MINUTES OF THE 47th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE EAST MIDLANDS ORIENTEERING ASSOCIATION HELD ON MONDAY 17th October 2011 at Clifton, Nottingham at 19.30.

- **1. Apologies for absence**: Hilary Palmer, Chris Phillips and Bob Haskins.
- 2. Minutes of the 46th AGM held on Sunday 19th September 2010. It was agreed that the minutes were a true record as proposed by Derek Gale and seconded by John Woodall.

3. Chairman's Report

The easy part is to begin this Report with a very similar statement to the one that I made in the 2009-2010 Report – members of the Association have been able to take part in a wide variety and number of events and activities from Club Nights, Training and School Events, Club Leagues, the East Midland League, the East Midlands Championships and Regional Events throughout the past year, together with the continuing commitment to support the Satellite Clubs and the Junior Squad, not forgetting the regular publication of EMEWS, our Regional Newsletter.

The membership throughout the Region continues to benefit from the experience and input of the Officers and members of the Executive Committee who, I am both pleased and grateful to say, are prepared to stay in office for the forthcoming year – to them all 'Thank You' and 'Keep up the good work'!

One Officer who needs a special 'Vote of Thanks' is Bob Alderson who has completed his three year term of office as the Secretary (for the record his second three year stint!) and who will be missed. Hopefully another willing EMOA member will be Proposed and Seconded to ensure the continuity of minute taking at the bimonthly meetings to be held at the Pace Room at St. Mary's Church in Clifton Village.

One Officer, conspicuous by his/her absence, has been a Vice Chairman – no member was elected to this position at either the 2009 AGM or the 2010 AGM – hopefully third time lucky in 2011!

The format of the meetings has changed in the past year with Open Meetings to discuss and consider Junior Development throughout the Region and Adult Orienteering, allied to a review of the East Midlands Development Plan and future priorities, particularly with attention being paid to the funds of the Association, the funding of Regional activities, and the annual budget.

One aspect of the Region's activities was the holding of a very successful Development Day in early December 2010 and there is another Development Day being arranged in late November this year.

It has also become obvious that the current Association Constitution, drafted in 2003, needs to be reviewed and updated to match changes both within the Region and the National Federation. I hope that in the near future a Working Party consisting of one nominated person from each constituent Club will be formed to consider and draft a revised Constitution suitable for 2012 and beyond.

A full range of 16 League Events, including for 2012 a Short Green Course being added to the traditional seven Colour Coded courses, is already arranged and there is the possibility of not only a 'Night League' but also an 'Urban League'.

In 2013 Clubs within our Region are particularly active – the Midlands Championships (NOC), the CompassSport Cup and Trophy First Round (LEI), the British Sprint Championships (LEI), the British Middle Championships (DVO), the Yvette Baker Trophy Final (LOG), and the British Schools Championships (DVO). There is also a possibility that the Region will be actively involved in the 2014 JK scheduled to be hosted in South Wales.

Finally, I would like to thank John Woodall, our Association President, and Judith Holt, elected at the 2011 National AGM, for their work on behalf of orienteers as Directors of British Orienteering.

4. Secretary's Report including activity statistics.

Courses:

- 3 teaching courses were held.
- An EMOA Training Day was held November 2010 and 21 attended the planner, controller, organiser, and mapper courses and another 8 attended the UK CC Level 1 course.
- The next EMOA Training Day is to be held on 26th November 2011.

5. Treasurer's Report including membership numbers and presentation of accounts.

Copies of the Report were circulated via EMEWS 237 and at the meeting.

Membership was down on the previous year - 1056 to 838.

The year end Income and Expenditure Report showed an income of £17,093 and expenditure of £17,600, giving a deficit of £507 for 2010/11. £10,000 of this is invested in a bond due to mature in January 2012.

The Independent Financial Examiner had confirmed that the Income and Expenditure Report and the Balance Sheet were a true and fair statement of the finances of EMOA but he had indicated his unease with regard to the use of Electronic Banking that did not tie in with the wording in the existing Constitution dated 2003. Roger Edwards was thanked for undertaking this task.

It was agreed that, whatever the outcome of the current review of the British Orienteering structure, these Formal Delegates and Corresponding Members would be in position for the full Association year 2011-2012.

11. Budget projections and Fixing of Charges

The draft budget for 2011-2012 was circulated, together with a Statement of Expenditure incurred to date. The budget anticipates a surplus of expenditure over income of approximately £1,000.

The EMOA budget as set out by Viv Macdonald to the meeting was proposed by Roy Denney and seconded by Derek Gale, and was agreed by those present.

12. Fixing of Charges.

- (a) Membership fees: Viv Macdonald indicated that, after consideration by the Committee, no change was needed to the current scale of membership fees i.e.
- £3 senior, £1 junior, £5 family, £10 associate and £15 club, and free for new members for the first year.
- The fees set out by Viv Macdonald to the meeting were proposed by Ranald Macdonald and seconded by Mike Gardener and were agreed by those present.
- (b) Event levies: Viv Macdonald indicated that, after consideration by the Committee, the event levies should remain the same at 40p per adult and 10p per junior with the first £25 being exempt. This was proposed by Mike Gardner and seconded by Bob Alderson. A formal Amendment to the proposal was made by Roger Edwards and seconded by Roy Denney that the event levy for the forthcoming year should be 10p per adult and with no levy payable for a junior and that the first £25 remain exempt. After a discussion on the issues, a vote was taken by a show of hands on the proposed Amendment to the original Motion to reduce the levy with 4 votes for and 15 votes against. The original proposal was then put to a vote by a show of hands with 15 votes for, 3 votes against and with 1 abstention. The proposal to retain the current scale of levies for the forthcoming year 2011-2012 was therefore carried.
- (c) Electronic equipment rental fees: Given that EMOA no longer retains the SI equipment as it has been devolved to clubs it was proposed by Derek Gale and seconded by Bob Alderson that rental fees are no longer required, and this was agreed by those present.

13. Plans for the coming year.

Ernie Williams drew attention to the following:

- (a) One theme had been running throughout the meeting, that being the need for a thorough review of the existing 2003 Constitution. This would be undertaken by a working group, consisting of one member from each club, preferably under the Chairmanship of the Vice Chairman (yet to be appointed) or another member of the Committee. They would report back to an open meeting of the Committee, which would then need to be followed by an EGM to review and adopt the new Constitution ahead of the 2012 AGM.
- (b) Details and application form for the EMOA Training Day being held on 26th November 2011 are on the EMOA website.

- (c) There is a very thriving EMOA League to look forward to in 2012. There is also the potential for an EMOA Night League as well as an EMOA Urban League in 2012.
- (d) There are a significant number of National Level events being organized in the EMOA in 2013 as detailed in the Chairman's Report.
- (e) The EMOA Development Plan as printed and circulated in EMEWS 237 had been compiled and approved by the Committee during the current year and the budget agreed earlier in the meeting has provided the funding to implement the Plan in 2012.

There being no further business the Chairman thanked all present for their attendance at the 2011 AGM and declared the meeting closed at 20.45.

Refreshments were then taken and were followed by very informative presentations about three of the Region's Community Orienteering Groups by Robert Parkinson from Bassetlaw, Derek Gale on behalf of Buxton, and Judith Holt on behalf of Matlock. Ed Nicholas then addressed the meeting about the Community Orienteering Project and other issues regarding the future of the sport and all four were thanked for their valuable contribution to the post-AGM discussion.

EMOA Committee Meeting Report - November 28th 2011

Vacancies Following AGM - The committee is short of a number of roles so would ask members to please consider taking these roles on. The key roles we are short of currently are Secretary and Vice-Chairman. These are the most urgent requirements but we also need a Development Officer (but can wait until we know how the new British Orienteering structure is in place for this role). We potentially may also need an Independent Financial Examiner for the Accounts at the end of the financial year (cannot be a DVO member as must be from a different club to the Treasurer).

East Midlands Constitution - At the AGM it was identified that the constitution could do with being reworked (and simplified, and brought up to date especially around the financial processes). It was agreed that Roy Denney would write up a new version and circulate around club reps with the intention of holding an EGM around the end of May to approve the new constitution. If anyone has any input on what they think should be in the constitution then the current version is on the EM website, and you can feed in to your club reps on the committee.

East Midlands Training Day - The day was successful with 7 folk from NOC, 6 from DVO and 4 from LOG. In terms of the courses 6 attended Event Safety, 6 attended the Planners course and 9 attended the Organisers course.

British Orienteering are looking at alternative delivery methods in future. These could be tutor led, on-line or mentored in club (with trained mentors).

On British Orienteering website be aware that Event Officials can drill down to specific sections of the handbook and just get to those for things such as tips (see below):



There were no takers for the beginners Mapping course but we may have a need for an Advanced Mappers course. If you need this then please let your club rep know as soon as possible.

EM Controllers Conference - LEI had proposed a controllers conference to ensure everyone knew latest rules, etc. All controllers in East Midlands would be invited. Finding a date may be difficult but will look in to finding a date, possibly for a few hours after an event.

Treasurer's Report - The Treasurer provided a report which showed a lot of money in and out for the Junior Squad. No other major updates.

National Events & Competitions Committee - Mike Forrest has been confirmed as the chair of the new committee which oversees much of orienteering in Britain. Nomination forms for members of the new committee. All members are encouraged to consider whether they meet the criteria and stand. BO want representatives of all areas to apply. Applications need to be in by January (though at this stage these are not available on BO website - if they don't appear we will put them on East Midlands site).

EM League 2011 - The awards for East Midlands League 2011 will take place before the NOC event at Blidworth on 22^{nd} January. It is hoped to hold the presentation at 10:00am. Would all award winners please get there in time to collect their awards.

EM League 2012 - The list of events is later in EMEWS.

EM Urban League 2012 - It is planned to have one event from each of the 4 major clubs with scoring given as best 3 from 4 results. Winners will be best man and women in each of the 6 normal event classes (i.e. 12 awards). The events so far nominated are:

8th July - Nottingham City 2nd Sept - Lincoln City

20th Oct - Ashby DVO still to nominate their event

Future Events - The following future events are planned for the Region:

• 16th October 2011 - Compass Sport Cup Final - All went well and good relationship with National Trust.

- 3rd February 2013 Midland Champs planned to be in Sherwood Forest Some additional access problems being looked at.
- 17th February 2013 British Club Champs / Compass Sport Cup Round Fineshade Woods: 12 month embargo in place
- April 20th 2013 British Sprint Champs Loughborough University 24 month embargo.
 Currently being mapped. Planner and Organiser are appointed.
- April 21st 2013 British Middle Champs Stanton Moor Some issues around parking and access
- 7th July 2013 Yvette Baker Trophy Final LOG are looking to host at Belton.
- November 2013 British Schools Championships DVO will host at Shipley Park all OK.
- JK 2014 Possible involvement no correspondence recently.

East Midland Champs – The 2012 East Midland Champs will be based on the DVO event at Eyam in November.

Coaching Report - There are 2 coaching days planned in the Lakes for individuals, clubs and groups with their own coach. Hilary Palmer has sent the emails to club coaches so please contact your club coach if you are interested

Rules Group - there should be a new set of rules, appendices, guidelines available in Jan 2012 which should cover all the changes made recently.

Senior Competitions Group - The Masters Cup Programme for 2012 has been published on the BOF website.



Sport England Survey

The Sport England participation survey results are shown below. The overall satisfaction level for orienteering is again at the top end of the results (see graph below). Orienteering is 8th column from right.

Headline results are shown below. You can see overall satisfaction in your sport relative to the other sports. The chart below shows that there is variation across the 46 sports, but that overall satisfaction levels are high.

- 2. The revised Appendix H version 3.0 was approved by Events Committee on 12 November. This shows the scales at which maps should be printed and the method of printing to be used. Maps for Level B long distance events are required to be at either 1:15000 or 1:10000 scales.
- 3. The Printer Approval process is now in place and covers approval of off-set litho and digital printing. Use of approved club digital printers is conditional and only for use for level B events as there is concern that the quality and resolution required for Level A event maps cannot be maintained by these relatively inexpensive machines across a long print run (no approval is required for printing of maps for levels C and D events).
- 4. Technically Map Group is in abeyance following the Events meeting until the new governance regime is in place. However work continues on the following:
 - a. The Map Advising scheme continues for Level A events.
 - b. The Mappers' pages on the web site are to be updated. These will include the list of Approved Printers for Level A and B events, revised OCAD symbol sets and new technical guidance notes.
 - c. The proposal for the Mappers Accreditation and Training scheme is in preparation.
 - d. The development grant for the Digital Mapping Data Evaluation project has been approved and the project is being taken ahead by Map Group with the intention of completion by mid 2012.

- e. The ISOM 201X revision continues with input to the IOF Map Commission from Map Group and no final date at this point.
- 5. The next Map Group meeting is provisionally scheduled for 7th January 2012. The main business will be to finalise the Accreditation and Training scheme.
- 6. The intention is to hold the postponed Map Conference in 2012 to cover the issues above.

Editorial

Orienteering continues to diversify and we have the British Sprint and Middle distance champs in our region in 2013. There is also urban orienteering and night orienteering as well as the more traditional colour coded courses. We had looked at integrating all of these different types of orienteering in to the East Midlands League. However, there are very different courses in each of the different types of orienteering, and we didn't want to force people to always run specific courses for all types of orienteering. You will therefore see, as well as the traditional East Midlands League, we are introducing an East Midlands Urban League as well this year, and hope to have a Night League next winter.

Are there other sorts of orienteering we should be recognising in the East Midlands? With all of the community orienteering clubs, should we be looking to encourage cross community club competition? If so, what form should this take? Or should community orienteering look only to compete within their parent clubs?
