5.	<p>Financial Secretary's Report</p> <p><u>Income</u></p> <p>Busy event-wise with event levies received for Lincoln Euro City Race (LOG), Nottingham City Race (NOC), Lutterworth (LEI), Hamilton (LEI), Chinley Churn (DVO), Newark (LOG), Retford (NOC) and Burbage (LEI) - £605 in total. Also £37 in membership fees, £66 in bank interest and EMJOS received £314 from cake sales at Chinley Churn. Unfortunately the card reader used for the cake sales stopped working meaning some of the funds weren't actually received. So many thanks to DVO for making a donation of £51 towards that lost income.</p> <p>Finally nearly £1,000 in receipts for EMJOS activities - exact make-up of them to be determined with Ann-Marie's help - but looks to be £300 for JIRCS, £630 for South Wales and £60 for local training activities.</p> <p><u>Expenditure</u></p> <p>The catering for the development conference was refunded to Trudy = £164 and talent support paid to the Simpsons for their trip to EYOC (competing for Ireland) and for Eoin for the JROS tour to Findhorn.</p> <p>Bank charges totalling £10 were paid and these have now ceased for future months.</p> <p>EMJOS costs totalled nearly a £1,000 too - being £355 for JIRCS, £600 for South Wales and £39 for other local activities.</p> <p>Current bank balance = £13,315.</p>

DVO have been awarded a Sport England grant of £5,050 which will fund most of the costs of 36 MapRun events over the next two years, which are to be co-ordinated by the Club Development Officer with the aim of attracting new participants from running and other sporting clubs • DVO/24/4 MapActive courses and level D events 2024/25. DVO have been awarded a grant from the Orienteering Foundation of £3000, delivered in 2 tranches, the second conditional on demonstrating delivery of phase 1. (Joined by 7 from DVO). • LEI no information supplied • LOG/25/1 LOG are holding an autumn MapRun series and continue to provide coaching at weekly club nights <p>Officials Conference 2025</p> <p>Date : Saturday September 20th at Rushcliffe Country Park, near Nottingham. Thanks to all those who helped with the arrangements for this Conference, including presenters Ranald Macdonald, David Olivant and Hilary palmer, and to Trudy Crosby for handling the catering arrangements.</p> <p>There were 17 other delegates (DVO 6, LEI 5, LOG 1, NOC 5).</p> <p>Ann-Marie has written a short report on the Conference which can be found at https://derwentvalleyorienteers.org.uk/2025/10/01/emoa-officials-development-conference-2025/</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rules Quiz – It was agreed that John Hurley would arrange for the answers to Ranald’s rules quiz be posted on the EMOA website. • Environmental Impact Assessment Form – John had taken a form created by BOF and had feedback from Dave Cooke, which has been incorporated. It was agreed by the EMOA Committee meeting that the form could be used as a regional store of knowledge on environmental impacts at events. It is not mandatory, but clubs are encouraged to complete the form and share with John Hurley. There were some discussions on combining it with the risk assessment form, but this was felt to not be necessary (and really covering two different topics). As part of the discussion it was identified that NOC and LEI have one person responsible for access to areas, while DVO has a number of different people. • There were a number of suggestions for Development raised by Matt White at conference, but the conference did not have time to discuss them. The EMOA Committee had a short discussion on each: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Some form of regional junior league as there is no pathway from schools championships to regular orienteering – the EMOA committee would like to support the idea, but whenever this has been trialled we have found that schools are not willing to travel far, so getting them to travel across the region would probably not work. 	<p>Ann-Marie led the sessions catering for the TD3 to TD5 athletes from both EMJOS and West Midlands squads. The theme for the day was to plan for attack points and beacons on the route. With the more experienced using simplification ideas to allow for faster running.</p> <p>We shared accommodation in a Boys and Girls Club Wales activity centre near Bridgend - this worked well sharing cooking and evening entertainment and games, and also giving lifts to the night event. All of the EMJOS athletes went to the night event at Briton Ferry (very steep forest, near Swansea). For some juniors this was their first event in the dark so the 1 hour score format having 9 controls at yellow standard for the novices, was very welcomed. The athletes were paired up to run in the dark or in pairs on relocation exercises in the sand dunes</p> <p>The Sunday event was back on Kenfig Burrows, previously used for JIRCS 2023 – had more sand dunes and some very good race results. Sand dunes are no longer a mystery to this group of juniors.</p> <p>Using the minibus transport worked well and gave the opportunity for the juniors to get to know each other. Pairing up juniors with WMJS juniors worked to forge new friends from other clubs who will be a friendly face at future events and training</p> <p><u>Future Training</u></p> <p>There is a possibility for shared training on the 13th of December to join WMJS when they do their Christmas session at Hartshill Hayes.</p> <p>Then on the 31st of January 2026 EMJOS are hosting training on Crich Chase (DVO) for Yorkshire and Humberside and West Midlands squads - so there will be 60 juniors going mad on the slopes of the Derwent valley.</p> <p><u>Other things to note:</u></p> <p>Safeguarding in our sport has been refreshed with the appointment of Jeanette Downing as lead safeguarding officer at the BOF office. The review of safeguarding in our sport does mean a careful review of the level of training for the coaches and helping parents associated with EMJOS.</p> <p>Some of the longer standing coaches will have to take the live 3 hour course, while the most recently accredited coaches (within the last three years) will need to take a one hour refresher e-learning course after 3 years coaching. Parents who help will be expected to do the one hour e-learning course.</p> <p>The EMJOS page on EMOA website has been refreshed to include a contact e-mail for the squad safeguarding officer (Anne Kayley-Burgess) and a link to the BOF full page for reporting a concern.</p> <p>In conclusion, the squad is growing in numbers again which was noted at the weekend by other regions seeing our happy and enthusiastic athletes. 11.	EMOA Champs Competition Rules	

	<p>Iain Phillips presented the proposed rules for the EMOA Champs going forward in terms of course / class combinations. In effect the proposed table shows we would run shorter courses than BOF level events. There is also the introduction of the Novice class. The Novice class is aimed at “new” orienteers to allow them to take part without pressure of a full championship course. No trophies would be awarded for novice classes, but prizes could be awarded. The exact rules for eligibility for a novice course prize may need to be refined. All members affiliated to EMOA would be eligible.</p> <p>It was agreed that, if appropriate, middle distance races could be used for EMOA Champs (not just long). 12.	<p>Reports</p> <p>John Hurley provided feedback on the Major Events Conference in October</p> <p><u>2026 Rule Changes</u></p> <div><div>1</div><div>There will be changes to the class/course tables for JK, British Long and Area Championships.</div></div> <div><div>2</div><div>There will be changes to relay class start times, and the Ad Hoc relay will run medium/short/long for all teams.</div></div> <div><div>3</div><div>There is a change in principle over relay alliances between neighbouring clubs for JK and British relays. For Men Open and Women Open there is an objective to attract more elite teams. In these classes alliance teams will be permitted even if the clubs concerned could field club-only teams. In Junior classes alliance teams will be permitted only where this allows for participation by juniors in clubs which could not field a club-</div></div>																																																					

	<p>only team : “all-star” alliance teams will not otherwise be permitted. It is not clear how these principles will be enforced. Ursula expressed concern about the proposed alliance teams in the open classes. John Hurley replied that it was unlikely that we could influence the Rules for 2026, but we should monitor how this works in practice at the 2026 JK and British relays and then provide feedback to Rules Group, if appropriate.</p> <p>4 Shadowing of juniors on championship courses at level A events will not be allowed.</p> <p>5 Assistance dogs are permitted by default if pre-notified to the Organiser and the landowner does not object.</p> <p>6 Significant changes to Selection and Seeding procedures (Appendix A) and Safety (Appendix E).</p> <p>7 In general, it is claimed that the 2026 Rules remove ambiguity and duplication, and recognise that electronic punching is now standard for level C and above. We shall see !</p> <p><u>2027 Rule Changes</u></p> <p>1 It is intended that the issues of map scales and physical difficulty for older age groups will be reviewed.</p> <p>2 The duties and role of the Controller will be reviewed (this was alluded to by Ranald at the EMOA Conference).</p> <p><u>Other Business</u></p> <p>1 Dan Parker is the new Chair of Map Advisory Group.</p> <p>2 Josh Wright is the new British Orienteering Events Development Officer.</p> <p>3 The Event Officials Group needs a new Chair and other new members.</p> <p>4 Alan Rosen is “Controller of Controllers”.</p> <p>5 Rules Group are considering cutting down the Rules document by splitting off some of the information sections into a separate Best Practice document. They would welcome comments on the value of this.</p> <p>6 Rules Group will consider requests for waivers.
