

# Notes from East Midlands Meeting - 10th November

**EMOA Vice-Chair** – We need a new vice-chair for EMOA. The role is not onerous and can' be from DVO as we already have a DVO Chair, Development Officer and Secretary. Volunteers would be welcomed.

# Financial Secretary Report -

#### Income

Busy event-wise with event levies received for Lincoln Euro City Race (LOG), Nottingham City Race (NOC), Lutterworth (LEI), Hamilton (LEI), Chinley Churn (DVO), Newark (LOG), Retford (NOC) and Burbage (LEI) - £605 in total. Also £37 in membership fees, £66 in bank interest and EMJOS received £314 from cake sales at Chinley Churn. Finally nearly £1,000 in receipts for EMJOS activities - exact make-up of them to be determined with Ann-Marie's help - but looks to be £300 for JIRCS, £630 for South Wales and £60 for local training activities.

# <u>Expenditure</u>

The catering for the development conference was paid out. Bank charges totalling £10 were paid and these have now ceased for future months. EMJOS costs totalled nearly a £1,000 too - being £355 for JIRCS, £600 for South Wales and £39 for other local activities.

Current bank balance = £13,315.

# Club-funded development projects

- DVO/24/3 MapRuns 2024/25/26. DVO have been awarded a Sport England grant which will fund most of the costs of 36 MapRun events over the next two years, which are to be co-ordinated by the Club Development Officer with the aim of attracting new participants from running and other sporting clubs.
- DVO/24/4 MapActive courses and level D events 2024/25. DVO have been awarded a
  grant from the Orienteering Foundation, delivered in 2 tranches, the second conditional
  on demonstrating delivery of phase 1. This grant covers 2 MapActive courses, a Level D
  programme of 10 events and a Navigation festival for newcomers at Hardwick or a similar
  venue.
- NOC/25/1 Club Coaching. Training for 20 NOC members on 18/1/2025. (Joined by 7 from DVO).
- LEI no information supplied
- LOG/25/1 LOG are holding an autumn MapRun series and continue to provide coaching at weekly club nights

**EMOA Champs Competition Rules** - Iain Phillips fed back results of member survey and proposed course / class combinations for EMOA Champs. He also proposed the introduction of Novice Classes for juniors (aimed at "new" orienteers) to allow them to take part without pressure of a major competition. No trophies would be awarded for novice classes, but prizes could be given. The exact rules for eligibility are being defined. The proposed course / class combinations are in the table below:

It was agreed that, if appropriate, middle distance races could be used for EMOA Champs (not just long). If the area does not support a Black course, then M21 would compete on Brown. Also, if the EMOA Champs and Midland Champs take place on same event, then the Midland Champs class / course combinations will take precedence.

2026 Rules Changes - The following are some of the major rule changes talked about at the Major Events Conference in October:

- 1 There will be changes to the class/course tables for JK, British Long and Area Championships.
- 2 There will be changes to relay class start times, and the Ad Hoc relay will run medium/short/long for all teams.
- 3 There is a change in principle over relay alliances between neighbouring clubs for JK and British relays. For Men Open and Women Open there is an objective to attract more elite teams. In these classes alliance teams will be permitted even if the clubs concerned could field club-only teams. In Junior classes alliance teams will be permitted only where this allows for participation by juniors in clubs which could not

field a club-only team: "all-star" alliance teams will not otherwise be permitted. It is not clear how these principles will be enforced.

- 4 Shadowing of juniors on championship courses at level A events will not be allowed.
- 5 Assistance dogs are permitted by default if pre-notified to the Organiser and the landowner does not object.
- 6 Significant changes to Selection and Seeding procedures (Appendix A) and Safety (Appendix E).
- 7 In general, it is claimed that the 2026 Rules remove ambiguity and duplication, and recognise that electronic punching is now standard for level C and above.

# Training events

# Burbage Common 19th October

We joined the West Midlands squad who had arranged with LEI to use the area at the same time as the regional colour coded event - the coaches felt the session being mixed with the event worked well. Only 3 from EMJOS (Ben Jessica and Cara) joined so a range of ability to practise using the compass to make more precise bearings.

### Orienteering Foundation training day 8th of November South Wales

Swansea Bay Orienteering Club organised for controls to be scattered across Merthyr Mawr, so there was a session in the north for the morning and then a move to the southern area and a fresh clutch of controls on the sunny, dry, intricate sand dunes and scrub terrain. The day finished with a sand dune race up the Big Dipper - open to everyone. A great way to bring the individual adults on the training day too and the 5 different junior squads, all together. Ann-Marie led the sessions catering for the TD3 to TD5 athletes from both EMJOS and West Midlands squads. The theme for the day was to plan for attack points and beacons on the route. With the more experienced using simplification ideas to allow for faster running.

We shared accommodation in a Boys and Girls Club Wales activity centre near Bridgend - this worked well sharing cooking and evening entertainment and games, and also giving lifts to the night event. All of the EMJOS athletes went to the night event at Briton Ferry (very steep forest, near Swansea). For some juniors this was their first event in the dark so the 1 hour score format having 9 controls at yellow standard for the novices, was very welcomed. The athletes were paired up to run in the dark or in pairs on relocation exercises in the sand dunes

The Sunday event was back on Kenfig Burrows, previously used for JIRCS 2023 - had more sand dunes and some very good race results. Sand dunes are no longer a mystery to this group of juniors.

Using the minibus transport worked well and gave the opportunity for the juniors to get to know each other. Pairing up juniors with WMJS juniors worked to forge new friends from other clubs who will be a friendly face at future events and training

# Future Training

There is a possibility for shared training on the 13th of December to join WMJS when they do their Christmas session at Hartshill Hayes.

Then on the 31st of January 2026 EMJOS are hosting training on Crich Chase (DVO) for Yorkshire and Humberside and West Midlands squads - so there will be 60 juniors going mad on the slopes of the Derwent valley.

# Other things to note:

Safeguarding in our sport has been refreshed with the appointment of Jeanette Downing as lead safeguarding officer at the BOF office. The review of safeguarding in our sport does mean a careful review of the level of training for the coaches and helping parents associated with EMJOS.

Some of the longer standing coaches will have to take the live 3 hour course, while the most recently accredited coaches (within the last three years) will need to take a one hour refresher e-learning course after 3 years coaching. Parents who help will be expected to do the one hour e-learning course.

The EMJOS page on EMOA website has been refreshed to include a contact e-mail for the squad safeguarding officer (Anne Kayley-Burgess) and a link to the BOF full page for reporting a concern.

In conclusion, the squad is growing in numbers again which was noted at the weekend by other regions seeing our happy and enthusiastic athletes. More juniors brings advantages, by creating and maintaining a youthful atmosphere and helping to create those long term friendships.

# East Midlands League 2025

The tables below provide the latest standings for the EMOA League 2025. With a total of 13 events, the best 7 scoring events count towards the league. # A history of Thieves Wood

Thieves Wood is to be used for a NOC event in January so I thought a little history on the area might help. The wood is officially part of the old Royal Wood of Lyndhurst. It is now managed by the Forestry Commission and is part of the Royal Forest of Sherwood. It consists of 200 Hectares of mainly Pine forest.

It is believed that when the original motte and bailey of Nottingham Castle's were built in 1068, trees from these woods provided timber for it's construction.

The obvious first person you might think of is Robin Hood, the famous thief who stole from the rich and gave to the poor. In days gone by Thieves Wood was once part of the Royal Wood of Lyndhurst owned by the King. The main route north from Nottingham, called Kings Great Way, was a road that linked London to Nottingham and then on towards Lincoln and York (it seems to have become the main road north when the old roman road (Ermine Street) fell into disrepair. However, the area north of Nottingham running through the woods and heathland was a haven for thieves and hence the reason the wood got it's name.

Close by is Fountaindale, a small moat in the region of Lyndhurst, near Blidworth. Formed by a natural source of spring water, it was established as a Holy place long before the days of Robin Hood or even Christianity. Once the site of a Pagan Shrine, the moat was formed in order to protect its relics. Those relics were moved from the shrine and buried by a loyal priest to safeguard them from invading Vikings. They've never been found. During later Christian times a similar small shrine or chapel here was said to be maintained



by Friar Tuck, perhaps attached to nearby Newstead Abbey (then known as Saint Mary's Priory.)

It was said Will Scarlet alerted Robin Hood to Friar Tuck's prowess with both bow and sword. Robin, feeling he must have such an accomplished fighter in his band of outlaws, was so wary of Tuck, he even wore armour before making his trip to Lynhurst, probably setting out from nearby Thieves Wood. The story of their meeting, carrying each other back and forth over the river, became one of the most popular stories associated with the legend.

Another notable item in Thieves wood, although not so legendary, is the 'Bird Stone'. It is inscribed: 'This stone was placed here by J. Whitaker of Rainworth Lodge [Nottinghamshire], to mark the spot where the first British specimen of an Egyptian nightjar was spotted by A. Spink's on 23 June 1883. It is only the second occurrence of the bird in Europe.'



Albert Spink's was a gamekeeper who lived opposite the Bessie Sheppard stone on the edge of Harlow Wood. He was firing at a rabbit and the sound caused the bird to fly out, so Spink's shot it. It was only by chance that he mentioned this to Whitaker - a naturalist and writer of sorts - before disposing of it. The very grateful Whitaker salvaged the bird and had it stuffed.

Joseph Whitaker was the elder son of Joseph Whitaker of Ramsdale, where the younger man was born. He was educated at Uppingham School and inherited a love of the outdoors from his father, who was one of the backers of the local boxer Bendigo. Whitaker lived most of his life at Rainworth Lodge, where his house resembled a museum, containing cases of stuffed birds and other natural history exhibits. Whitaker was a keen sportsman, botanist, fisherman and collector of curios. He published a book on medieval dovecotes in Nottinghamshire, although not all the examples were medieval and not all were even in the county. He also had his own deer park and collected deer horns.

The original Bird Stone that Whitaker put in Thieves Wood was vandalized in the 1980s, and the replacement erected to remind passers-by of the event. At the same time, it keeps alive the memory of one of Nottinghamshire's eccentric characters who furthered our knowledge of birds, dovecotes, and other topics. Mansfield Museum and Art Gallery holds the Whitaker Collection of exhibits in its archive, which include the Egyptian nightjar.


# A little history from Strawberry Hill & Ransom Wood

When I ran at Strawberry Hill in January 2020, I was struck with the elegance of the buildings in <u>Ransom Wood Business Park</u>, the location of the event parking. Sure enough, a quick search revealed that the wooden building on the footprint of the current brick building was a TB hospital built in 1902. The photo shows one of the five wards, with wooden verandahs where the patients would sleep in the fresh air. It seems there were plenty of blankets for warmth, and



the main complaint was the <u>nightjars</u> keeping them awake! The out-of-bounds area in the NW corner of the map is protected habitat for these curious birds.

One of the wards of the TB Hospital built in Ransom Wood in 1902



The wooden buildings were replaced in around 1947 with brick ones, but only the central quadrangle of the actual hospital remains.

The clock was presented to the hospital on 1 May 1947, so it's assumed that the clocktower was built at the same time. Read the plaque; they say that time heals all things.

The hospital closed in 1987, due to subsidence affecting the surrounding wards. These areas now provide ample parking for the business park.

# Strawberry Hill Plantation

The area is named after a plantation of sessile oaks, surrounded by a circular walkway some 190m in diameter. The trees are thought to have been planted in the 1850s, when the <u>Welbeck Estate</u> - home of the Lords of Portland - was 'gentrifying' itself. The southern approach is a sunken lane, and many more of these cross the area, some dating from medieval times.




Part of the orienteering map, showing Strawberry hill and the nightjar protected habitat (pink; top left)

The area was used for military training in both the World Wars:

"Strawberry Knoll was known for the two heavy machine guns mounted on its summit known particularly well by the soldiers who had to crawl up that hill under live ammunition fire as a final part of their training. A local retired post-master tells of how his father used to make deliveries to our site in around 1913 and of how he recalled that you couldn't see the trees for the troops that streamed through this site at the time and how he remembered two tanks parked up in the car park."

The Lidar image for a <u>2021 archaeological survey by Nottinghamshire</u> <u>County Council</u> shows the wartime legacy nicely.



Lidar image of Strawberry Hill with wartime features picked out in white


11	Not located. Would recommend returning when the vegetation has died back further.
12	Unusual set of deep trenches that are probably all part of the military trench training activities. Two approx. sw-ne trenches lead to a circular trench with a cross of smaller works in the centre. The circular feature sits on a promontory of land which drops away sharply on the south side. A nw-se trench appears to link this set of trenches to the ones recorded under 14. Undergrowth made it difficult to establish much more about these trenches or possible relative dating. Part of it intersects with one of the deep hollow ways recorded under 10.
13	Not located. Would recommend returning when the vegetation has died back further.
14	The ground cover in this area is very dense so it was difficult to examine the trenches in much detail. Where they were visible from the footpath they appear to be deep-cut features of at least 1m set in parallel rows with communication lines between them. They appear to feature the characteristic zig-zag shape. There is probably a lot more information could be gathered from this well-preserved set by a specialist when there is less ground cover.
15	Two parallel trenches of differing construction. The most southerly one is well-defined in shape and form, whereas the one to the north appears to be much rougher. These are in reasonably open woodland and not too difficult to access. They are part of the wider landscape of 20 <sup>th</sup> century military training activity.
16	Area of activity relating to military training. There are lots of small pits across an area to the north and north-east of the hill. They range in size from approximately 1x0.4m to 3x4m. They may represent ammo stores or dugouts.
17	Two parallel ditch features that may be related to the 20 <sup>th</sup> century military training activities. These are less well defined than other trenches on the site but run in the same orientation.
18	Not located. Would recommend returning when the vegetation has died back further.



# Entering Events on Startkite

Just a quick note for those entering events on Startkite.

It is much more cost effective for the organising club if you enter using bank transfer, rather than online card payment (at least 20p per entry). This means more money goes to the organising club.

Some orienteers have a concern about bank payments and the security of their account details. First, Lloyds Bank (who process Startkite) do not include the account number in the payment details that Startkite itself receives. Added to this, the bank payment matching is done offline. Details of the payment (account name, sort code, reference) are never stored online on The Start Kite website.

When entering the individual gets a code that is assigned for all future events. So, next time it should simply be a matter of going into your bank account and finding Startkite and the code should already be assigned. You can use one payment to cover multiple events.

# Editorial

I know that many orienteers are of the more mature end of the age spectrum, so many of you may already have faced the problems I have had in the last few months. But, I wanted to highlight this to encourage all the men to ensure they insist on a PSA test (and press their doctors if they have to).

I have for the last few years had a slightly high PSA reading, so have been able to get my doctor to get me regular 6 month tests. Back in September the number rose a little, so I was called in to see the doctor and after a brief chat it was decided to get me an MRI scan. The scan took place and seemed to identify the need for a more detailed look. (And to add to my problems after the MRI scan I went into a number of fits so ended up in emergency and though everything seemed fine I was told I could not drive until I see a neurosurgeon (wait is currently on average 17 weeks) - so can't get to events on my own).

The follow up treatment was a biopsy. This sounded horrible but in fact was not bad at all. The bad news came when saw the consultant afterwards and he told me I did have prostate cancer, and it seemed to be quite aggressive. The next thing is, has it spread? So, I was sent for a number of scans including a nuclear x-ray (I had never heard of one before, and didn't even know there was such a facility on the top floor of Derby Royal hospital). The time was not fun waiting for the results.

The session with the consultant afterwards started with him giving me the test results. It had not spread anywhere else and the only problem with my bones seemed to be some arthritis in the knee and ankles (not a surprise for an orienteer). We had to decide on a course of action. One option was a 6 month course of hormone therapy followed by radiotherapy for a number of weeks. The alternative was to have the prostate out. Given the aggressiveness of the cancer I felt the only option was to have the prostate out. So, I am sitting here having had the operation, and hoping I will recover and get back to orienteering soon (I still need to have a catheter removed next week and then will have to wait for results of further scans and tests to see if it has been successful, but my consultant seemed positive).

The main reason I have written this editorial was if I had not been having regular PSA tests then we would not have spotted the increase in value, and my doctor would not have sent me for the MRI scan. Yet it seems the government (or is it health professionals?) does not seem to think it is worth giving men regular PSA tests! Without them there is a good chance I would not be around in a year's time).

PS: Next EMEWS is the 300<sup>th</sup> edition. I do have every issue (many of the old ones paper photocopies). If anyone has any stories they want to relate about EMEWS history or any particular articles they want to see again let me know.
