Development Day – A good attendance for all courses except controllers:</li> <li>Event Safety – 20</li> <li>Organisers – 11</li> <li>Planners – 8</li> <li>Controllers – 0</li> <li>Mapping – 5</li> <li>Conditioning for Coaches - 9</li> <li>There is a concern that we have no attendees on controller's course. SYO are running a course in November and 2 people from EMOA are attending. Chris Phillips volunteered to organise a controllers course if required. 	EMOA was well represented at the conference. One area looked at was Sport for All. The problem is it is difficult to satisfy everyone.  What is competitive orienteering – A presentation on what 21-35 year olds want to see which included 7 to 8 top events per annum, ideally including a bar.  There is a drop out of teenagers as many do not want to be seen with their parents. After 35 some folk do return to the sport.  There was no final definition of what a competition is.  It was good to meet folk from other clubs.  There was no specific action for clubs or regions.	
12	EMEWS: The next EMEWS will be out after Christmas.	
13	Any Other Business: A suggestion made at the AGM was to make it mandatory for EMOA Urban League events to have out-of-club controllers. BO Rule 17.6 states that a controller for a level C event is preferably from a different club, but this is not a mandatory requirement. The committee discussed a wide range of factors and constraints relating to the appointment of controllers for EMOA League and Urban League events, and it was agreed that there would be no clear overall benefit in imposing an extra requirement for out-of-club controllers on these League events."
