5.	Treasurer's Report The Treasurer provided the Accounts in advance of the meeting. He had paid a deposit for the JIRCS accommodation for JIRCS 2018. Also, although it was agreed at the AGM that event levies would not be collected, he will keep account of how much would have been collected (and LOG have had their monies refunded for an event). Budget had been set aside for coaching in this year's budget. In addition quite a lot of coaching money was set aside last year and not used, therefore it was agreed that this was a good use of the coaching budget.					
	A request for funding had been received to attend the L2 Coaching Course on behalf of John Mather and Ant Squires (to enable them to coach the EMOA Junior Squad. (It was felt appropriate that the Community					

	Coaching Development budget could be put towards this. It was agreed that EMOA would fund the two Junior Squad Coaches training).	
6.	Development  No one had taken on the Development role at the AGM (if anyone has any ideas for folk who could do so, please ask them to put their name forward).  There is a need for a Controller's Course and also it is thought for a Planners course (for Regional Training Day). Chris Phillips will talk to Ranald about running the Controller's course.  British Orienteering ran a Level A Controller's course recently and EMOA had one candidate on it, Roger Edwards. To become a Level A Controller Roger needs a formal recommendation from the association. It was agreed that the committee should formally nominate Roger to be a Level A Controller. 7.	Coaching Hilary will be running the L2 Coaching Course and will invoice the clubs for their member's attendance (and EMOA for the EMOA attendees). There will be a charge from British Orienteering of £275 per person for the training. Hilary will all provide an invoice for all additional costs.	
8.	Junior Squad  Ann-Marie reported that Anthony Squires and herself had taken over from Dai Bedwell at the start of the autumn 2017 series. They wanted it recognised by EMOA how much effort Dai had put into organising, training and transporting our juniors to special training days and competitions over many years. The committee seconded those thoughts. He will continue to be involved as one of Level 2 coaches. Anthony Squire's (NOC) role will be to focus on the athlete development and the training schedule through the year. Ann-Marie's role is more administration – interfacing with the juniors, parents, Club/EM officials, JROS and competition organisers etc, as well as Level 1 coaching. They will be working with other coaches in the region to expand the network of people working with our junior talent and to delegate the work load for training sessions.	
	Training Schedule:	
	Looking backwards over the last few months the junior events have been:	
	<u>12<sup>th</sup> Nov 2017 at Bradgate</u> – an afternoon session concentrating on contour interpretation for 14 juniors. With athletes abilities ranging from good orange/light green up to TD5 champions, the multiple short loops with coaches shadowing or leading the exercises worked well. Anthony developed the exercises, which were mentored by Dai Bedwell and Julie Ferris, both of whom were present on the day.	
	3 new "rising" standard orienteers joined us for the session. The feedback was they enjoyed the session and	

would come again.

<u>15th Oct 2017 Burrough Hill</u> – after running a colour coded course (LEI event) the 12 athletes were asked to think about and understand what skills are in their Orienteering Toolbox and assess strengths/development areas for these skills. This session saw the **Training Folder** introduced by Anthony.

Each athlete has a folder and at each training session they will have session planners/feedback forms, on which they record their thoughts, progress or ideas.

The open area of the ancient fort allowed for practice with setting bearings, interpretation of contours, fine corridor navigation and distance judgement.

There was one new athlete join the squad.

We will be travelling by minibus, staying overnight in a scout hut in Woking Park with SCJS. Evening events will include swimming, supper, a technical session and a small run in the Park. The squads will provide breakfast, before competing in the Ash Ranges National event.

#### **EMOA Financial Assistance:**

It is recognised and appreciated by the coaches and parents that the EMOA continues to fund the junior squad team entries (JIRCS and Hawkshead).

Looking at the expenditure for the last 12 months (2016-2017), the EMOA financial contribution has been about £730, less than the £1000 budget. We would like the surplus to be considered for assistance for coach training and qualification.

In the next year (2017-2018) with the rising cost of entries but no travel costs for JIRCS2018, that a **budget of** £1000 will cover JROS.

A question was asked as to who was in the Junior Squad so as to ensure that the East Midlands League was correctly set up. Ann-Marie would provide a list of members.

It is also the intention to provide juniors with their own goals, so they can focus on what needs to be done themselves.

It is intended to ensure that the Junior Squad website is updated.

Ann-Marie to provide list of junior squad members to Ursula so that East Midlands League can be correctly set up.

The committee thanked Ann-Marie and Anthony for volunteering to take on these roles. John Hurley to work with DVO to get an updated JIRCS 2018 – It had been suggested that the budget should be revised once the number of attendees for JIRCS budget be available for the 2017 was known. John Hurley had written to DVO to request a revised budget. The numbers only came out a January EMOA committee couple of weeks ago and the latest budget does not yet take account of these revised figures. It is hoped the meeting. entry fees can remain very similar to those for JIRCS 2017. DVO are still looking for a controller for the relays. One of the key budget factors is the cost of using Chatsworth. A figure has been quoted but Chatsworth will not firm this up until March. It was suggested that a full budget should be available based on what is known for the January committee meeting.
