5.	<b>Financial Secretary's Report</b> The Financial Secretary reported that the funds looked pretty good. The renewals numbers are within £30 of the figure for the previous year at this time. Clubs are encouraged to follow up lapsed members to encourage them to	Club reps to encourage clubs to chase up lapsed members			

rejoin. Event levies are slightly up on where we were last year, so at this stage the Financial Secretary expects to be close to the budget.

In terms of sponsorship Ultrasport UK has now closed down so there is no more sponsorship for the advert in EMEWS. Mike Gardner to remove the advert from future EMEWS.

The Junior Squad have had a refund of £5 per JIRCS attendee due to the standard of catering / accommodation not being up to standard at JIRCS. So far there has been no expenditure on volunteer development, coaching or external conferences.

Jake O'Donnell had requested support as he had been selected for the England M14 team in Interland 2020 near London. He confirmed that this was the only source of funding approached. It was agreed to provide the usual 1/3 funding of the cost. Paul Young to provide funding to Jake and request an article for EMEWS.

It was believed that Hannah Mather had also been selected for Interland, so Trudy Crosby to approach her as LOG rep and ask if she required similar funding. This would be approved if this was the case.

The Strawberry Hill event was run by the East Midlands Junior Squad. As the event funds are to go towards the Junior Squad it was agreed that the EMOA levy for this event would be waived.

The EMOA Junior Squad trip to Sweden this Summer is going to cost participants around £255 plus their own flights (around £180). The income from Strawberry Hill will go towards funding the trip.

It was suggested that Ann-Marie should bring a breakdown of costs and budget for the trip to the next EMOA meeting (at this stage there are 6 EMOA juniors and 3 adults attending).

## 7. **Development**

Ranald had received a number of requests to attend the Planners and Controllers Courses, although the majority were for a Planners course (1 for the controller's course, 9 for the planner's course). Ranald had considered a traditional day approach, or an alternative might be to use an evening for the sessions and have a practical at an event on a Sunday. At present Viv Macdonald is helping with the admin, so will look to identify a suitable venue and an approach and arrange for the courses in the spring.

Ranald is organising a DVO Event Officials evening on Tuesday 24th March. Other event officials are welcome to attend.

Ranald will look to organise an EMOA Development Conference in the autumn (and also possibly a Development Day). The Development conference might cover the recent rule changes (which should be out shortly). There has been significant changes to remove duplications. There are also a number of changes around Level B events. The

development conference might also cover rules that are not always being followed (e.g. finish control should have a kite; must not remove the start kite until the event has finished). Ranald did write a series of articles for DVO Newstrack on how we ensure that people do abide by the rules. He will share these with other clubs (possibly via EMEWS).

The British Orienteering Development Conference recently took place and was attended by 3 LEI, 3 DVO and 1 LOG member. The reports were that it was an excellent conference. Details of the event are available on the BO website.

# 8. Coaching

Hilary has no plans for any coach training this year. The last course was begun in 2017 and all those people have now qualified as coaches. Is there a requirement for any more coach training at present?

Hilary is planning on running a ½ day coaching safety workshop (for coaches using remote terrain).

Hilary ran a club coaching day in Sherwood Forest (attended by 2 LOG, 1 LEI, 2 DVO and 12 NOC). The day went well. It was suggested that clubs may want to make sure that if they run any sort of coaching workshop at a club level that they open up the session to other clubs in the region. We should encourage people to train to improve and not just compete.

Ranald Macdonald commented that from a safety workshop perspective we need to ensure that planners, controllers and mappers have defined processes in place (especially when they go out on their own to a remote area) so that when they go on to an area before an event they inform people of their whereabouts.

Judith Holt commented that we also need to ensure that safeguarding of competitors is the responsibility of all officials (it is not part of the risk assessment form currently). There ought to be a prompt on all risk assessments to get officials to think about the safeguarding of all participants (health, welfare & safeguarding).

It was also mentioned that the production of risk assessment documents can sometime be quite poor. Hazards and their severity need to be properly considered. This may be a good topic for the Development Conference.
