### **Orienteering Foundation Report (Pauline Olivant)**

Latest news.

- Coaching day again planned in the Lakes in the autumn. More information due shortly.

## 12 | Sharing Best Practice

1. Hilary Palmer brought up the question of shadowing of juniors at events. NOC had circulated a survey of members and one of the comments that came back involved shadowing. See below:

#### Family friendly orienteering

Some families with young children in NOC have commented in a survey of club members that they are not allowed to shadow a child on a White or Yellow course unless they have done their own run first.

John and I used to do this with our children at colour coded events and I was horrified that parents are now being told that they cannot do this (no clubs were mentioned in the survey answers) – I cannot see how running round behind a child on a W or Y course could significantly improve the parent's chances when they do their own course and, in any case, does it really matter? I can understand that this should not be allowed for a national or major event such as the CSC or a regional or national championship but not for a Colour coded event even if it is a regional league event.

My reasoning for thinking this was is that clubs should be encouraging families by allowing 1 parent to shadow whilst the other parent has their run and then the shadowing parent can have their run. If we do not allow this the children and 1 parent have to hang around or wait in the car and then the returning parent can shadow 1 child or they all have to go round together. Enforcing the 'no shadowing before you 'run' rule could alienate keen parents and mean that they leave the sport.

I looked up in the BOF Rules to see what is said there and found 2 places quite early on about shadowing:

9 Conduct

9.14 The Organiser may permit the shadowing of one competitor by another person. Certain competition rules may prohibit shadowing on certain courses. The competition rules explain how the shadowed competitor's result is to be recorded.

9.15 If you are the 'shadower' then you must have completed your own race before undertaking any shadowing. There may be other restrictions imposed on the 'shadower' by the Organiser.

12.9 The Organiser may permit the shadowing of a competitor by another person, subject to any specific requirements in the competition Rules. The Organiser is permitted to impose any other appropriate restrictions on the 'shadower'.

And also: 12 Event officials

12.1 The spirit of fairness and good fellowship is to be the guiding principle in all aspects of the sport, including the interpretation of these Rules.

I think that in the 'spirit of fairness and good fellowship' organisers should allow shadowing of young children by parents at local and regional events. I guess some people might not like this if the event is a regional league

	competition but I refer back to the point made above and highlighted. There is no mention of the status of someone who has shadowed before having their run in the current East Midlands League Rules (on the EMOA web site).  The committee agreed with Hilary. The problem is that if you do not apply a rule, you are deemed in breach of that rule. It was agreed that EMOA would ask for a rule waiver to allow shadowing on White and Orange at Level C events in EMOA. Hilary to submit proposal to Chris Phillips with his E&CC hat on. Chris Phillips said he would do any necessary paperwork if Hilary applied for the waiver. It was also mentioned that Judith Holt was sympathetic to the proposal and would raise at Board level.  2. NOC's urban event at Clifton campus had complex looping and before the event the competitors were presented with an outline course so they understood the complexity of the loops. The officials had thought that there may be a lot of disqualifications as there were many controls and multiple loops. However, there were very few, and they believe it was because people were well briefed in advance.
