

# MINUTES OF THE 48<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND ASSOCIATED EGM OF THE EAST MIDLANDS ORIENTEERING ASSOCIATION HELD ON MONDAY 17<sup>th</sup> September 2012 at Clifton, Nottingham at 19.30.

#### **EGM Minutes**

#### The EGM was called to agree the new version of the EMOA Constitution.

Roy Denney (LEI) and Ranald Macdonald (DVO) both talked about the new constitution and commended it to the attendees. The constitution was felt to provide the proper level of governance, while still protecting officials. Some discussion took place about what happened if there were no officers to fulfil the key roles in the committee. It was pointed out that the old constitution did not cover this, nor did the new one. However, the formal committee membership is much smaller, so it should allow quorate meetings to be easier to hold.

The attendees of the EGM voted unanimously to accept the new constitution, and thus the AGM was held under the rules of the new constitution.

## MINUTES OF THE 48th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

- 1. Apologies for absence: Apologies were received from Sean Harrington (LOG) and Peter Hornsby (LEI).
- 2. Minutes of the 47<sup>th</sup> AGM held on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> October 2011. It was agreed that the minutes were a true record as proposed by Roy Denney (LEI) and seconded by Mike Gardner (DVO).
- 3. Chairman's Report

The Chairman's Report had been published in EMEWS prior to the meeting. It is reproduced here:

This, my final Annual report to the membership, is a review of the activities of the Association over the past year and I will be looking positively towards the future both within and outside of the Region.

Members are benefiting from being part of a flourishing Regional set-up as demonstrated by the well established East Midlands League and with the League Tables and League Awards being co-ordinated by Roger Williamson and, following Roger's untimely death, by Ursula Williamson, and the introduction of the East Midlands Urban League being co-ordinated by Paul Murgatroyd, together with the successful introduction and continuation of the Satellite Clubs project, the individual Club Summer and Winter Leagues, and the increasingly popular Club Activity Nights and Coaching Sessions throughout the Region.

Allied to the above is the developing co-operation between the Clubs and, aided by our Fixtures Secretary Ian Whitehead, the co-ordination of an increasing range of events be they local, regional and national. One major fixture which played an important part in the Region in the last twelve months was the CompassSport Cup and Trophy Final hosted by DVO at Longshaw last October and, in the coming months, two East Midlands Clubs will be playing a significant role in the 'Major Events' calendar with the Midland Night Championships being hosted at Spring Cottage on 3<sup>rd</sup> November closely followed by DVO hosting the East Midlands Championships at Eyam in just under three months on 25<sup>th</sup> November.

To say that 2013 will be a busy year for the East Midlands is an understatement, with the Midland Championships being held on 3<sup>rd</sup> February and hosted by NOC at Sherwood and, shortly after, the Regional Round of the CompassSport Cup and Trophy hosted by LEI at Fineshade on 17<sup>th</sup> February. Just weeks following 2013 JK there is the Elite and Age Class Weekend with the British Sprint Championships at Loughborough University on 20<sup>th</sup> April being hosted by LEI and the British Middle Distance Championships at Stanton Moor on 21<sup>st</sup> April being hosted by DVO. LOG will be hosting the Yvette Baker Trophy Final on 7<sup>th</sup> July at Belton Park and, later in the year, DVO are hosting the British Schools Championships at Shipley on 17<sup>th</sup> November.

Looking even further forward, there is every possibility that EMOA and the East Midlands Clubs will be asked to make a significant contribution, as we did in 2004 at the JK in the Lake District, at JK 2014 in South Wales. Precisely what we will be asked to do and where is not yet known at the time of typing (late August) but I am

sure that the membership of EMOA will once again rally round in support of WOA to create a successful and memorable four day JK at Easter time.

Little could be achieved without your Association having a sound financial footing and your Association has been, and hopefully will continue to be, guided by Viv Macdonald as Treasurer, who led a thorough review of financial income and expenditure, the funding of the Satellite Clubs, and the awarding of grants to EMOA members, for which we offer our thanks. All of this work was linked to the review of the existing EMOA Development Plan and your Committee, after intensive discussion, have agreed a new Development Plan for the next three years which will act as a secure foundation for orienteering within the Region, particularly in support of continuing success for the members of the East Midlands Junior Squad, support of and provision for coaching at all levels of expertise and experience, and for the training of Event Organisers, Planners and Controllers together with Mappers and Coaches. In the past year a successful Annual Volunteer Day was arranged in late 2011 by Pauline Olivant at Groby Community College with courses for Event Safety, Event Organisation and Event Planning being provided. In May 2012 Ranald Macdonald and Roger Edwards organised a Controllers and Event Officials Conference Day at Rushcliffe Country Park, with sections of the day being led by Dave Peel, David Olivant and Roger Edwards, and with all present being able to enjoy food and drink ably provided by Viv Macdonald – to those who organised and arranged and to all of those who took part – thank you.

Another major step forward has been the decision in the past year to review and re-structure the Constitution, with the majority of the work being undertaken by Ranald Macdonald, Roger Edwards, Roy Denney and Bob Haskins – hopefully by the time this Annual Report is formally presented at the 2012 AGM the new Constitution and the accompanying Standing Orders will have been positively voted into place by a quorate EGM and will be available for use in future years.

I would like to take this opportunity to say a final 'thank you' to all of the members of the Committee for their continuing support throughout what has been a momentous year as detailed in this Report, and managing as we all did without a Vice Chairman and without a Secretary, though the latter role was dealt with by myself and EMEWS Editor Mike Gardner. Hopefully there will be volunteers to take on the positions of the four new Officers as listed in the new Constitution, and that they, together with the members of the 2012-2013 Committee, will ensure that that the activities of the Association and the membership will continue to maintain the reputation which we have outside of our Region for reliability, willingness to assist and advise, and being prepared to be at the forefront of new initiatives.

Last but not least, it has been an honour to be able to serve as your Vice Chairman for three years and then as Chairman for three years – I trust that I have been able to serve you all as well as possible throughout the past six years, and I can now look forward to watching the Association develop and grow further in the years ahead.

At the meeting, Ernie brought up the fact that since writing the report EMOA had agreed to assist in the organisation of JK2014. There was some discussion on the exact involvement for EMOA at the meeting.

The meeting formally accepted the Chairman's report.

#### 4. Secretary's Report including activity statistics.

As we have no secretary, there is no formal secretary's report. Ernie stated he would publish a report in EMEWS later which would cover number of controller, number of courses held, and number of satellite clubs.

#### 5. Treasurer's Report including membership numbers and presentation of accounts.

Copies of the Report were circulated via EMEWS 243 and at the meeting.

The Treasurer reported that Event Levy income had been fairly constant. Of 20 events at level C, only 6 had used an area used the previous year. Overall membership numbers were very slightly down from 838 to 802 and units down from 477 to 464.

The year end Income and Expenditure Report showed a similar income from event levies and also a similar income from membership. The overall income which now does not cover the satellite club funding shows income of £7,204 and expenditure of £7,075, a nominal 'profit' of £129.

The Independent Financial Examiner had confirmed that the Income and Expenditure Report and the Balance Sheet were a true and fair statement of the finances of EMOA. Andy Lucas was thanked for undertaking this task.

#### 6. Approval of Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Statement

Acceptance of the Report, balance sheet and income and expenditure statement was proposed by Roy Denney and seconded by Chris Phillips.

#### 7. Election of Principal Officers

This took place under the new constitution.

All of the new officials pointed out that they were standing for one year only. The East Midlands clubs need to help develop a succession plan by encouraging others to volunteer for these roles next year.

The signatories to the bank account will therefore be the Chairman and the Financial Secretary.

#### 8. Election of Other Officers

The only other officers on the committee in the new constitution are the club reps. The delegates and other roles will be identified by the new committee at their next meeting and then advertise them to the membership in EMEWS after that meeting.

#### 9. Appointment of Independent Financial Examiner.

Viv Macdonald agreed to ask Andy Lucas if he would perform the role again next year.

#### 10. Budget projections and Fixing of Charges

The Treasurer presented a project 3 year budget to align with the 3 year development plan. The main proposed changes were to remove the £25 excess from level C EMOA events, to subsidise the junior squad to £1,000 (which had been agreed with the junior squad co-ordinator), an increase in EOC grant as this was no longer funded by British Orienteering, and a rise in money put aside for grants.

There was then a lot of discussion on the budget and the associated membership fees (see below).

The Treasurer agreed that after the meeting they would update the budget and re-publish it in EMEWS.

#### 11. Fixing of Charges.

(a) Membership fees: The meeting agreed with a proposal to do the following:

Remove the Family membership fee in line with British Orienteering

Reduce the Senior membership fee to £2

Maintain the Junior membership fee at £1.

Maintain the Associate membership fee at £10

Maintain the Club membership fee at £15.

This was proposed by Derek Gale and seconded by Ursula Williamson. The fees set out above were voted on with 9 in favour, 2 against and 4 abstentions. Therefore these fees were passed.

- (b) Event levies: The meeting agreed with a proposal to retain the event levies at their current rates. That is 40p per adult and 10p per junior with the first £25 being exempt. This was proposed by Roy Denney and seconded by Roger Edwards. The levies set out above were voted on with 10 in favour, 2 against and 5 abstentions. Therefore the levies ere passed.
- (c) Electronic equipment rental fees: All electronic equipment now resides with the clubs. In order to finalise the situation it was agreed that the permanent loan situation should now formally be changed to state that the equipment now belongs to the clubs. This was agreed unanimously by all present and formally proposed by Chris Phillips and seconded by Hilary Palmer.

#### 13. Plans for the coming year.

Ernie Williams drew attention to the following:

(a) An Annual Volunteer Day was again planned. There is also a need for a controller's course which may take place on the same day (or not). There is also planned to be a further Planners/Controllers session (which will concentrate on experienced planners / controllers).

- (b) There are a wide range of events planned for the East Midlands across all the clubs in 2013.
- (c) The East Midlands League continues to do well and has now been joined by the Urban League (thanks going to Paul Murgatroyd for assisting in setting this up).
- (d) We seem to have a flourishing region and thanks go to all involved in running the region and the clubs within the region.

#### 14. Any Other Business

John Woodall thanked Ernie Williams for his 3 years as Chairman and previous 3 years as Vice-Chairman of EMOA.

There being no further business the Chairman thanked all present for their attendance at the 2012 AGM and declared the meeting closed at 21.30.

The meeting was closed and an open discussion took place on topics such as urban league events for next year.

# Report on East Midlands Meeting - 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2012

Grant Applications - Viv Macdonald to create a short article for EMEWS on how to submit grant applications to EMOA (see elsewhere in this issue).

JK2014 - The event is to be held in Wales and EMOA have volunteered to assist with manpower. At this stage the plan is to run one of the days and Chris Phillips is to be the day organiser with Bob Haskins as deputy.

**Treasurer's Report** - The Treasurer has created a revised budget based on the figures agreed at the AGM. This shows a loss in next 2 years. Otherwise the current figures are in line with expectations.

EM League Events - NOC have downgraded their event at Wellow on Nov 11<sup>th</sup>, so this will no longer form part of the EM League. The event at Byron's Walk was reviewed as it had no Short Green course. After discussion it was agreed that as the event did not comply with the League standards it should be excluded from the EM League.

**Urban League** - This was successfully concluded and we will look to expand this next year. Thanks went to Paul Murgatroyd for setting up and organising the league.

Night League - We will look at instigating a Night League from next year as most of the clubs have a series of night events this year.

# East Midlands Orienteering Association Development Programme 2012 - 13

We all know how important volunteer officials are for us to run successful orienteering events and to develop the skills of other orienteers. One key aspect of the development of these officials is for us to put on a regular development programme. In the EMOA we feel that there are significant advantages in doing this at an association level so that we can learn from each other and try to improve the quality of our events across the region.

Over the coming orienteering season we are putting on a programme of sessions for those who are currently active officials as well as those who would like to see whether undertaking such a role is for them.

We have a really pressing need to introduce more people to controlling and mapping but also need more planners and coaches to enable a succession pathway. There is also a need for us to encourage younger orienteers into these roles, perhaps by working with an experienced official as a mentor. Some people are daunted by the thought of taking on what are seen as onerous tasks, whilst many of us get great satisfaction from putting the various bits together into a successful outcome. If we can break down major tasks into smaller parts we are more likely to encourage newcomers into these roles.

In May we ran a successful conference for Planners and Controllers, attended by nearly 30 people. We plan to repeat this for more experienced people next February as well as putting on a similar event for experienced Mappers in December and a programme of events for those new to the various roles or wanting to 'have a go'.

Since I was 'elected' EMOA Development Co-ordinator at the recent AGM I have consulted with representatives from the various clubs as well as those undertaking key roles across the region to make sure we meet the needs of clubs.

If you are thinking of having a go at planning, mapping, controlling or coaching, I hope you will see something to interest you. In addition, coaching courses and awards are available and clubs will continue to put on their own sessions.

We look forward to seeing many of you at a forthcoming session and do contact either your club representative or me if you have any questions.

### ROGER HURT REMEMBERED (1946-2012)

The name and works of Roger Hurt will bring back many memories to long standing LEI chums of advancing years (Roger would definitely have preferred those words to the more blunt description 'older members'!) but to the more youthful amongst us "Roger Hurt" could well be just a name heard in chats and discussions of the way things were in 'the good old days'. Either way the very sudden death of Roger in July from an aortic aneurysm brought to an end not only a life exceedingly well lived but also the life of a man who help build the foundations of our Club as we know it today.

Roger was an excellent educationalist, retiring at the end of a teaching career as Head Teacher of Cotgrave Primary School in Nottinghamshire, as well as being very much a 'Renaissance Man' having talents in music, in writing as the author of a number of Ladybird Books together with articles on a range of topics including orienteering, taking part in outdoor sports such as mountaineering, rock climbing and mountain biking as well as our own sport of orienteering, together with real skills in the arts and crafts, as a raconteur and wit of note, and not forgetting his legendary status as a home brewer and vintner of some repute – as a well-known member of DVO (thanks Mike) said to me recently "My abiding memory of Roger is going to his house for a meeting (yes, in the good old days Club and Regional meetings were held in people's homes) and being invited to sample one or more of his brews" – after all, who else had a beer line from the barrel in the garage to the other side of their kitchen wall?

Roger was one of the major mappers for LEI and, before it was formalised in Standing Orders, 'the Access Person' – this latter function was carried out by Roger investigating any patch of woodland big or small that he came across in the days before OS maps specifically showed 'Access Land' by getting in amongst the trees and brambles to see if it was worthy of an orienteering map and then, if suitable, taking it further. As a mapper Roger, alongside dedicated Club members such as Peter Hornsby, would survey an area with pen, coloured pencils and pad, and then transfer everything into the symbols used at the time onto special sheets laid over a large light table, one sheet per print colour, using various thicknesses of Rotring Technical Pens and black ink, before submitting the sheets for printing. Needless to say this was a laborious task undertaken in the evenings and at weekends that required real concentration and a very steady hand. The colours were more limited than they are today and some of the symbols were difficult to draw by hand so starting a map was quite an undertaking and completing all of the sheets was a very real achievement – just think of the advantages available today – there was no Google Earth, no GPS and definitely no OCAD or Purple Pen!

Roger will also be remembered as the 'only begetter' in the 1970's and beyond of 'Plaid Coalville', a small, some might say exclusive, group described by 'The Laird' as "like-minded chums who all enjoyed good conversation, good sport, good companionship and, of course, good beer". The members of the group consisted of Roger's best and "oldest pal" 'Alb' better known as Ian Burden, a fellow Loughborough College trained Crafts Teacher, who also had the nickname 'Bunter', Eric Porter a.k.a 'Biggles', Peter Hornsby a.k.a 'Peat Bog', Colin Grey a.k.a 'Wingnut' and

a certain EAW a.k.a 'Little Ern' (think Morecambe and Wise) who also wrote articles for local, regional and national publication as 'Hardy Rootstock' - well I had to have a pen-name as Roger had achieved near legendary status for articles written with wit and erudition and published near and far as by 'Rocky Knoll' though Roger always maintained that 'Rocky Knoll' definitely wasn't him though he thought he knew who he might be!

After more than twenty years in our sport Roger had to give way to serious joint problems, particularly in his hips, and stopped orienteering to become a member of an award winning Barber Shop Quartet and Choral Group - one year the Quartet won the National Championships and were invited to take part in the World Championships in America which Roger absolutely loved, together with taking up Mountain Biking, both of which activities he continued to take a part in right up to his death.

To finish with these special memories, one particular one is from the time that Britain hosted the Orienteering World Championships at Aviemore in Scotland in late September 1976 - Roger heard that volunteers were being sought from amongst the orienteering fraternity to help at the event and so he and 'Alb', both being teachers in the employ of Leicestershire County Council, requested formal 'Leave of Absence' to take part in the World Championships, which was then granted, and off they both went northwards as voluntary helpers (and informal participants) in the World Championships, stories about which were told and re-told much to the hilarity of the listeners but very much to the delight of Roger and Ian, who never did let on to the powers-that-be that they hadn't actually been selected to run competitively in the World Championships representing Great Britain and Northern Ireland!

It is often said of someone that we shall not see their like again - in Roger's case these words actually do mean what they say - thank you Roger for all that you did for LEI in particular and for orienteering in the East Midlands - it has been and always will be very much appreciated by those who knew you and those who are beneficiaries of your positive attitude to life and your 'can-do' spirit.

National events provide a range of age related courses and are normally entered in advance using a Standard Entry Form (SEF); entry on the day (EOD) will usually be limited and more expensive. Cheques payable to organising clubs given at beginning of details, if not specified.

The OS map reference is either the car park or point from which the event will be signposted. The list is based on BOF registration, but events are sometimes cancelled. If you are uncertain of whether an event will be on, check with the organiser. The editor takes no responsibility for wasted journeys.
