying in mats such as sedges, grasses etc. growing in also in leaf litter within deciduous woods and at woodland edges, in glades and by paths.

Most organisations whose members are active in the wider outdoors do issue some advice which is just as well as there is a widespread lack of knowledge and awareness regarding tick-borne diseases. Many people with typical symptoms will not actually be tested for the presence of even the most common of the diseases. For those who are tested for one or more of the possible diseases, a negative (and thus inconclusive) test will generally result in further investigation being abandoned. Few people will be lucky enough to see a GP with sufficient knowledge to give a clinical diagnosis, i.e. based on symptoms, knowledge of a tick bite event, etc.

It is suggested that official statistics for prevalence of tick-borne diseases in Britain are an underestimate of the true picture due to the apparent clinical unreliability of laboratory tests. It is very likely that the majority of people suffering from tick-borne diseases do not receive treatment at all because there symptoms remain undiagnosed or misdiagnosed.

Lyme disease is perhaps the most common of the diseases carried by ticks in the UK and symptoms can develop within weeks. They may include tiredness, chills, fever, headache, muscle and/or joint pain, swollen lymph glands and blurred vision. A characteristic skin rash may appear which is generally a circular rash that may clear in the centre, resulting in a "Bull's eye" appearance. It can expand and move around the body.

If early symptoms are not recognised, serious complications can develop weeks, months, or even years later. It is likely that infected ticks need to be attached to the body for at least a day before they can transmit the bacteria to us so diligence is very much needed to remove them carefully before any damage is done. When fully fed they can increase to the size of a grape pip, but unfortunately the larvae are smaller than a pin head and often difficult to spot.

Later stage symptoms include arthritis in the large joints, which can recur over many years. Nervous system problems are common, e.g. numbness, meningitis (with fever, stiff neck and severe headache), Bell's palsy (paralysis of the facial muscles) and memory problems. Some people experience irregularities of the heart rhythm.

Lyme disease should be diagnosed by a physical examination and medical history. This clinical diagnosis may in some cases be supported by laboratory testing. Diagnosis based on tests alone is not reliable – a negative result does not mean that the disease is not present. Symptoms can mimic those of other diseases. Diagnosis is easiest when there is a skin rash but this occurs in less than half of sufferers.

The best way forward would be more education of GPs most of whom rarely ever meet the problem. Unfortunately they may well become more used to this problem as the incidences increase. Even if diagnosed the treatment is ill defined.

It is very difficult to avoid ticks because they can be found in urban parks and gardens, as well as typical countryside locations. It is possible for you or your pets to bring ticks into your home. The best strategy is 'awareness'. Check yourself for ticks whenever you have visited a place where they may have been present. Do this both immediately and for up to three days after any outdoor visit. This may allow you to see any adult tick that has attached. Once it has started to feed, its blood-engorged body will make it very visible. If you find a tick, remove it as soon as possible. This is all very well but for those of us involved in outdoor sports this means daily inspections all the time.

Ticks can locate their prey by detecting host body heat, carbon dioxide and ammonia. They may crawl towards a stationary host or stretch out their front legs, equipped with tiny 'grappling hooks' in order to attach to a passing host. So anything you can do to thwart these tactics may help you to avoid tick bites. There are many suggestions about how to stop ticks reaching your skin but there has been little measurement of their effectiveness. Awareness still remains the best strategy.

You can make it more difficult for a tick to reach your skin by wearing shoes rather than sandals and tucking long trousers into socks. Keep to the middle of paths and do not sit on the ground in suspect areas. For those of us who run through undergrowth, full body cover is a must in suspect locations which means anywhere where livestock grazes particularly deer. Ticks can be more easily seen on white or light-coloured clothing.

You should check your pets for ticks when they come into the house and especially before letting them onto carpets bedding or near soft furnishings. Consider using anti-tick pesticides for them.

There are several myths about removing ticks if you have been bitten. Don't squeeze or twist the body of the tick, as this may cause the head and body to separate, leaving the head embedded in your skin and making the creature disgorge the contents of its stomach into your bloodstream.

It is highly advisable not to use your fingernails to remove a tick. Infection can enter via any breaks in your skin, e.g. Close to the fingernail. Do not try to burn the tick off, apply petroleum jelly, nail polish or any other chemical. Any of these methods can cause discomfort to the tick, resulting in regurgitation, or saliva release.

The best way to remove the beastie is probably to use tweezers dipped in antiseptic grasping the tick as close to the skin as possible without squeezing the tick's body. Pull the tick out without twisting - there may be considerable resistance. Another method is to tie a single loop of cotton around the tick's mouthparts, as close to the skin as possible, and then pull gently but firmly, upwards and outwards

Wash your hands after any such work and in case you develop symptoms later, save the tick in a container although sticky tape or a folded tissue should suffice, making a note of the date and location. Taking it to your GP will help him to arrange tests for the problems. Also if possible, ask the doctor to return it to you after it has been analysed and send it, in the interests of research, to the Institute of Virology and Environmental Microbiology, Mansfield Road, Oxford OX1 3SR, saying where the infection occurred.

The Health Protection Agency is currently investigating ticks and details are available at www.lymediseaseaction.org.uk/information/tick.htm or from the HPA at www.hpa.org.uk.

The answer is to take care and be aware. You are most at risk of Lyme Disease when towards the south of England but unfortunately I am informed that recently a case arose near Loughborough.

The best advice is to carefully examine your body for ticks after every time you are in a possible danger area bearing in mind particularly their favourite locations; behind the knees, under the arms and on the scalp. Your groin area is also at risk. You should also carefully inspect all clothing, brushing thoroughly when in any doubt because ticks can crawl on clothing to reach their favourite meals.

Insect repellents containing Permethrin or DEET do supposedly protect against ticks for several hours if you wish to be really confident.
